

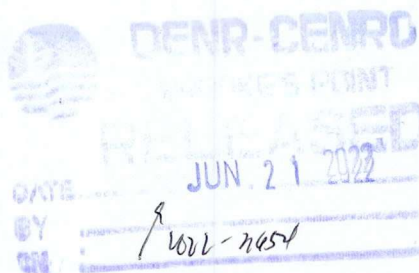

COMMUNITY BASED FOREST MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT (CBFMA)

The Punang Christian Muslim Native Multi - Purpose Cooperative (PCMN-MPC) is registered to Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) on January 26, 2000 under CBFM Agreement No. RIV-PAL



The CBFMA has a total land area of one thousand four hundred eighty one and twenty five cents. (1,481.25) located in Barangay Punang Sofronio, Española, Palawan. Approximately 17.2 percent of the land cover remaining area of CBFMA while the other portion is awarded as Certificate of Land Ownership Award (CLOA) and already distributed to different individuals.

THE ASSOCIATION AND MEMEBERSHIP

The Punang Christian, Muslim Native Multi-Purpose Cooperative is an active organization which composed of 95 male and 70 female. On March 2018 the Cooperative was conducted meeting and reelect the new sets of officer. The following are names of the new sets Officers of the PO:

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

On June 7, 2022, CBFM Desk Officer Forester Laarni R. Bolido and Forest Ranger Jovencio P. Damaso scheduled meeting with the Officers of PCMN-MPC. The main objective of the meeting is to discuss and informed PO regarding the Conduct of activity on Organizational, Development Skills Enhancement for CBFM Peoples Organization other related CBFM issues and concern.

During the monitoring and assessment of CBFM, The PO complied some of their corresponding obligation as stipulated in the agreement. The portion of CBFM area was previously planted with Palm oil. At present, a secondary-growth forest is visible in the said area, it is because the PO didn't introduce any cultivation or improvements in the area due to lack of interest for a long period of time. Hence, different tree species re-generated in the area like lampong, Coconut, Gmelina, Apitong, Antipolo, Acacia and etc.

Aside from the above projects of the PO, the following activities were also undertaken to wit:

- Regular foot patrol within the tenured area including adjacent timberland areas to prevent and detect illegal activities
- Quarterly meeting conducted by the PO to immediate resolved issues and concerns.
- Development/maintenance of the individual claimed/ occupied areas by planting of forest trees, fruit trees and cash crops as source of livelihood

- Maintenance and harvesting of oil palm for delivery to processing plant.
- The DENR-CENRO is continuous providing technical assistance and monitoring of the projects

ISSUES AND CONCERNS

1. The officers admitted that they are not able to give their 100% assistance and dedication to the CBFM area due to other duties and functions they had attend to. The People's Organization observed that they no longer function with their duties and responsibilities. No more meetings conducted such as to discuss relevant matters on how to achieve their goals as it was stated in the CBFM agreement.
2. Some officers recounted of doing the project matters and responsibilities on their own and of not seeing much of each other. The established livelihood project in their area was not properly maintained by the PO after implementation due to non-cooperation.
3. The officers and members also claimed about the lack of financial support for the maintenance of their project implemented.
4. Several Certificate of Land Ownership Agreement (CLOA) were issued by Department of Agrarian Reform over the CBFMA area. The subject area is classified as Timberland.
5. Palm Oil Plantation within CBFM area. The portion of CBFM are planted with Palm Oil Plantation which is the one of the source of income of the People's organization

RECOMMENDATION

1. Reorganizing and empowering the People's Organization thru reorientation of terms and conditions of the agreement. Reiteration of the officers and members of their duties and responsibilities.
2. Training/Workshop to capacitate the officers and members of the existing ENR laws, rules and regulations and deputation as Deputized Environment and Natural Resources Officer (DENRO) of selected members of the people's organization.
3. Continuous recruitment of more members especially occupants/claimed within their tenured area
4. Preparation of detailed work plan for each officer to assist/guide them to function more effectively and efficiently.
5. Conduct of monthly meeting of officers and quarterly meetings of PO members to immediately address issues and concerns.
6. Formulation of a development plan for livelihood projects/programs to be submitted to other government agencies and financial institutions for possible funding.

