Submitted herewith is the Third (3rd) Quarter Patrol Plan of DENR-PENRO Marinduque with pertinent enclosures for LAWIN Forest and Biodiversity Protection System for the months of July to September, Calendar Year 2022.

This plan covers a total forest conservation area of 15, 077 hectares to be patrolled and monitored by a 32 patrollers comprising two (2) females and thirty (30) males and composed of the following:




