MONITORING OF DUGONG IN SAN VICENTE, PALAWAN

Forwarded is the memorandum dated June 15, 2022 of CENRO Roxas regarding the conducted dugong monitoring in San Vicente, Palawan on June 9, 2022 that serves as **Means of Verification (MOV)** to the target activity under Conservation of threatened species – Dugong.

Based on the report, the monitoring was conducted at Sitio Panindigan, Barangay Poblacion, San Vicente, Palawan. According to one of the seaweed farmers in the area, he usually sees four (4) dugong during the months of April and May when the waters are calm between 8:00 and 9:00 in the morning and around 5:00 in the afternoon. The said species is approximately three (3) meters in length. The location of dugong sightings is near Double Island in Pagdanan Bay of the same municipality. He also added that there are marine turtle and tabon bird sightings in the area, particularly in Palawan Cove Island Resort.

MONITORING OF DUGONG IN SAN VICENTE, PALAWAN

The undersigned conducted monitoring of dugong (*Dugong dugon*) in Sitio Panindigan, Barangay Poblacion, San Vicente Palawan on June 9, 2022. The team was accompanied by Barangay Kagawad Ismael Turla. According to him, seaweed farmers in Sitio Panindigan report that they see dugong in seagrass areas where they grow seaweeds. Said farmers see 1 to 2 dugong feeding on seaweeds that fall from the seaweed lines. He further said that there was no sighting of dugong in the area before, but, it was observed that dugong started to be seen in the area when the seaweed farming began. This may be because seagrasses are now protected since fishermen cannot cast their nets in these areas anymore due to the presence of seaweed lines which cover around fifty (50) hectares.

According to Mr. James Rey Calosor, a seaweed farmer, he usually sees four (4) dugong during months of April and May when waters are calm between 8:00 to 9:00 in the morning and around 5:00 in the afternoon. He added that dugong is approximately more than three (3) meters in length. The location of dugong sightings is near Double Island in Pagdanan Bay of the abovementioned municipality. Mr. Calosor also said that there also marine turtles and Tabon bird in the area particularly in Palawan Cove Island Resort.




Figure 3: The Seaweeds farm area in Sitio Panindigan, Poblacion, San Vicente, Palawan
