Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 57, Series of 1999 declaring the Month of May as Month of the Ocean (MOO) and in line with the celebration of MOO, the Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (PENRO)-Marinduque conducted Coastal Clean-up and Communication, Education, and Public Awareness (CEPA) on May 20, 2022 along the coastal Barangays of Banuyo and Antipolo in the Municipality of Gasan, and Daykitin and Caigangan in the Municipality of Buenavista, Province of Marinduque.

This year's theme is adopting UNESCO's Ocean Decade Challenge 2 "Protect and Restore Ecosystems and Biodiversity", which is anchored in the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021-2030) message "The Science We Need for the Ocean We Want". This is to emphasize the significance of conservation, protection and sustainable management of coastal and marine resources.

A total of 296 volunteers comprising of 178 females and 118 males participated in the said events spearheaded by PENRO Marinduque personnel and representatives from the Philippine National Police (PNP), Philippine Army (PA), Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) of the Department of Agriculture (DA), Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) and Barangay Local Government Units (BLGUs) of Banuyo, Antipolo, Daykitin and Caigangan.

Communication, Education, and Public Awareness (CEPA) campaign about the Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) Act of 2000 also known as Republic Act 9003 was also conducted in the said coastal Barangay, to give awareness and ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment, and disposal of solid waste by formulating and adopting the best environmental practice in ESWM.

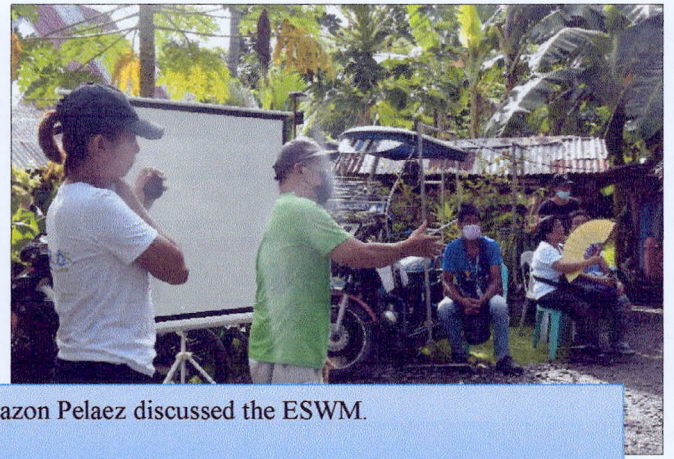
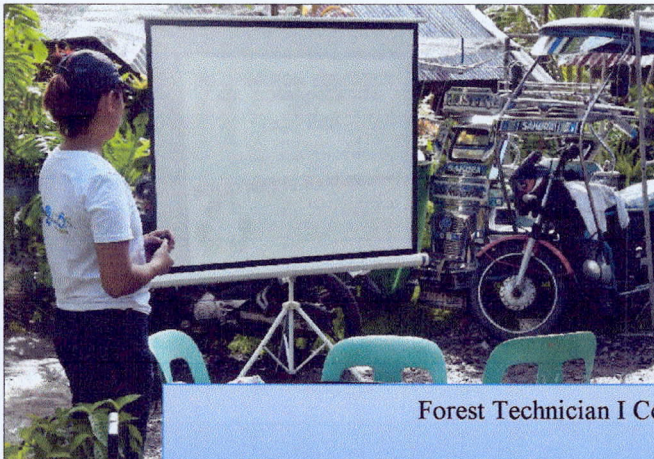

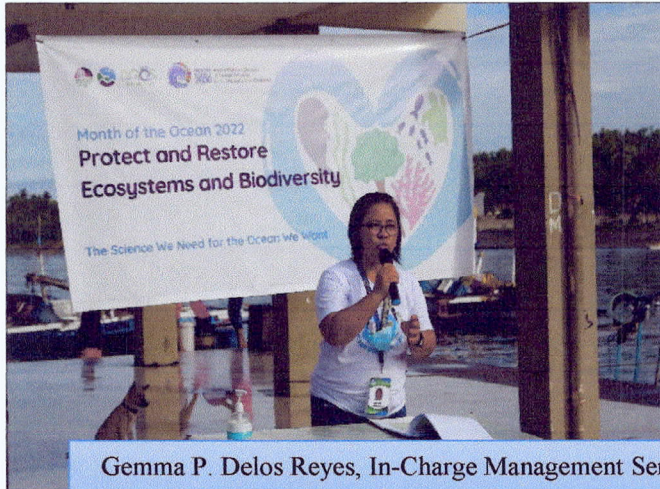