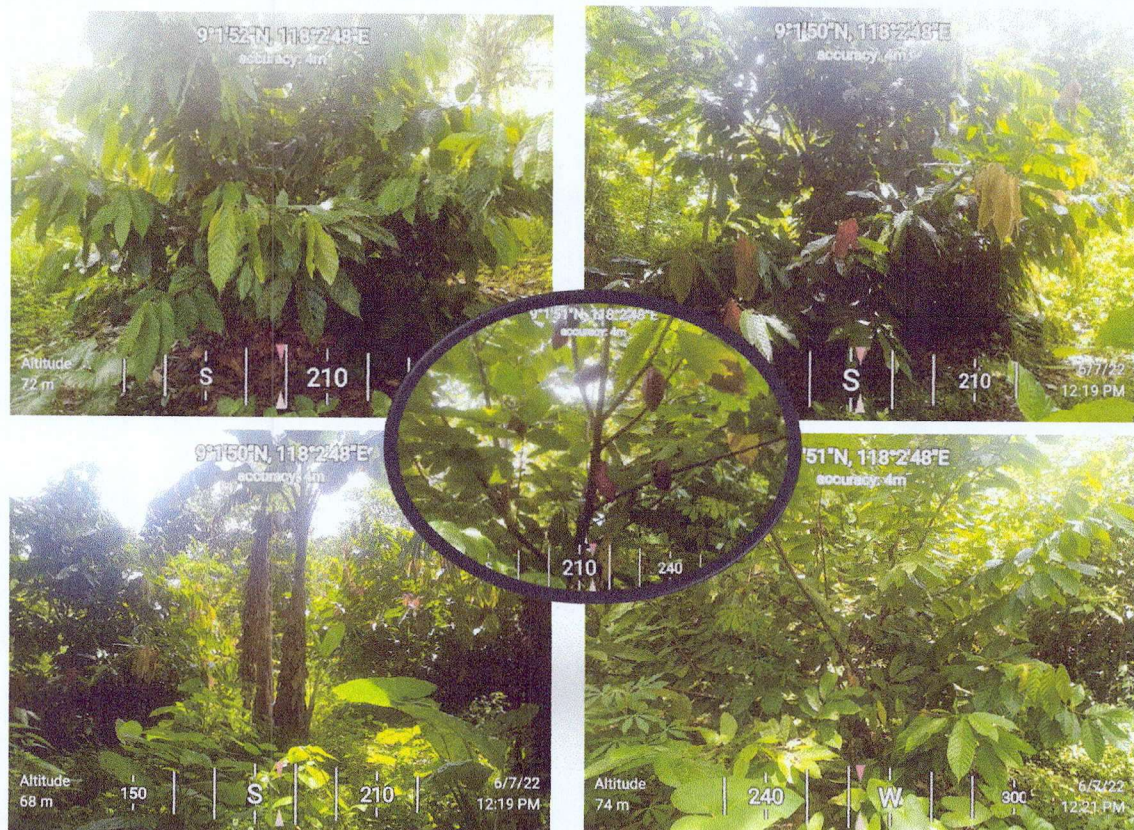
OBLIGATION OF PEOPLES ORGANIZATION

The CBFMA Holder shall:

- ❖ Immediately assume responsibility for protection of the entire forest lands within CBFMA area against illegal logging and other unauthorized extraction of forest products, slash-and burn agriculture (kaingin), forest and grassland fires, and other forms of forest destruction; and assist DENR in the prosecution of violators of forestry and environmental laws;
- ❖ Follow all duly-promulgated laws, rules and regulations pertinent to forest management;
- ❖ Prepare and implement CRMF, RUP and Annual Work Plan with assistance from DENR and LGU
- ❖ Formulate and implement benefit sharing schemes among its members; and;
- ❖ Pay the required forest charges and other fees.

PROJECT IMPLEMENTED WITHIN CBFM AREA

Year 2017, The Punang Christian Muslim Native Multi-Purpose Cooperative (PCMN-MPC) is one of the chosen Cooperative to be partner of DENR in the implementation of CBFM-Comprehensive Agrarian Reform-Program Beneficiaries Development (CARP-PBD) Project. The POs had established an Agro-forestry project (Narra, Rubber and Cacao) Intercropped with Banana (Saba) within 20 hectares target area with a total cost of Four Hundred Thirteen Thousand Four Hundred Pesos (Php. 413,400.00) located at Barangay Punang Sofronio Espanola, Palawan.

