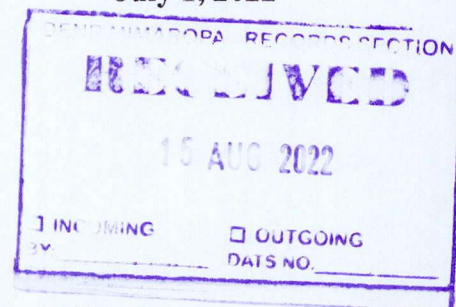





## **Report on the Celebration of DENR 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**

**June 17, 2022 Freedom Eco – Adventure Park**

### **Introduction**

As part of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) 35th founding anniversary, PENRO Marinduque headed by OIC, PENR Officer Imelda M. Diaz, organized the traditional Filipino games with a theme “Pistang Pamilya ng DENR para sa Tuloy-tuloy na Pagkakaisa at Tagumpay” that aims to contribute over-all well-being of employees to work better and become a stronger organization in the years ahead. It was conducted on June 17, 2022, at Freedom Eco- Adventure Park, Bunganay, Boac, Marinduque.

“This event aimed to build the participants' camaraderie, sportsmanship, and strong teamwork. The program started at exactly 8:30 in the morning with a prayer followed by a national anthem. OIC, PENR Officer Imelda M. Diaz expressed her gratefulness to all employees who were part of the successful event, especially on this anniversary. With this year's theme “Pistang Pamilya ng DENR para sa Tuloy-tuloy na Pagkakaisa at Tagumpay” she hopes that all personnel will have fun, bonding, and enjoyment as to commensurate the hard work and dedications of everyone.

Moreover, In-Charge, Management Services Division Gemma P. Delos Reyes, discussed the house rules to further the participants to be reminded and guided on the whole-day activity. The DENR-PENRO employees who took part in the activities were grouped into five (5) teams, the Yellow, Red, Blue, Violet, and White teams which were composed of 21-23 members in each group.

” Coming together is a beginning, keeping together is progress, working together is success”- J. Maxwell. Teamwork is important in nurturing the working environment. This calls for means and ways of growing and enhancing teamwork in every organization and an insignificant way are having team members engage in a teambuilding program. The team-building activities challenge team members to solve tasks at hand and in the process learn vital skills necessary for a good team and provide opportunities to share ideas in a fun relaxed environment. The training was conducted in the liveliest group fun activities.

### **Objectives**

Family Day Celebration aims to highlights the importance of every employees of the company for the betterment of each employees. Objectives of the activity are the following:

- Reinforce team spirit
- Foster camaraderie among offices through friendly competition
- Boost mental health
- Bring back fond memories of childhood



## Childhood Games

To introduce all the participants, each team prepared a cheering dance and chants that will recognize them as a group. All teams participated in the said activity. The winner of the cheer dance competition is the Red Team.

There were different Filipino traditional games that was showcased such as “sackrace”, “tumbang preso”, “bato-bato pick”, “bunong braso”, “sipa”, “pass the message”, “tug of war”, “hampas palayok” “Bao Race”, “Maria Went to the Market” and “Patamaan ng bata”

**“Sack race”** is a competitive game in which participants place both of their legs inside a sack. The first team that will finish the person to cross the finish line is the winner of the race. Each team participates in this activity the yellow team, red team, blue team, violet team, and white team. The winner of this activity is the Red team.

**“Tumbang preso”** is a traditional Filipino children's game. The game involves one of the players in a team throwing a slipper at a can or bottle. The participants of this activity are the five (5) teams, and no one of the five (5) teams got a chance to hit a bottle.

**“Bato-Bato pick”** more commonly known as Rock Paper Scissors, is a game where two players simultaneously make a gesture representing one of the following: a rock, paper, or scissors. The rules are as follows: paper beats rock, rock beats scissors and scissors beats paper. Each of the players in the team has money of Php 20, and who are the 1st gets the money of Php 250 is the winner. The winner of this game who has the money of Php 250 is the Red team.

**“Sipa”** is the Philippines' traditional native sport which predates Spanish rule. The game is related to Sepak Takraw. The Sipa is thrown upwards for the player to toss using only the leg or the elbow, particularly the area from the foot until above the knee; the player must prevent the Sipa from touching the ground by hitting it several times. Each hit is counted; the player kicking the Sipa most wins the game. The winner of this game is the Red team.

**“Tug of war”** is a contest in which two teams pull at opposite ends of a rope until one drags the other over a central line and a situation in which two evenly matched people or factions are striving to keep or obtain the same thing. The objective of the game is for each team to pull the rope along with the members of the opposition team to their side. As soon as the second mark on the rope from the center red mark crosses over to the center line, the team to pulls the rope to their area wins the game. And the who pull the rope to their area is the Violet Team.

