Coastal Clean-up at So. Tabuk, Brgy. Buenavista, Sablayan on May 6, 2022; 3.) Symposium/Lecture on the Celebration of Month in Occidental Mindoro State College- Sablayan Campus on May 13, 2022, attended by students and selected faculty staff which were discussed about Marine Ecosystem, present status, threats, and possible help to employ to conserve and protect the marine ecosystem; 4.) Operation Baklas of Election Tarpaulin on May 10, 2022 within MAPSA and Sablayan; 5.) Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp in Apo Reef Natural Park on May 26-27, 2022, participated by Sangguniang Kabataan in coastal barangays and officials of Bureau of Jail Management and Penology in the Municipality of Sablayan; lastly, 6.) Culmination Day of 2022 Month of the Ocean by conducting Coastal Clean-up cum SCUBASURA on May 31, 2022 in Free Beach Area, Sablayan, respectively. Likewise, the CENRO San Jose conducted series of activities of CEPA campaigns in partnership with the Task Force Cali-Kasan that was attended by different partners including the Fraternity Organizations, Municipal LGU, Barangay LGU, other government offices, ENR Ambassadors of Calintaan, Occidental Mindoro and also, PENRO Ernesto E. Tañada, DENR Task Force Tayo ang Kalikasan Executive Director/Assistant Director, SCIS - Maria Matilda A. Gaddi, SCIS DCD Chief - Adona P. San Diego and team.

In addition, on May 20, 2022, the PENRO Occidental Mindoro conducted a coastal clean-up activity in Barangay Lumangbayan, Abra de Ilog, Occidental Mindoro in coordination with the Local Government Unit of Abra de Ilog, which resulted to the collected thirty (30) sacks of non-biodegradable wastes. Prior to the clean-up, short program was held, wherein the Brgy. Captain of Lumangbayan expressed their willingness in participating to environmental activities and informed that there are volunteers from other organizations have regular clean-up activities within the said barangay. In addition, PENR Officer Ernesto E. Tañada explained the effect of the waste being washed in to the sea as it negatively affects the marine resources in the Verde Island Passage (VIP) which recognised as the "Center of the Center of Marine Biodiversity" and how proper solid waste management greatly contributes to its protection and conservation. This activity had a total of one hundred eighteen (118) participants were composed of barangay health workers, barangay police, barangay kagawad, Philippine Coast Guard and PENRO Personnel.

#### I. TITLE

ACTIVITY REPORT ON MARINE BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION CAMP IN APO REEF NATURAL PARK.

#### II. INTRODUCTION

In the Philippines, the month of May each year is celebrated as the *Month of the Ocean* (MOO). This is being conducted by virtue of Presidential Proclamation No. 57 issued in 1998 during the administration of former President Joseph Ejercito Estrada. This year, the theme of MOO is "*Protect and Restore Ecosystems and Biodiversity*" which is also listed as one of the Ocean Decade Challenges.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) is among the agencies mandated to conduct activities during the annual celebration of the Month of the Ocean. In accordance to this mandate, the DENR Community Environment and Natural Resources Office—Sablayan (CENRO-Sablayan) prepared a series of activity with the goal of increasing the engagement of locals towards the conservation marine ecosystems within its jurisdiction. This report focuses on the Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp which was facilitated by Apo Reef Natural Park—Protected Area Management Office (ARNP-PAMO) and participated by the youth leaders of Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro.

#### III. OBJECTIVES

This activity aimed to a.) provide youth leaders a background on marine ecosystems and, b.) orient them on existing citizen science initiatives that they can participate in.

#### IV. PARTICIPANTS

The Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp at Apo Reef Natural Park was participated by members of the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) in coastal barangays of Sablayan and Bureau of Jail Managament and Penology (BJMP) officials. It was facilitated by personnel from ARNP-PAMO and Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) of Sablayan.

#### V. HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITIES

The Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp was held at Apo Reef Natural Park, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro from May 27 to 28, 2022. The program was opened by Ms. Anna Ritchelle D. Nicanor, Special Collecting and Disbursing Officer of ARNP-PAMO. She oriented the participants on the goals and objectives of the Camp and ran through the schedule of activities. In addition to these, she discussed the code of conduct which the participants were expected to follow. Ms. Hugo Salvador, CMEMP Extension Officer of ARNP-PAMO, delivered a lecture on marine ecosystems afterwards.

