FOUNDATION PHILIPPINES (FFP) AND ATTENDED MMPL

ENDOWMENT FUND ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

Please be informed that the staff of Mt. Mantalingahan Protected Landscape (MMPL) Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) assisted the learning visit of the Forest Foundation Philippines (FFP) last May 24, 2022 along the national highway surrounding MMPL and attended the MMPL endowment advisory committee meeting last May 25-26, 2022 at Hue, Hotel Puerto Princesa City, Palawan.

These activities were conducted prior to the evaluation of the 2nd project proposal of MMPL-PAMB under the MMPL endowment. The title of the 2nd project proposal was "Strengthening the Patrolling/Monitoring Activities within MMPL, Continuing the IEC Campaign, and Enhancing the Capacity of PAMB Members to Effectively Manage MMPL". This proposed project highlights the hiring of additional law enforcers and provision of needed field gadgets and gears; capacitate MMPL PAMB members and the PAMO in managing MMPL and encourage PAMB members to take part in the enforcement activity such as reporting environmental crimes and conduct Communication Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) campaign at schools and community with the protected area.

Learning visit to MMPL:

On May 24, 2022 the Executive Director of Forest Foundation Philippines Atty. Jose Andres Canivel and Member of the MMPL Endowment Advisory Committee Mr. Dennis Salvador and FFP staff Ms. Ana Gabriel and Ms. Irish Rocas visited MMPL to see MMPL's Mountain Range and learn about its important features along with environmental threats which degrade its socioecological value.

Above mentioned visitors were accompanied by PASu Renato S. Gonzaga, APASu Pressy Joy S. Cocjen and CEPA Officer Michael John D. Cantuba. They traveled on the road around MMPL starting from Quezon, Rizal, Bataraza, Brooke's Point then Sofronio Espanola and along the way, the PAMO staff discussed significant features of MMPL such as the watersheds and rich biodiversity areas. Also discussed are observed threats in MMPL such as the proposed road that is planned to traverse the core zone MMPL from Barangay Tagusao, Quezon to Barangay Pulot Interior Sofronio Espanola and the illegal selling of land inside the protected area.

Also discussed during the travel is the possible re-establishment of old MMPL signages and addition of new ones at selected site near the boundary like Sitio Ogis, Barangay Ransang, Rizal Palawan which is the jump off to MMPL peak.

The team had lunch at Bataraza, Palawan and conferred with LGU Administrative Officer Mr. Valentino Palasigue re: management strategies and initiatives of LGU Bataraza for MMPL.

The tour ended at around 4:00 PM.

MMPL Endowment Advisory Committee Meeting:

On May 25-26, 2022 the Meeting of the advisory committee for MMPL endowment fund was held at Hue Hotel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan whereas the 2nd project proposal of MMPL PAMB was evaluated by the MMPL endowment advisory Committee.

PASu Renato S. Gonzaga presented and delivered the discussion regarding brief details of the project such as the duration, estimated cost, objectives, expected results and financial management. He also explained the response of the PAMO in the recent comments of Forest Foundation Philippines (FFP) which is as follow:

- Clarify the difference of proposed budget for field gears and GPS with the fund that will come from CI on enforcement gear and gadgets amounting to Php 4M.

These are already included in the budget (see remarks at Annex A, item 1.1.2) (Exclude Logo of CI, IDEAS, FFP) (Consider design from other countries like Brazil)

Yes! If possible since there will be 2 technical staff to be hired and considering further that the first procured laptop is no longer serviceable.

Provision of GPS and other field gears were mentioned by CI, however, considering that the project will start soon, we have to train field personnel before exposure to actual field operations and the commitment of CI might come late.

The presentation of the PASu was followed by comments, suggestions and commitments from the MMPL endowment Advisory Committee members.