**“Basagan ng Palaok”** is derived from the Spanish game Piñata? The Spaniards conquered the Philippines thru religion, Catholicism. They used festivals to attract the native Filipinos to



convert to their religion. And this game is played during those celebrations. The rules of the game are so simple. You just have to hit the clay pot. Easy right? But wait. Players should be blindfolded. They will fall in line around 3 meters away in front of the hanging clay pot, enough for the player to reach it, and will walk straight towards the pot. A long bamboo or lumber is used to hit it. Participants are made to spin around to distort/ her concentration. The crowd will distract the player by yelling all kinds of directions, "Go straight, to the left, to the right, stop! Hit it! Hit it!". One by one, they have an opportunity to hit the pot once. Yes. You read it right. Just one hit. If you missed it, you have to go back in line and wait for your turn to hit again. The game continues if the player misses hitting the pot. If someone smashes the pot, the crowd goes for the goodies that fall on the ground from the pot like candies, chocolates, coins, and even peso bills. The player who breaks the pot will win the game and will be given a prize, usually a peso bill. And the winner of this game is Ms. Corazon Pelaez from the white team, Ms. Ericka Macunat from the yellow team, Ms. Menchie Radovan from the violet team, Mr. Wilson Paez from red team, and Mr. Jomar Cardova from the red team.

***"Chinese Garter"*** a game requiring flexibility, balance, and coordination, is a popular game for Filipino children, most specifically among girls during their elementary years. The game revolves around an ordinary garter, around two to three yards long, which be brought from a sewing store at around twenty pesos or less. This game needs you to be physically fit for this will test your stamina, agility, and your jumping skills. It needs a flexible body to keep with for the game. Before the game starts you will need rubber bands, garter, or rope whichever you prefer.

To play the game, the teams are required with 2 or more players each, although you can still play this with only three players 2 holding the rope and one jumping on it. The holders will stand facing each other at both ends with the garter stretched horizontally around 2 to 3 yards or 7 feet long looped around their ankles. The player should be able to jump or cross over the garter without tripping. Failure to do so will get you or your team eliminated and make you the one holding the garter as the other player takes in turning. The players may decide the levels for their game. Generally, the garter starts from the ankle level, next is the middle of the leg, knee, hips, waist, chest, shoulder, head, tip of the head, headaches above the head, and the last level where the garter is held up with raised arms. Every challenger must be careful not to commit any mistakes during their jump or else her turn is over. And the winner of the game is the Red Team.

***"Patamaang bata" Dodgeball*** originated in Africa. It was played there over two hundred years ago. The original version of it is deadlier and more painful because instead of rubber balls, they used rocks or putrefied matter. That version is played by African tribes to train them. To play Batuhang Bola or dodgeball, you must first gather 2 teams and get a ball. The 1st team should



stand in the middle of the court, while the 2nd team should be divided into two and should stand on both sides of the 1st team. The 2nd team should hit the players of the 1st team. If you hit a player, that player is out. If that player catches the ball, his team will gain a “life” and can be used to revive another player or be used to continue to play if the ball hits him/her. You will win the game if you have hit all the players and none of the players are left. For this game, the winner is the Red Team.

**“Bao Race”** is one of the games played in the Philippine Sports Commission’s (PSC) Indigenous People’s Games and Children’s Games programs which are held in different provinces across the country.

This indigenous Filipino outdoor game is also known as tiyakad played by children and adults alike using coconut husks.

The term kadang-kadang translates to “simple game” and the game goes by its name as a basic racing recreational activity. The coconut husk is used by the player to carry himself and outrun the other members of the opposing team. This game has a five-team with 20 to 24 members. When the game start, the first player of each team walks toward the goal line when the first player return to the starting line then another member of the team will do the same. The team will be disqualified if, a player walks for more than two steps after a fall. The first team who finishes the race will win the game, and the winner of this game is the Red Team and the White team.

**“Pass the message”** Send a message seems so easy unless you have to pass the message through 10 or more people! The Telephone Game is a simple game of listening and repeating what you hear, but somehow, as in life, along the way the message changes and often becomes something different from what you started with is a multiple-player game of drawing and guessing. The goal is to create an alternating list of pictures and text descriptions that change the original message to something completely different. Originally it is played at parties using pen and paper. Players doodle draw pictures or write messages, fold the paper so that only the last picture/message is visible and pass it to the next player. At the end of the game, the paper is unfolded to reveal a chain of pictures/messages and it is fun to see how the original message has evolved. There are no right and wrong answers in this game, there are only hilarious and boring answers. And the winner is Yellow Team.

