ASSISTANCE ON MPA NETWORKING FOR VIP-MPAN & LEN (MAGHALI NETWORK) FOR THE SECOND QUARTER CY-2022

Per DENR- PENRO Special Order No. 22-70, please be informed that the undersigned facilitated the conduct Technical Assistance on MPA Networking for VIP-MPAN & LEN (Maghali Network) for the second quarter CY-2022 held on June 22-24, 2022 at Lyn's Fern Garden, Budiong, Odiongan, Romblon.

I. BACKGROUND

As defined, MPA network is a collection of individual marine protected areas operating cooperatively and synergistically, at various spatial scales, and with a range of protection levels, in order to fulfill ecological aims more effectively and comprehensively than individual sites could alone. The network will also display social and economic benefits, though the latter may only become fully developed over long time frames as ecosystems recover.

Moreover, MPA Networks contribute to sustainable development goals by fostering integrated ocean and coastal management. Networks can also help reduce the degradation of coastal and marine habitats, slow the loss of endangered marine species, and restore depleted fisheries.

In the province of Romblon, included in the Verde Island Passage Marine Protected Area Network (VIP-MPAN) are the three (3) island municipalities of Banton, Corcuera, and Concepcion. As part of the technical assistance, we need to regularly convene the management body in order to share updates and discuss the way forward on the conservation, protection and management of the Verde Island Passage Marine Protected Area.



II. OBJECTIVES

General: To strengthen the Maghali MPA Network in the municipalities of Banton, Corcuera and Concepcion.

Specific:

- 1. To increase level of awareness of the coastal communities through engagement of key stakeholders in the management of established MPA Network through social marketing approach; and
- 3. To mobilize support of the local communities and other key stakeholders in the protection and development of the marine protected area.

III. STRATEGIES & PROCESSES/METHODS

The DENR PENRO-CDS will lead and facilitate the activity through active involvement of concerned LGUs, PG-ENRO, BFAR, PCG, PNP Maritime, Romblon PPO and RSU.

IV. FUNDING

The funding was obtained from WFP CY 2022 - A.03.d.3. Coastal and Marine Ecosystems Rehabilitation Program - Management of Coastal and Marine Resources/Areas - TA

V. ACTIVITY REPORT

This Office facilitated the conduct of "2nd Quarter Technical Assistance on MPA Networking for VIP-MPAN & LEN (Maghali Network)" held on June 22-24, 2022 at Lyn's Fern Garden, Budiong, Odiongan, Romblon.

It was attended by twenty-five (25) participants composing of seventeen (17) male and eight (8) female primarily from the municipalities of Corcuera and Concepcion along with representatives from PG-ENRO, BFAR, Philippine Coast Guard, Romblon State University, and the DENR-PENRO CDS as the facilitator and secretariat. Also present via Zoom virtual meetings are representatives from Romblon PPO and Resource Person from the SEA Institute-VIP / ABS-CBN Bantay-Kalikasan.

The Opening Program started about 9:30 in the morning led by CDS Secretariat. Information Systems Analyst II Philippe Zar E. Meñez hosted the opening program. Mr. Delfin Mores of PG-ENRO led the opening prayer followed by the singing of the Philippine



National Anthem thru video presentation.

DENR-PENRO Chief, MSD Thelmo S. Hernandez delivered a warm welcome remarks. He acknowledged and welcomed the participants as well as discussed a brief overview of the activity. Likewise, he recognized the efforts of the stakeholders particularly the LGUs and the partner agencies in fulfilling their roles and responsibilities in the conservation, protection and management of the Verde Island Passage Marine Corridor.

OIC-PFO Luisito Manes of BFAR gave a message and words of commitment. He expressed the full support of BFAR to aid the Maghali Network in terms of technical assistance and livelihood to the three island municipalities. He stated that we should focus on our goal and be inspired to fulfil our part to achieve our objective.

OIC-PENR Officer Arnoldo A. Blaza, Jr. gave an inspirational message. As the new head of the agency, PENRO Blaza expressed his enthusiasm to be a part of the VIP-MPAN & LEN specifically the Maghali Network. He emphasized that our main goal is to protect so we must not hesitate to share our thoughts, ideas and strategies specially the stakeholders to further improve the protection and management of the VIP.

Afterwards, photo opportunity was conducted with the participants.

For the meeting proper, Coastal Unit Head, For. Marielle V. Magallanes presented the highlights of the previous meeting conducted last March 30, 2022 at Budiong, Odiongan, Romblon. This is in order to refresh the participants of the discussions and agreements reached by the stakeholders last quarter.

Then, each municipality presented the status and updates of their respective Coastal and Marine Ecosystems Management Program (CMEMP) activities. OIC-MAO Joseph Eric Fano presented for the municipality of Concepcion followed by MAO Cristy Fruelda of Corcuera. Unfortunately, the municipality of Banton was not able to attend in this quarter due to conflict in schedule to equally important activities of the LGU.

Each municipality presented the status and updates of their CMEMP activities by discussing their accomplishments, best practices, as well as their issues and concerns regarding its management.

