

4. New Business

a) Ship grounding incident of M/V Star San Carlos of Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc.

PAMB Chair asked PASu Villanada to give an overview and status of the ship grounding incident happened in Apo Reef Natural Park on May, 10, 2022 involving the M/V Star San Carlos.

PASu Villanada presented the background, assessment and preliminaries of the ship grounding incident. She stated that as per report of the Park Rangers, they sighted a vessel around 6:00AM of May 10, 2020. At 8:00 AM, they decided to approach the vessel, still on the same spot, to check if there's a problem. They confirmed the grounding of the shipping vessel upon reaching the location, between Cayos del Bajo and Barkong Lubog; along the edge of coral reef. According to the boat captain of vessel they ran aground at ARNP at 12:30 am, the boat has 665 sacks of feeds, 5700 sack of rice and 423 pieces of steel bar based on their manifesto. Those cargo was a relief goods as per the Captain that will be delivered to Coron, Palawan. The damage assessment where immediately done by the PAMO Staff headed by Hugo Ignacio Salvador, Biologist and currently employed as Coastal Extension Officer using Fishbone Method.

The total damage area is 463.761 sq. m, majority of the damage corals were slow-growing, massive corals. The recommended computation of compensation based on PAMB Ordinance No. AR07-001-1, s. 2011 revising the rules of implementation of PAMB Resolution No. 005, s. 2007:

Area: 463.761 sqm x P12,000/sqm P5,565,132.00 + P50,000.00 to P100,000.00 fine for illegal entry

PAMB Chair asked the proponent on the volume of oil on board and if there was an incident of oil spill. She further asked how long the retrieval of the vessel does.

Mr. Silverio Atienza of Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. said that there was no incident of oil spill in the area.

PASu Villanada said that the vessel run aground at around 6:00 in the morning. And at around 11:00 AM when high tide approaches, the Captain of M/V Star San Carlos asked the Park Ranger on duty to allow them to leave the area because low tide might catch them up again and coral damage might be worsened. She added that there was an agreement between the Captain and the Park Ranger. They signed in the logbook and left us the copy of all the documents of their vessel including the seafarer book. They were also agreed that their office will coordinate closely regarding this incident.

PASu Villanada informed the PAMB Chair that series of dialog and meetings with the shipping company had been conducted. She said that the PAMB passed the PAMB Resolution No. 008, Series of 2020 "RESOLUTION REQUIRING THE ATIENZA INTERISLAND FERRIES, INC. TO COMPENSATE THE DAMAGE TO CORAL REEF, MEASURING 463.762 SQUARE METERS, AMOUNTING TO FIVE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR PESOS (PHP5,565,144.00) CAUSED BY THE GROUNDING OF M/V STAR SAN CARLOS AT APO REEF NATURAL PARK, SABLAYAN, OCCIDENTAL MINDORO ON MAY 10, 2020" during the meeting. But the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. plead to reconsider the said amount of fine and asked to accept their offer of an amount of Php 200,000.00.

PAMB Chair asked the proponent pertaining to their basis for the request of from the 50% of the computed compensation to Php 200,000.00.

Atty. Yolando Atienza explained that their shipping company's regular route is from Manila to Coron and Manila to El Nido. Sablayan Port is not part of their route but the Municipal Mayor of Busuangga Palawan asked Mr. Silverio Atienza to transport the 5,000 bags of rice from Sablayan to Coron. Those rice was a relief goods for the residents of Busuangga during the lockdown period due to the pandemic. Special permit was also secured from MARINA. The untoward incident happened during their second trip. Their vessel left from Sablayan Port at around 10:30 in the evening, during their travel to Coron, Palawan, they encountered and tried to elude the foreign vessel but unfortunately as per the command of the captain, hydraulic stee ring mechanism did not respond and malfunctioned. Atty. Atienza said that half of their vessel landed on the coral reefs and it was stable since it was low tide that time. He added that their vessel just had a minor scratch therefore it is impossible that the damage reached the area of 463.761 sqm.