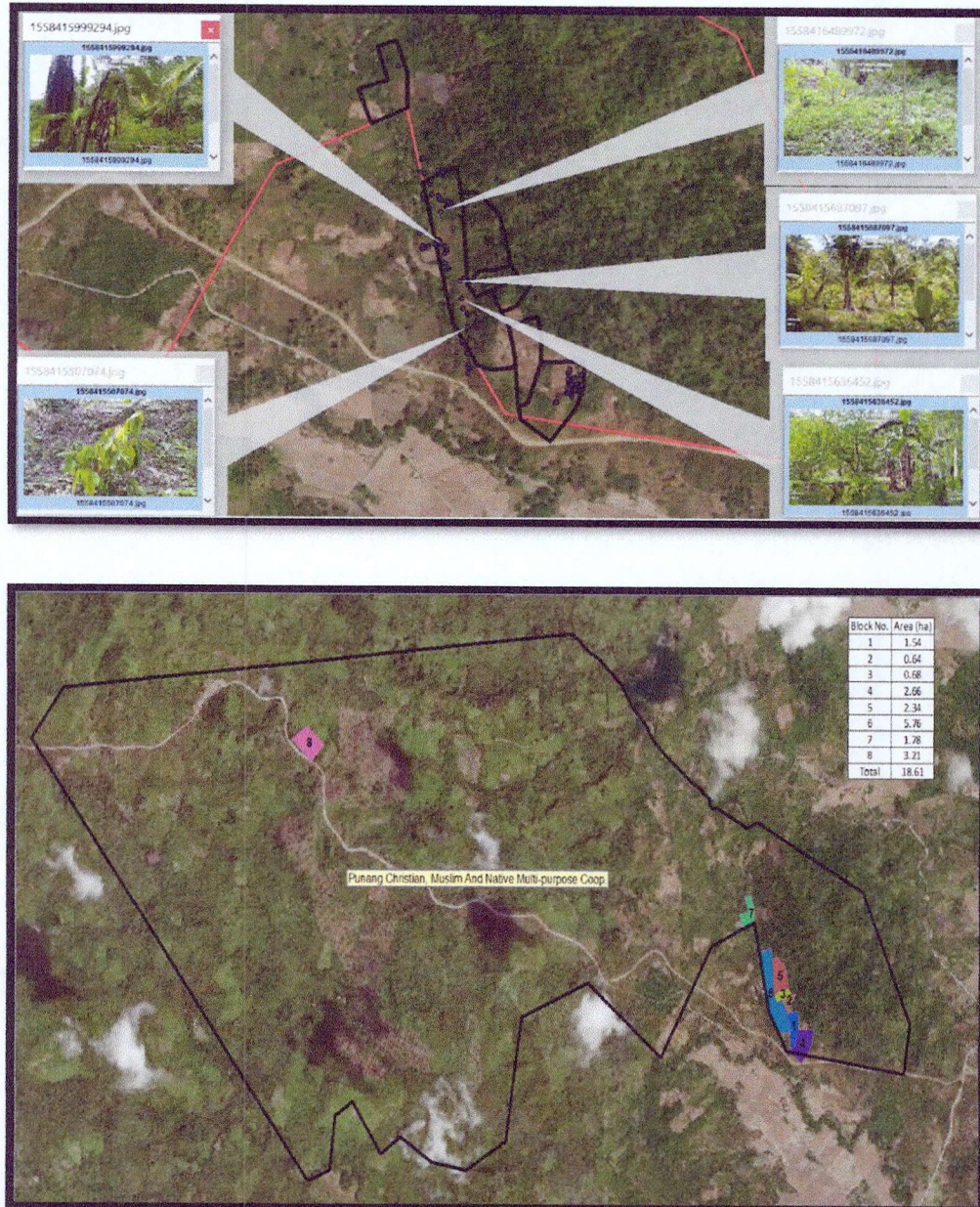

Currently, the PO holder's continuously conducted maintenance and protection of established CBFM-CARP project within the tenured area such as replanting, strip brushing and application of fertilizer activities within the planted areas. Some of Cacao planted were found healthy while the Banana is on the fruiting stage which indicates that the planted commodities are surviving because of continuous care provided by the PO members, while the planted Rubber and some cacao is died due to unshaded and direct from sunlight.

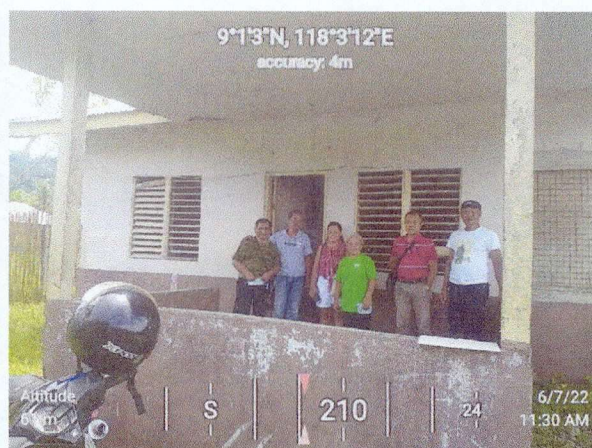


Map showing the 20 hectares CARP project within CBFM