**“Maria went to market”** is a popular Filipino party game that can be played by children and adults alike, though it is most amusing when the players are adult males. The game goes something like this players from both groups compete with each other one at a time. The player puts on each prop (bonnet on the head, apron around the waist, lipstick on the lips, bag around the arm, open the umbrella), then runs around a designated marker a few feet away. All props



must be removed before tagging the next player. The group which completes all 10 rounds first wins. And the winner of this game is the yellow team.

After the "Maria went to the market", the most awaited was the climax of the event. All the employees of DENR got a chance to bond and eat together for lunch. Sharing of food, and chatting about good inspiring stories were the subject of the activity. Everyone was full and satisfied with what was happened event.


After eating their lunch the next activity is "Bunong braso"

**"Bunong braso"** is a sport played by two individuals where their arm strength is tested. A test of the strength of one person's arm against another consists of two people who stand at or sit down at a table and then grip each other's hand whilst placing their elbows on the table. Their goal is then to pin their opponent's arm onto the surface (or touchpad) of the table. As well as being a test of strength, it takes a great deal of skill to be a competitive arm wrestler as well as a psychological strength. Each team had its own player and the winner of this game are the Violet Team.


#### **Awarding of Prizes to winners**

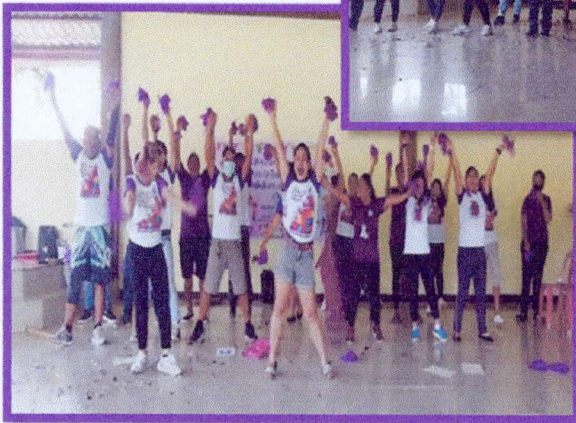


Figure2. Group opportunity of PENRO personnel

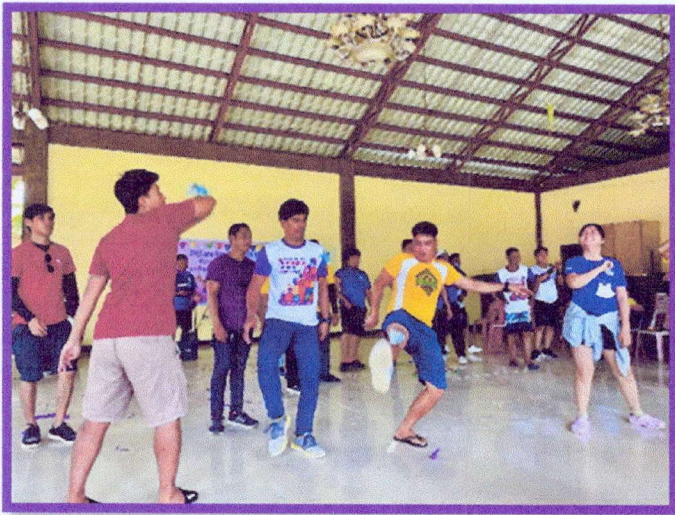


*Figure5. "Sack Race" activity*

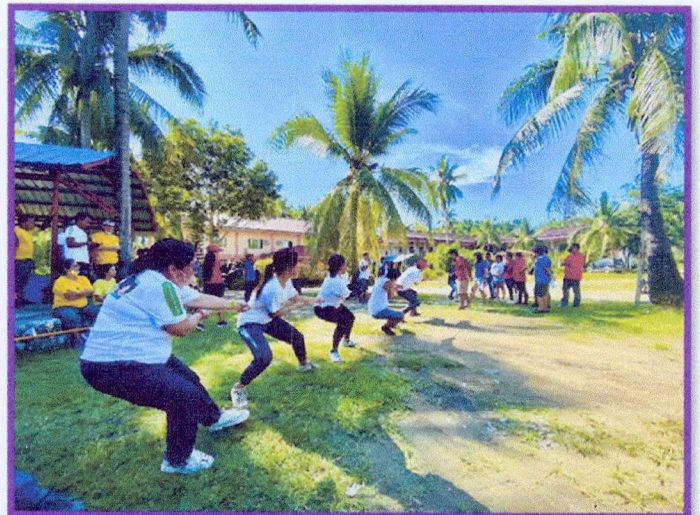


*Figure6. "Tumbang Preso"*