PAMB Chair asked the proponent if they hired an expert to assess the damaged in the area, if not how will they knew the extent of the damage.

Atty. Atienza said that one of their crew conducted an initial assessment on their vessel if there was a major damage happened. Upon assessment, as he mentioned earlier that only minor scratches happened on their vessel because it was only drifting or floating. He added that if the vessel really dragged the coral reefs, their propeller and cooler will also damage.

PAMB Diamante said that according to her understanding, the damage assessment was for the vessel not on the coral reefs therefore she further explained that the method for the assessment on coral reefs is differ from the assessment on the vessel.

PAMB Chair then asked again the proponent if their hired an expert marine biologist to conduct assessment on the coral reefs damage that might be their basis for the computation of the amount from 5 million to 200 thousand pesos.

Atty. Atienza said that they did not hire any experts to assess the extent of the damage in the area.

PAMB Chair asked PASu Villanada regarding the depth on the area.

PASu Villanada said that the area is around 3 meters deep because some of them did snorkeling during the conduct of assessment. She informed the PAMB Chair and the board that the PAMO did not received an official report regarding the assessment done by their crew as mentioned by Atty. Atienza. She also said that the basis of the PAMB for the computation and reduction of the total fine to 50% is for humanitarian reason and consideration.

PAMB Grace asked the proponent regarding the total cost of the goods they carried.

The proponent did not answer the question.

PAMB Chair said that the proponent must be ready to answer all the questions because they were on a defense. She further said that the office was running of resources and most of the PAMB members and guests were travelled far to attend the meeting therefore she expected a positive result after the meeting. She added that the PAMB have no basis to reduce the penalty more because it was already reduced to 50% due to humanitarian reason and have consensus of the body.

PAMB Grace said that it has been years that they have been talking about this matter through series of meetings and the board were always waiting for their presence because the PAMB were seriously taking this case but they were also giving a humanitarian consideration. She added that since 2020, if the shipping company doubted the result of the assessment conducted by the PAMO, the shipping company should conduct their own assessment witnessed by the PAMO and Coast Guard and the result of their assessment would be their basis for their offer of 200 thousand pesos. She further explained that the shipping company must also conducted research on the current studies and current rates on the impact and damage on coral reefs as well as impact on the ecosystems. She also said that the PAMB were not asking just for damage fee, they were asking it for the rehabilitation of the coral reef damaged by their vessel because coral reefs plays an important role in the ecosystem. Finally, PAMB Grace expressed her thoughts, the PAMB had already done their part, technically and scientifically therefore the offer of 200 thousand pesos is not fair and enough for the value of the damaged coral reefs.

MENRO Robert Duquil informed the board that the computation of the Php 12,000 per square meter are for the damage cost only, so the reduction to 50% is very low.

Mr. Ruther John Col-long, representative from NEDA, informed the board that there is an updated fines for the Tubattaha Reef Natural Park ground incidents. It was based from the presentation of Dr. Marian Delos Angeles of REECS that the Php 12,000.00 per square meter is until year 2018, currently the amount of fine per square meter is Php 18,000.00. He added that the presentation is available online, ready for reference.

PAMB Chair asked the Legal Officer of DENR MIMAROPA, Atty. Flores regarding the fact and the discussion they have to decide.

Atty. Flores, said that based from the presentation and PAMB meetings she attended since 2020, the administrative fine charged to the shipping company which was reduced to 50% was only for the damage based on the conducted assessment. She added that the PAMO can also charge a criminal case under the ENIPAS Law.

PAMB Chair asked the representative from the Philippine Coast Guard regarding the possible sanction they might imposed to the shipping company.



CG PO2 Michael John Tobias said that mandate of the Philippine Coast Guard is for the safety. Since the vessel only had a minor scratch, they have no authority to hold the vessel. He added that as per the former Sub Station Commander, the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. filed the Marine Protest either to Palawan or Manila. He informed the board that the marine protest is the incident report, it indicates the actual scenario.