Memorandum of Agreement between DENR PENRO and IDEAS.	MMPL has no trust fund yet thus in order for the project to materialized on the ground, IDEAS volunteered to be a fund conduit while MMPL-PAMB thru the PAMO is still processing its requirements for the opening of IPAF account. IDEAS as a fund conduit will serve as channel of wages for hired law enforcers/personnel of the project and maintain and manage the fund of the project, however, the executive director of IDEAS raised a concern pertaining to who will oversee the implementation of the project such as hiring, monitoring and documentation. Therefore, prior to Executive Order No. 192, Series of 1987 mandating DENR to serve as the primary government agency responsible for the sustainable management and development of the country's natural resources, MMPL initiated the creation of a Memorandum of Agreement between DENR PENRO and IDEAS whereas DENR PENRO thru the PAMO shall Serve as the hiring agency that will implement the project covering three (3) years in line with the specific objectives; managed the implementation of the project; Monitor and document the day to day activities of the of the hired personnel and their accomplishment; Monitor the status of the implementation and submit annual report to the DENR and PAMB and Exercise as primary oversight functions over the execution of this Agreement to oversee and monitor the efficient and effective implementation thereof. Mr. Jobert John Bandol of BMB informed that according to existing rules and regulations, MOA between IDEAS and DENR should be sign by the Regional Executive Director, hence, the board suggested that the PAMO verify the legality and certain provisions of the MOA and the authority of the PENR Officer to sign contracts of forest rangers with DENR Legal.

Provision of gadgets, gears and equipment by Conservation International (CI)	Conservation International has committed to provide gadgets, gears and equipment for enforcers as stated by Atty. Edward Lorenzo.
Qualification for hiring of MMPL enforcers	Criteria for recruiting ranger/volunteers will be developed by the PAMO. Indigenous peoples will be prioritized in the hiring process. Sustainability of engaging rangers/volunteers will also be ensured by prioritizing IPs and other local community members because they have a direct stake in the protection of MMPL.
Convergence of concern agencies	A coordination (enforcement) planning between agencies (Forest Foundation, IDEAS, PCSD, CI, LGUs) to be hosted by CI.

Additionally, here are the comments and corrections from the advisory committee regarding the created MOA between IDEAS and DENR-PENRO.

- Use Philippine Tropical Forest Conservation Foundation (PTFCF) instead of Forest Foundation Philippines.
- Roles and Responsibilities:
 - DENR through PAMO
 - Consider rephrasing no. 3 to "Supervise the day-to-day activities of the hired personnel and document their monthly accomplishments."
 - Consider rephrasing no. 4 to "Monitor the status of implementation and submit annual reports to the DENR and PAMB and regular reports to IDEAS."
 - Consider adding in the MOA the implementation of other activities as indicated in the project, not just on hiring and monitoring of personnel. (included in no. 3 as part role of the DENR thru PAMO
 - Clarify the management of HR-related concerns (if to follow DENR policies). (Establish own guidelines with consideration to existing law)
- Roles and Responsibilities:
 - IDEAS
 - Clarify that the PAMO will submit an agreed upon set of documents as basis for the processing and release of salaries to the personnel.
 - Include submit technical and financial reports prepared and endorsed by the PAMO.
- Considering rephrasing the section on Duration and Effectivity to:

• "This Memorandum of Agreement shall take effect upon signing by both parties and shall remain in effect for the period of 3 years, *unless otherwise decided in writing by both parties*.

In the event of any issues that may be raised concerning certain provisions of this Agreement, the parties shall exert best effort to settle the same amicably. *Any revision, amendment of modification should only be upon mutual agreement and approval of both parties through a written instrument duly executed and signed by its authorized representatives.*

If any provision of this MOA be declared void, illegal or unenforceable, the same may be severed without affecting the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions.

Please be informed further that the second project proposal has been approved by the MMPL Endowment Advisory Committee but is subjected to minor amendments in the discussions of the narrative and adjustments in the financial programming as per comments and suggestions from the Endowment Advisory Committee.

Moreover, the PAMO shall comply and revise the 2nd project proposal and other related documents such as the MOA between DENR PENRO and IDEAS accordingly. The latter will be submitted to Forest Foundation Philippines (FFP) and the MMPL endowment Advisory Committee for final review, approval and project commencement.
