

COMPLETE STAFF WORK (Regular Monitoring/Assessment of CBFM Area) Bigkis-Lakas ng Mangingisda ng Balanacan (BILMA)

A. Factual Background:

Bigkis Lakas ng Mangingisda ng Balanacan (BILMA) is one of the People's Organization (PO) awarded with Community Based Forest Management (CBFM) Area in the Province of Marinduque. The organization is composed of thirty-six (36) active members (33 male and 3 female) registered to the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and Security and Exchange Commission (SEC).

On June 24, 2002, Fourteen Hectares and Five Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty Square Meters (14.5950 has.) area located at the Mangrove Area of Brgy. Balanacan was issued/awarded to the PO with CBFM Number R-IV-B-MAR-CBFMA-02-006.

In 2017 to 2018, the organization was granted with a project entitled "Mangrove Rehabilitation cum Bangus and Sea Cucumber Project" under Community Based Forest Management – Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Program (CBFM-CARP). The project components were One Unit of Motorized Banca, Fish pen Construction, Enrichment of 10.0 hectares Mangrove area within the awarded CBFMA by planting 27,500 Bacauan Propagules, and to culture 20,000 Bangus Fingerlings and 900 pcs. Sea Cucumber. The project was fully accomplished on December 2018.

Luckily, the cultured bangus and sea cucumber were harvested before the occurrence of typhoon "TISOY" on December 2019. However, it caused damages both in the planted bacauan, the constructed fish pen as well as to the motorized banca.

For the maintenance and protection of the CBFMA, when bacauan propagules are already mature, the members of the association will be conducting replanting activity to replace the dead planted bacauan in the area. A perimeter fence along the mangrove plantation was also established. Since the damage of the fish pen caused by the typhoon was unrepairable, the BILMA decided to get the materials like bamboo poles and mesh nets that maybe useful for other livelihood project of the association in the future.

Executive Order (EO) 192 (1987)

- Reorganizes the environment and the natural resources sector, and mandates the DENR to conserve, manage, develop, properly use, license, and regulate the use of natural resources.

> DENR Department Administrative Order (DAO) 123 (1989)

- Promotes community participation in the rehabilitation, protection, improvement, and management of degraded and productive residual forest, bushlands, virgin forests, and marginal lands.

Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 or RA 7160

- Devolves central government functions, such as the natural resource management functions of the DENR, to Local Government Units (LGUs).

National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) Act or RA 7586 (1992)

- Allocates forestlands and forest resources as protected area systems for purpose of biodiversity conservation, habitat preservation, watershed protection, and maintenance of ecological balance.

Executive Order (EO) 263 (1995)

- Declares CBFM as the country's national strategy of sustainable forest management.

> DENR Department Administrative Order (DAO) 96-29 (1996)

- Provides the Implementing Rules and Regulations of EO 263; paved the way for the granting of resource use rights to communities; and allows the transfer of tenure as well as their limited division through such mechanisms as joint venture and contracting.

DENR Memorandum Circular (MC) 97-12 (1997)

Adopts the DENR Strategic Action Plan for CBFM.

➤ Indigenous People's Right Act (IPRA) or RA 8371 (1997)

- Recognizes, protects, and promotes the rights of indigenous peoples, and paved the way for the individual or communal titling of ancestral forestlands.

C. Agencies Involved:

D. Potential Problem/s:

Natural calamities and phenomenon like typhoon, Southwest Monsoon (habagat) and Northeast Monsoon (amihan) are some of the main problems that may affect the livelihood project of BILMA. These are also factors causing high mortality of planted mangrove species in the area.

Human factor can also be a potential problem. There are citizens in adjacent area that are fishing near the location of the project.

E. Actions Taken:

Regular monitoring and assessment of the CBFM Area is being conducted. This is to evaluate the status of the area and what activities are being conducted by the PO including any development, maintenance and protection activities. This is also a tool to know the future plans of the PO in their CBFM Area.

F. Findings and Recommendation:

Currently, BILMA has a Lapu-lapu culture project funded by the Provincial Agriculture Office combined with the fund gained from bangus and cucumber culture. Since the damage of the fish pen caused by the typhoon was unrepairable, they utilized the materials recovered from the damaged fish pen to construct floating cages for the present livelihood project.

The undersigned also informed that the association is planning for another livelihood project, specifically crab culture, and they are in the process of fund sourcing.

For the maintenance and protection, the PO members who are on duty on the Lapu-lapu culture area are also conducting regular monitoring and patrolling in the CBFMA. There are also matured bacauan propagules to be utilized for the maintenance and protection of the area.

Based on the observations and information gathered during the regular assessment/monitoring in the CBFM Area of BILMA, Mr. Celso J. Quinto, the PO president, was advised to prepare and submit to this office a status report of their CBFM Area including the current livelihood projects managed/operated by the association and their future plans. It

was also reminded that every activity and establishment of livelihood project must be coordinated to this office for information, documentation and necessary technical assistance.