PASu Villanada informed the PAMB Chair that the PAMO submitted a letter to MARINA signed by former RED Henry Adornado dated May 27, 2020 requesting the temporary suspension of the AIFI's operation but as of the moment there were no response from them.

Mr. Luis Caraan, representative from WWF, asked the AIFI on their basis for their computation because it is almost 10% of the 50% of the total fine. He then asked if it is because that the incident brought only minor scratches on their vessel.

Atty. Atienza said that their basis was the measurement of the vessel. He added that that the damage was based on the size of the vessel lying down the coral reef.

PASu Villanada said that if the representatives from the AIFI gave attention to her presentation earlier they should have noticed the extent of the damage. They assessed the area 3 days after the incident and the result of the assessment says that the vessel may have moved from the first point of impact and may have been dragged along resulting to 463.761 square meter damage area. She added that they cannot account the coral damage on the damage of the vessel. She further explained to Atty. Atienza that the coral damage due to ship grounding is not just a damage, it alters the whole ecosystem in the area.

Mr. Caraan explained also to Atty. Atienza that the corals are very brittle that even a wave can damage it, more so huge vessel touches those marine life. He said that the board were not after the money because Apo Reef Natural Park has income generation. The board were only implementing the law with consideration. He added that the board are seriously doing their part on this, he expected that the AIFI will also do the same.

PAMB Chair said that the board were not amendable on reducing the fines. They stand on the 50% reduction as stated on the previous PAMB minutes of meeting amounting to Php 2,785,575.00. She then asked for the commitment and decision from the AIFI. She further said that if they will not commit, the board will then file a case against their company.

Atty. Atienza said that they cannot offer any proposal that moment because they must discuss it first with their board and any commitment must be upon the approval of the board.

PAMB Grace expressed her sentiments over the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. She said that the incidents happened way back May 2020. The period is long enough to settle the matter and yet they asked the board again for the extension. She felt that the decision PAMB of the PAMB were being ignored by the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. She then said that the PAMB were serious regarding this matter and is very lenient for considering amicable settlement. The PAMO gave their resources

 for the research as well as the board gave their time to settle this for two (2) years. Those extensions were not fair to the protected area and to the national agency. Series of meetings were conducted but the AIFI ignored it therefore she though that the board cannot wait another two (2) weeks for the decision from the AIFI. She added that the shipping company should send a person or representative that can decide for the company.

PAMB Chair said that the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. has given seven (7) days to settle their commitment. They are given two (2) options: 1) pay the administrative fine on installment basis and, b) pay it in kind or in cash.

PASu Villanada committed to furnish the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. via email the copy of the resolution.

On motion of PAMB Grace Diamante, seconded by PAMB Melchor Quiatchon with concurrence of the body a "RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 008, SERIES OF 2020 RE: RESOLUTION REQUIRING THE ATIENZA IINTERISLAND FERRIES INC. TO COMPENSATE THE DAMAGE TO CORAL REEF, MEASURING 463.762 SQUARE METERS, AMOUNTING TO FIVE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR PESOS (PHP5,565,144.00) CAUSED BY THE GROUDING OF M/V STAR SAN C ARLOS AT APO REEF NATURAL PARK, SABLAYAN, OCCIDENTAL MINDORO ON MAY 10, 2020" was passed.

PAMB Diamante said that based on the information given by NEDA on the penalty per square meter, she then suggested to amend the Section 10.3 of PAMB Ordinance No. AR07-007-1, Series of 2011 from Php 12,000.00 to Php 18, 000.00 per square meter.

