This pertains to our target activity on the conduct of assessment of dive/snorkel operators (monitors the performance/compliance of dive centers/resort owners to GF) for El Nido-Taytay Managed Resource Protected Area (ENTMRPA), El Nido, Palawan. Please be informed that this Office conducted Green Fins on-board assessment of Umi Travel and Tours on October 20, 2022.

The assessor used the guidelines of the Green Fins to rate the tour operators on their behaviors during the island hoping and snorkeling tour. All observation were listed and assessed including the materials and facilities within the boat.

Based on the assessment, VMV travel and tours garnered a score of 202. The said score represents the environmental impact of the travel and tours in the marine environment. The score range from 0-330 with lower score representing lower impacts. The said score was discussed with the owner/managers and three action points for improvements recommended by the assessors and been agreed for implementation by the owner/manager.

Green Fins IEC material and shirt were given to the tour operators during the feed backing session as part of promotion for adapting Green Fins Approach for snorkeling industry.

- 1) Adopt the Green Fins mission statement

- 3) Adhere to the Green Fins Friendly Diving and Snorkelling Guidelines and act as a responsible role model for
- 4) Participate in regular underwater cleanups at dive operator selected sites
- 5) Participate in the development and implementation of a mooring buoy program and actively use moorings, drift or hand place anchors for boats
- 6) Prohibit the sales of corals and other marine life at the dive operation
- 7) Participate in regular coral reef monitoring and report coral reef monitoring data to a regional coral reef database
- 8) Provide adequate garbage facilities on board facility's vessel and deal with responsibly
- 9) Operate under a 'minimum discharge' policy
- 10) Abide by all local, regional, national and international environmental laws, regulations and customs
- 11) Provide guests with an explanation of Green Fins Friendly Diving and Snorkelling Guidelines in pre dive briefings
- 12) Provide training, briefing or literature for employees and guests regarding good environmental practices for snorkeling, diving, boating, marine wildlife interaction and other marine recreational activities
- 13) Provide staff and guests with public awareness and environmental materials (ID books, pamphlets etc)
- 14) Provide guests with information on local Marine Protected Areas, environmental rules and regulations
- 15) Promote a strict 'No Touch' policy for all reef diving and snorkelling.

Tagree to abide by the Green Fins Code of Conduct and understand that my company will allow trained Green Fins Assessors onboard to carry out environmental assessments. I realise that a failure to adhere to these guidelines may result in a warning being given and after several warnings it may lead to my removal from the scheme.

Summary

Umi Travel and Tours is a new member of Green Fins in 2022. They previously attended the GF IEC/Training last September 28, 2021. The owner, Ms. Sheen Irene Colendres was very cooperative and quickly organised the assessment and awareness raising presentation after signing the membership form.

We joined in Tour A island hopping tour with 11 tourists. All staff was very cooperative in answering our question/queries. They are visibly interested in learning on how they can protect the environment as they said that protecting the environment means protecting their livelihood.

3 Back up 1	Display Green Fins IEC materials to their shop and to the boat and used it during the briefing of the guest

Dear Ms. Sheen Irene Colendres and the Umi travel and tour team,

Welcome to Green Fins! We are pleased to have you join the growing network of dive and snorkel operators that are protecting our reefs. As you know, being a Green fins member means you go through an annual assessment and training session to help you improve your environmental standards.

This year, we conducted your first assessment on October 20, 2022- we snorkelled and island hopped with Mar John (Boat Captain), Marvin (Asst. Boat Captain) Jun (Cook), Dennis and Calvin (Tour Guides) and 11 guest at Big Lagoon, Secret Lagoon, Twin rocks, Shimizu Island and Seven Commando Beach. We are impressed with the excellent role model behaviour displayed by the staff. It is inspiring to see that the staff encouraged the guest to follow all rules related to environmental guidelines while on the tour.

After each assessment, you are allocated a score which represents the environmental impact of your agency. The score range from 0-330 with lower score representing lower impacts. This year, your score is 202. As discussed with you during the feedback session, this high score (high impact) even for a new member. However, the assessment process has shown that correcting a few small points can drastically reduce your score for next year.

We discussed and agreed that you would take the following actions before your next assessment:

1. Use the Green Fins Icons and materials during the Briefing of the tourist and Display it on their shop.

The Green Fins Icons and IEC materials will greatly help the tour guides and crew to promote the environmental awareness to the tourist. Following the said set of icons will help minimize impacts of the tourist and the boat to the marine environment.

2. Place atleast 2 trash bin with lid (for proper segregation) and ashtrays
Placing two trash bin with lid will greatly help no only on the awareness of the tourist on the
proper segregation of trash but also to prevent the trash from getting back to the sea. Ashtray on
the on other hand will help minimizing or avoiding the ash from the cigarette get back to the sea.
With the simple act like these, you are minimizing the tourist impacts to the marine environment
but also in protection and conservation of the area.

3. Avoid using Chemical dishwashing liquid or use organic dishwashing liquid (Messy Bessy) Chemical dish washing liquid when goes to the sea will greatly affect the marine organism more especially coral reef.

Protecting the environment also means protection our business. Thank you again for your cooperation and dedication to the environment.
