I. EVALUATION OF THE COURSE:

The objectives of the learning event

- Refresh the understanding of land classification and reclassification process;
- Level-off which the current status of FLBD output in the Province of Palawan in relation to the NIPAS and ENIPAS laws;
- Present and discuss the geo-hazard areas in Palawan including the result of the study on Vulnerability Assessment to be considered in the assessment of areas for land classification and reclassification;
- Prepare an action plan with its corresponding physical and budgetary requirements for the review and updating of the FLBD outputs including the coverage of the UPF in the province of Palawan.

The presenter also discussed the following to wit:

- 1. **Land Classification** is a system of determining which portion of the unclassified lands of the public domain are needed for the forest purposes, and which are to be declared as alienable and disposable (A&D);
- 2. *Unclassified Public Forest* Mass of land of the public domain which has not been the subject of the present system of classification for the determination of which lands are needed for forest purposes and which are not (PD 705);
- 3. **Timber or Forest Land** Lands of the public domain which are needed for forest purposes and declares as permanent forest to form part of the forest reserves (DAO 24-2008); (Even if its forest cover has been replaced by beach resorts, restaurants and other commercial establishment, it has not automatically converted from public forest to alienable agricultural land).

4. *Agricultural Lands* - refers to alienable and disposable land (A&D) of the public domain which have been the subject of the land classification system and declared as not to be needed for forest purposes (DAO 24-2008)

The following lands, even if they are below eighteen percent (18%) slope, are needed for forest purposes, and may not, therefore, be classified as alienable and disposable land, to wit:

- 1. Areas **less than 250 hectares** which are far from, or are not contiguous with any certified alienable and disposable land;
- 2. Isolated patches of forest of at least five (5) hectares with rocky terrain, or which protect a spring for communal use;
- 3. Areas which have already been reforested;
- 4. Areas within forest concession which are timber or have good residual stocking to support an existing, or approved to be established, wood processing plant;
- 5. Ridge tops and plateaus regardless of size found within, or surrounded wholly or partly by, forest land where headwaters emanate;
- 6. Approximately located road-right-or-way;
- 7. Twenty-meters strips of land along the edge of the normal high waterline of rivers and streams with channel of at least five (5) meters wide;
- 8. Strip of mangroves or swamplands at least twenty (20) meter wide along shoreline facing oceans, lakes, and other bodies of water, and strip of land at least twenty (20) meter wide facing lakes;
- 9. Areas needed for other purposes, such as National Parks, National Historical site, Game Refuge and Wildlife Sanctuaries, Forest station Sites, and other public interest; and
- 10. Areas previously proclaimed by the president as forest reserves, national parks, game refuge, bird sanctuaries, national shrine, national historical sites.

Additional Criteria or guidelines

April 25, 2012, **A MEMORANDUM** was issued by USEC Ernesto Adobo with a subject: Guidelines and criteria for assessment under FLBD project;

Can not be alienated:

- "high risk" in Geo-hazard map
- Management has been transferred to other agencies
- ➤ Shoreline/Foreshore area
- CADC and CADT Ancestral Domain

All boundaries between permanent forest and alienable and disposable lands shall be clearly marked and maintained on the ground, with infrastructure or roads, or concrete monument at interval of not more than five hundred (500) meters in accordance with established procedures and standards, or any other visible practicable signs to ensure protection of the forest.

DAO 31 Implementing Guidelines of EO 192, Section 2. **POWERS AND FUNCTION OF NAMRIA**

Item 2.5 To Classify, reclassify, assess and re-assess lands in the public domain (including existing forest reservations, national parks, wilderness areas, civil and/or military reservations, resettlement areas) into agricultural, industrial, commercial, residential, resettlement, mineral, timber or forest and grazing land and into such other classes as may be provided by law; and to establish all boundaries clearly marked on the ground between alienable or disposable lands and forest lands.

NAMRIA will prepare the LC map, conducted the ground survey and establish boundaries clearly marked (monument) on the ground.

I. EVALUATION OF THE COURSE:

• Technical Content:

RA 7586 & 11038 NIPAS Act and ENIPAS Act- this act is dedicated for the protected areas in the Philippines. This act also governs the creation of the Protected Area Management Board who will serve as officials and will spearhead the formulation of rules and regulations for protected areas.