On motion of PAMB Grace Diamante, seconded by PAMB John Paul Aristotle Ramos a "RESOLUTION AMENDING SECTION 10.3 OF PAMB ORDINANCE NO. AR07-007-1, SERIES OF 2011; AN ORDINANCE REVISING THE RULES OF IMPLEMENTATION OF PAMB RESOLUTION NO. 005, SERIES OF 2007, OR THE RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CLOSURE OF APO REEF NATURAL PARK TO ANY FISHING OR FISHERY RELATED ACTIVITIES, INCREASING DAMAGES TO REEF FROM PHP 12,000.00 TO PHP 18,000.00 PER SQUARE METER" was passed.

CENRO Anastacio Santos supported the suggestion of PAMB Diamante. He said that the study was conducted in Tubattaha Reef Natural Park and the ecosystem there is differ from the Apo Reef Natural Park, he then suggested to conduct an assessment on Resource Valuation of the Protected Area.

On motion of PAMB Lorenzo O. Ordenes, seconded by PAMB Algene Edward M. Francisco a "RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOUCES TO PRIORITIZE THE CONDUCT OF RESOURCE REVALUATION OF APO REEF NATURAL PAR, SABLAYAN, OCCIDENTAL MINDORO" was passed.



b) Ship grounding incident of F/V Monalinda 85 of RBL Fishing Corporation

PASu Villanada briefly discussed the history of the ship grounding incident last March 30, 2022 at around 2:00 AM involving the F/V Monalinda 85 managed by RBL Fishing Corporation. The vessel has a gross tonnage of 400 tons carrying 1.700 crates of Galunggod or Mackarel Scad (Decapterus sp.), from the fishing ground of El Nido, Palawan. Upon inspection and assessment of the Philippine Coast Guard, there were no sign of leakage and oil spill. The PAMO located the grounding incident through the data given by the PCG and by the Remote Operated Vehicle of BMB. She informed the board that the assessment was conducted using Snorkel Manta Tow Survey Technique and the PAMO also acquired photos during the deployment of the ROV. She added that the method used was taught by the UPLB Institute of Biological Sciences wherein one (1) SCUBA Diver crawled along the perimeter of the damage area while GPS was attached above the sea assisted by a snorkeler. The damage was estimated to be at 191.56 square meter of coral reef areas amounting to P2,298,720.00 in reference to PAMB Ordinance No. AR07-001-1, s. 2011. She also informed the board that the grounding incident involving M/V Monalinda 85 were mostly injured massive bolder corals from the genus Porites.

Mr. Georgie Tan of RBL Fishing Corporation asked for forgiveness from the board on the incident happened last March 30, 2022. The weather that time is not favorable and the GPS malfunctioned as per the vessel captain.

PASu Villanada informed the PAMB Chair that this is the first time that she presented the damage assessment to the RBL Fishing Corporation. This will be the first administrative hearing, technically.

PAMB Chair informed the RBL Fishing Corporation that they have to pay the administrative fine amounting to P2,298,720.00 for the coral damages. She suggested that the board should also apply the scheme that they proposed on the previous proponent. She expected that the RBL Fishing Corporation have knowledge on the importance of coral reefs because they are in the fishing industry.

Mr. Georgie Tan said that it is the first time that he seen those figures presented by PASu Villanada. He requested the board to give them time to discuss those figures and terms with their management. He also asked for the copy of the PAMB Resolution No. 005, Series of 2022.

The Body agreed that the RBL Fishing Corporation is hereby ordered to settle an administrative fine amounting to P2,298,720.00 until July 5, 2023, which can be paid in cash or a 30-footer high speed watercraft with 115 HP outboard engine to ARNP until December 31, 2022.

On motion of PAMB Grace C. Diamante, seconded by PAMB Melchor L. Quiatchon a "RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 005, SERIES OF 2022 RE: RESOLUTION REQUIRING THE RBL FISHING CORPORATION TO COMPENSATE THE DAMAGE ON CORAL REEF BROUGHT ABOUT BY THE GROUNDING INCIDENT OF F/V MONALINDA 85 AT APO REEF NATURAL PARK AMOUNTING TO P 2,298,720.00" was passed.
