MARINDUQUE ON OCTOBER 19-20, 2022.

In compliance with target activities of Monitoring and Enforcement Section and PENRO Special Order No. 010 dated February 7, 2022 relative on the creation of teams of Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit to monitor the seaport and airport within the province of Marinduque.

Please be informed that on October 19, 2022, the undersigned went to the seaport of Barangay Poblacion-Dos, Gasan, Marinduque, and coordinated with CG SN1 Ynuardi M. Mallorca, there were regular passenger boat travelling from Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro to Marinduque and vice versa. Afterwards went straight to Marinduque Airport, Masiga, Gasan, Marinduque, still there were no schedule of flights. In Cawit Pier, there were no available schedule of departure and arrival of boats.

On October 20, 2022, the undersigned coordinated with SG Absollie L. Mañusca and SG Pedro Phodaca of PPA-Buyabod. There were regular departure and arrival of passenger boat on said port from Brgy. Polo, Maniwaya, Mongpong and the Province of Quezon. Afterwards, the monitoring was also conducted at Balanacan Port, Mogpog Marinduque and coordinated with CG-ASN Joshua Matthew B. Dela Cruz, Coast Guard for the continuous monitoring of wildlife trade and transport.

During the time of monitoring, no illegal transport of wildlife species and forest products were monitored in the said ports.

In view hereof, continuous monitoring at the said seaports and airport is hereby recommended to prevent illegal wildlife trade and transport of forest products.