RA 9147-Wildlife Act-this act governs the protection, conservation and regulation of all aquatic, flora and fauna and terrestrial wildlife. The Palawan Council for Sustainable and Development (PCSD) has the mandate to implement this act here in Palawan. The same agency is also in charge of the regulation and monitoring of RFFF or Reef-Fish-For-Food project/cycle.

RA 9175-Chainsaw Act-approved on September 2, 2002 which regulates the selling, purchasing, use and registration of all chainsaws. The Palawan Council for Sustainable and Development (PCSD) also has the mandate to implement this act by virtue of PCSD AO. No. 07-Implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 9175 here in Palawan. With this, the PCSD has the overruling power to issue permits such as Permit to Purchase, Dealership Permit, Seller Permit and to issue Certificate of Registration on chainsaw. The said agency is also in charge of the custody of all chainsaws confiscated which was caught violating the rules and regulations governing chainsaws and to file cases for perpetrators apprehended.

Tenurial Instruments & Permits-these are documents issued by the government to certain individual or corporations qualified to develop forestland for a certain time. This may involve forestlands potential for mining, tourism and other activities. Under these permits, an individual or a corporation may use certain parcel of forestland for utilization given that it is within the stipulated time frame for a specific kind of tenurial instrument/permit. An example of this is the MPSA and FLAg/FLAgT.

PD 705-Revised Forestry Codes-the law governing the proper classification, management and utilization forestlands to maximize its productivity to serve our nation. During the discussion of this law, the speaker explained different sections under this sdsas Presidential Decree that may be violated such as Section 78-unlawful occupation

or destruction of forest lands and grazing lands, Section 79-pasturing livestock, Section 80-illegal occupation of national parks system and recreation areas and vandalishm

Apprehension, Arrest, Search and Seizure-Under this topic Atty. Hemor explained the process on the apprehension and arrest of perpetrators during operations. This topic discussed the difference between arrest with warrant and warrantless arrest. Also, it was explained on this topic how to secure search warrant from proper authorities and when to implement warrantless search.

• Impressions/Comment:

For the technical content and discussion of topics, all speakers expressed their deep knowledge and understanding of their assigned topic. From the laws governing our Protected Areas, the speaker well explained the scope of the law, the violations that may be encountered and the persons responsible for the creation of regulations within declared protected areas. Also, the speaker from Palawan Council for Sustainable Development (PCSD) remarkable explained his topic in Filipino making it more easy to understand the rules and regulations pertaining with the Wildlife Act and Chainsaw Act. The different tenurial instrument that may be issued by the government was explained by the speaker, however, an actual example of permits that is being issued may be of use to further elaborate on how to scrutinized such permits for future reference of our DENROs. The different sections of PD 705 was also well explained by the speaker while giving examples of violation during topic discussion followed the well-presented process flow of apprehension, search and seizure.

During the question and answer portion, most of the questions were answered directly and clearly by the concerned speaker. It is also very helpful that an actual scenario was conducted as final activity of the said training. Here, participants were able to show all the things learned during the 3-day session and are able to impose the proper way of conducting apprehension.

The three-day activity is success as it yielded more than twenty DENROs of the mining company. The undersigned would like to thank the sponsors for the said activity for the good venue, sumptuous food and very informative sessions.

II. RELEVANCE OF THE LEARNING EVENT TO PARTICIPANTS WORK/FUNCTION

As an employee of this Department and working in a functional work system, all discussions and topics are all relevant as this Department is mandated to spearhead environmental activities including but not limited to the protection, conservation and filing of cases of violators of our environmental laws and regulations. Moreover, the topics discussed which are not directly relevant on my field of responsibility can help me in directing and responding to queries which may be relevant to these topics and also I became more aware of the different services this Office offers.

I would like to recommend the continuation of the said basic course for other personnel to be able to refresh and know the different services of this Office and to include samples of permits and other documents issued by this Office to further enhance the scrutiny of our DENROS.

