





GAD Alternate Focal Forester Bea Natasha Fortu presented the 2022 GAD Accomplishment in the Province. She highlighted the participation of women in all activities, projects and programs of the Office.

Land Management Officer Peterson Fabellon share his hardships in the attainment of targets of the Regulations and Permitting Section of CENRO Roxas especially in the processing and issuances of patents.

CENRO Rodel M. Boyles also presented their facilitating factors in attainment of their targets, hindrances and emerging issues such as the following:

- Dismissal of criminal cases for violation of PD 705, as amended involving apprehended wood charcoal on the ground that it is neither a forest product nor a finished wood product with a reminder that filling of similar case within the jurisdiction of RTC Branch 41, Pinamalayan may result to indirect contempt of the court;
- Update/s on the Paitan Mangyan Resrevation Case particularly the request for Geodetic Engineer to conduct relocation survey in order to determine the metes and bounds of Proclamation No. 809; and
- Immediate hiring of Geodetic Engineer in CENRO Socorro.



Land Management Officer III CENRO Roxas RPS Chief Maria Alva Renelyn Culla-Umali presented the investment plan of the Green Economy Model at Puerto Galera. The threeyear plan was crafted this years and to be implemented until 2024. She presented all activities and budget allocation to be conducted herein.

Planning Officer I Engr. Jezreel John Matre presented the FY 2023 Work and Financial Plan per National Expenditure Program (NEP) as way forward in the succeeding year.

Chief MSD Maricel V. Supleo gave her updates on the filling-up of vacant positions in DENR Oriental Mindoro and thanked all for the efforts and services in the attainment of all targets and accomplishments.

Chief TSD Alma E. Gibe also reminded on the lacking reports and to submit it to PENRO on or before December 15, 2022. She also congratulated everyone in the successful year and for being diligent in the service of the people and for the environment.