The municipality of Concepcion presented that for this quarter, they have planted 6,000 mangrove propagules at Brgy. Poblacion Mangrove Area. Bantay Dagat members also conducted regular seaborne patrolling at Masadya Fish Sanctuary. Markers were also installed to ensure the sanctuary's protection The municipality installed perimeter fencing



20-meter from the beach area upward for the restoration and protection of Tabon Bird and Marine Turtle Sanctuary. Artificial coral reefs are also made for coral propagation. The municipality also declared four (4) additional Marine Reserve Areas.

Sir Manes of BFAR asked about the size of the artificial coral reefs being made by the municipality. He shared that other municipalities tend to create bigger reefs and they struggle to transport it to the ocean. Sir Fano assured that the artificial reefs being made are manageable in size. Sir Manes also suggested that the municipality's budget for CMEMP activities should also be included in the presentation of updates.

The municipality of Corcuera reported that in terms of sustainable livelihood assistance, the municipality were giving nylons and fishing gears to registered boats. The municipality are also conducting quarterly coastal clean-up activities participated by Municipal and Barangay LGUs, and 4Ps beneficiaries. In terms of biodiversity conservation, they are continuously conducting mangrove tree planting in the municipality. The PG-ENRO also launched a program entitled "plant now, pay later" which have planted about 3,000 mangroves. Last June 14, 2022, the municipality conducted synchronized tree planting in the municipality participated by LGU officials and employees as well as other government agencies. They are also conducting Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) campaigns about environmental awareness and global warming.

Afterwards, Mr. Joal Ascalon of SEA Institute-VIP, ABS-CBN Bantay Kalikasan gave updates on the Community-based Reef Monitoring Program specifically the ALWAN Reef Monitoring Method. He discussed that by August 2022, they will conduct preparation meetings, identification of monitoring stations and selection of monitoring teams. Actual training will commence by the end of October or early November 2022. Mr. Ascalon also hopes to reach out to partners and interested groups that will join in the program.

Mr. Delfin Mores of PG-ENRO and Dr. Borromeo B. Motin of RSU expressed commitment to offer technical assistance for the project particularly in the sharing of technology and techniques in coral reef monitoring. Mr. Ascalon will make sure that coordination and schedules will be properly communicated in order to avoid conflicts.

Chief CDS Arlyn D. Balibag raised that since the DENR have no baseline data on coral reef assessment for Maghali Network, is it okay to proceed to monitoring? PG-ENRO shared that they have conducted assessment for the three municipalities last 2016. Mr. Ascalon assured that the ALWAN reef monitoring method will complement the baseline data since the monitoring will also be conducted in areas assessed in the past. Likewise, the data that will be gathered during the actual training can be utilized as baseline data for succeeding



monitoring activities.

For the afternoon session, Dr. Borromeo Motin facilitated the finalization of the harmonized Action Plan of Maghali Network for the implementation of the eight (8) thematic areas indicated in the VIP-MPAN & LEN Strategic Management Plan. Dr. Motin presented the Action Plan for comments, suggestions, and recommendations of the Body. Other programs, projects and activities added in the action plan are the following: (1) establishment of community-based conservation program for marine turtles under thematic area 2-Biodiversity Conservation; (2) conduct of joint enforcement activities under thematic area 4-Governance, Policy and Marine Law Enforcement; (3) establishment of aquaculture livelihood under thematic area 5-Socio-economics and Sustainable Financing; and (4) Implementation of Green-Gray Infrastructure projects under thematic area 7-Climate Resilience. (Attached is the detailed action plan).

Afterwards, For. Marielle V. Magallanes presented a brief orientation on the proposed establishment of Verde Island Passage (VIP) under the National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS). She discussed updates and agreements reached during the Workshop-Consultation on the Proposed Establishment of VIP under NIPAS held on April 20-21, 2022 at Sto. Tomas, Batangas.

Engr. Raymund G. Inocencio then presented the Process of Protected Areas Establishment emphasizing the conduct of Protected Area Suitability Assessment (PASA) as one of the critical steps in the establishment of VIP under NIPAS. Then, the template for the stocktaking of necessary data for the accomplishment of PASA forms was given to the LGUs.

Afterwards, CDS Chief Arlyn D. Balibag facilitated the ways forward of the activity. agreements reached during the meeting are (1) presentation of harmonized Action Plan to Local Chief Executives; (2) expression of commitment; (3) revisit MOA; (4) reorganization of the Management Body; (5) development of Manual of Operations.

Lastly, a short closing program was led by the DENR-PENRO CDS Secretariat. CDS Chief Arlyn D. Balibag ended the program by expressing her gratitude for a successful event hoping that this activity will empower the network.



Conclusion/Recommendation:

The Maghali Network took another step forward to strengthen their Marine Protected Area Network through the involvement, partnership and collaboration among the different national agencies such as the DENR, DA-BFAR, PG-ENRO, PNP Maritime, Romblon PPO and the Romblon State University.

During the 2nd Quarter Meeting, the Network has finalized its Action Plan for the implementation of the VIP-MPAN Strategic Management Plan to be presented to the Local Chief Executives.