I. EVALUATION OF THE COURSE:

Technical Content

This is in line with the interest of the service and in order to facilitate and strengthen the environment enforcement monitoring and apprehension activities within AOJ of CENRO Brooke's Point. The scope were all the laws and policies in forestry detailed below:

- Highlights of RA 7586, otherwise known as the "National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) Act of 1992 and for other purposes"; as amended by RA 11038 or the ENIPAS Act-Declaring protected areas and providing for their management, amending for this purpose discussed by SEMS Rhodora B. Ubani;
- 2. Highlights of RA 9147, otherwise known as the Wildlife Act and RA 9175 or the Chainsaw Act discussed by PCSD representative- Mr. John Jester Cabular. It was emphasized that in Palawan, the implementation of stated laws on wildlife and chainsaw is being regulated by Palawan Council for Sustainable Development pursuant to the Strategic Environmental Plan for Palawan Act or SEP Law);
- 3. Issuance of DENR Tenurial Instruments and Permit for tree cutting and transport of lumbers and non-timber forest products discussed by Forester Menelaus Rey H. Duller. He presented the different tenurial instruments that this Office issues and specify the documentary requirements;
- 4. Highlights on PD 705, also known as the Revised Forestry Code of the Philippines as amended by Executive Order No. 277 and RA 7161 discussed by Mr. Alvin John S. Velasco and gave emphasis on unlawful kaingin, illegal cutting, gathering, possession of timber forest products, unlawful occupation or destruction of forest lands and grazing lands; illegal occupation on natural parks and recreation areas and vandalism; survey by unauthorized persons; misclassification of lands; unauthorized issuance of tax declaration to name a few;
- 5. Rules and regulations on wood charcoal under DAO 2022-05 approved on May 2022 by Atty. Harlene M. Hemor with emphasis on regulating the wood charcoal making and

- allowing the use of timber forest products as long as permitted by this office. She also mentioned that mangrove trees are not allowed in charcoal making;
- 6. Apprehension, Arrest, Search and Seizure and evidence preparation were discussed by Atty. Hemor. She discussed that a warrantless arrest can be done if the person is caught in the act violating the law, if the offense has just been committed and the person arresting has personal knowledge of facts showing that the person to be arrested is the one who committed the offense and, the person to be arrested is fugitive. That the forest protection officers (DENROs) and citizens can do such;
- 7. DAO 197-2 Rules on Administrative Adjudication of Illegal Forest Products and the Machinery, Equipment, Tools and Conveyances used in connection therein; and DAO 2008-22 Deputation as DENRO/SDENRO individuals/groups that are willing to be involved as discussed by Forester II Arnel Gamutia;
- 8. RA 7942 or the Phil Mining Act of 1995 was discussed by Forest Technician I Ratib M. Melosin. In this, I learned that a mining company should have a definite plan and fund from exploration up to the final mine rehabilitation and decommissioning stage. Also, permits in quarrying were discussed.

• Impressions/Comment:

- a) Topics were well presented and discussed. It is also very timely for the personnel discharging duties on field especially on forest protection and apprehensions;
- b) I learned about the laws governing forest management such as the following: PD 705, EO 23- declaring moratorium in cutting/harvesting of timber in the natural and residual forest and creating the AILTF, EO 277 (Amended Sec 68 of PD 705, RA 7161 or the forest charges and prohibits cutting of all mangrove tree species, RA 9175- or the Chainsaw Act of 2002, PD 953 or penalizing cutting, damaging of trees in private lands that are for public use, except when life or property is in danger. Also, the SLAPP suit was elaborated or the Strategic Law Suit against Public Participation or the protection of the forest protection officer against cases filed by the perpetrators.
- c) I learned the different sanctions and penalties to be charge to perpetrators and environmental laws to be used in filing cases. With this, assessment of the exact location of where the apprehension happened is essential in identifying if it is within forest land (PD 705, as amended), protected area (RA 11038) or within the critical habitat area (RA 9147) for appropriate filing of case in the court and to avoid dismissal;

II. RELEVANCE OF THE LEARNING EVENT TO PARTICIPANTS WORK/FUNCTION

As an employee of DENR, it will be my guiding tool in my everyday work life. And, all of these learnings gained in the event will be used and revisited especially during on field works. All of learning gained will be used and revisited and will be my guiding tool.

The learning event is relevant and timely as it adds up to the knowledge of the different laws and regulations in forest protections though I am presently functioning in processing of patents within alienable and disposable lands. I am now equipped with more information in apprehending violators.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is respectfully recommended that such kind of learning event should be conducted annualy to forest protection officers of this office to serve also as an avenue to discuss the issues and concerns encountered during actual apprehensions and its legal concerns.

That the preformatted pre-test/post-test may be revised using situational events that actually happened or even related to apprehensions in Southern Palawan.
