


Submitted is the report of this Office on the Technical Assistance in MPA Networking on the Formulation of Action Plan for Verde Island Passage.

A total of eight (8) municipalities are within the Verde Island Passage. All the activities identified in the Action Plan are funded for implementation next year, CY 2023. Further, these activities are focused on the protection and management of 28 Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) locally managed by concerned municipalities. Among these municipalities, Pinamalayan has the highest fund of Php26,490,000.00 while Gloria has the lowest fund allotted in the Action Plan.

Attached is the crafted Verde Island Passage Action Plan for CY 2023.

Respectfully submitting the report of this Office regarding formulation of Action Plan for the Verde Island Passage.

Based on the workshop last December 1, 2022 in Vencio's Garden and Restaurant, Calapan City regarding Action Plan for Verde Island Passage. A total of 25 participants attended in the said workshop, The participants are composed of representatives from Calapan City, Baco, Naujan, Pinamalayan, Pola, San Teodoro, and Puerto Galera all are within the Verde Island Passage (VIP) together with Provincial Agriculturist Office (PAgO) personnel.

Forester III/ Chief, CDS Forester Amor D. Asi acknowledged the participants who attended the workshop. After acknowledging the participant she presented the powerpoint on "The Significance of the Verde Island Passage (VIP) in relation to the Proposed Establishment of VIP as a Protected Area under NIPAS". She also discussed the importance and benefits of the community if the Verde Island Passage became a Protected Areas. After the discussion, the participants start to present their activities on Coastal Resource Management for the CY 2023.

The eight (8) municipalities representatives discussed and presented their Program/Project/ Activities on Coastal Resource Management. Based on the presentation,



the Municipal government of Pinamalayan has the largest budget for Coastal with P26, 490,000.00 followed by the Calapan City Government with P21, 257,097.00. On the other hand, the Municipal Government of Gloria has the lowest budget for PPAs of P47, 000.00.

All the activities for next year are focused on the protection and management of 28 Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) managed by the eight (8) LGUs. The following are the MPAs within the Verde Island Passage.