Ms. Salvador started her presentation by providing a brief background on three marine ecosystems: mangrove forests, seagrass meadows, and coral reefs. All of which are present in Sablayan and are well-known among the locals. She highlighted the state of these ecosystems both globally and locally, providing data from best-available science, and the threats that they face. The threats tackled were climate change (primarily sea temperature rise and ocean acidification), Crown-of Thorns Starfish (CoTS) outbreaks, land reclamation, overfishing and destructive fishing practices, illegal poaching, and marine pollution. Ms. Salvador closed her lecture by enumerating ways how the youth and other citizens of Sablayan may help in the conservation of the marine ecosystems discussed. Here, she presented existing citizen science initiatives that the participants may contribute to including the Mindoro Citizen Scientists, Mindoro Biodiversity Wildlife Watch, and Philippine Coral Bleaching Watch. These initiatives will be further discussed later in the day.

Mr. Joselito A. Tiongson, Park Maintenance Foreman of MENRO Sablayan, was the last speaker of the morning. He introduced the locally-managed Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) in Sablayan to the participants and provided them information on the management zoning that is being implemented in each MPA. Furthermore, Mr. Tiongson discussed the results of their recent coral reef assessments using Reef Check, highlighting the decrease in coral cover and fish abundance observed in some MPAs this year.

In the afternoon, Ms. Salvador presented the process of contributing to citizen science initiatives, focusing on the initiatives of PCBW and Mindoro Biodiversity Conservation Foundation Incorporated (MBCFI). She ran through the Bleaching Report Form which the participants may easily access online and the rules to be followed when joining Mindoro Biodiversity Wildlife Watch and Mindoro Citizen Scientists. At around 3:00 PM, the participants together with ARNP-PAMO personnel proceeded simulate the conduct of a basic coral bleaching and CoTS surveillance. The participants were towed from Ego Wall to Aladin while in snorkeling gear. Afterwards, they discussed their observations with the facilitators. Some participants recorded minimal bleaching (>20% of coral colonies are bleaching) and all of them did not record individuals of CoTS.

After the simulation activity, certificates were awarded to each of the participants who attended the Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp. The awarding was led by Ms. Anna Ritchelle D. Nicanor and MENR Officer, Mr. Robert P. Duquil. Each participant also received a token from ARNP-PAMO. MENRO Duquil then delivered his closing remarks, thanking the participants for their attendance and encouraging them to use what they have learned to help conserve the marine ecosystems in Sablayan.

The participants and facilitators rose early the following morning to conduct a coastal clean-up activity and daytime nesting beach survey along the sandy beach in Apo Island, Apo Reef Natural Park. Different marine litter types were collected during the coastal clean-up activity including single-use plastic and derelict fishing gears (DFGs). Meanwhile, there were no fresh sea turtle tracks recorded during the day. Ms. Salvador resorted to using old tracks to discuss the nesting habit of green turtles (*Chelonia mydas*) and hawksbill turtles (*Eretmochelys imbricata*) and method used acquire data from the tracks left by nesting sea turtles. After these activities, everyone had their breakfast and headed back to mainland Sablayan.

#### VI. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The topics covered in the Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp were relevent to the participants of the event. The lecturers were successful in delivering the presentations to a non-science audience. This was evidenced by the active participation of the SK members and BJMP officials

It is recommended for future Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camps to have a larger number of participants from the youth and longer duration. Doing such will improve the learning outcomes of the activity but at the same time, entail the need to procure additional survey equipment such as snorkeling gears.



- For Mangrove Forest, 0.21% average lost annually globally. In the Philippines 0.5% lost due to deforestation from 2000-2012.
- For sea grass, according to data from 1989-2009, 29% were lost and as for this
  day, rough estimate it could only be around 50% were only remains or even less.
- For coral reefs, study shows on year 2021, 50% were lost and fish catch decreased to 60% showcasing great impact on the livelihood of fisherfolks.

#### Defined Threats to Marine Ecosystems

- Climate change can cause high temperature on sea surface turning to acidic ocean resulting to coral bleaching. Also played video (titled "chasing coral") showing coral bleaching due to climate changes.
- Land reclamation/land-use Change as for example was the construction of San Miguel Aerotropolis on mangrove forest in Taliptip wherein greatly affect and caused destruction of the mangrove forest as well as eliminating the resting site for the endangered black face spoon bill. Another example mentioned was the Chinese reclamation site at Kagitingan Reef and Zamora reef.
- Overfishing and destructive fishing practices particularly on the use of cyanide fishing and bottom trawling.
- Illegal poaching, cited example was poaching of hawksbill turtle for jewelry and accessories.
- Marine pollution or through the single use of plastics throwed to the ocean
  causing pollution resulting to fish kill and spread of microplastics pollutions
  which was according to study were now also transferred to human blood. He
  stressed out that it is true that what we throw to the nature will eventually come
  back to us.
- Lastly, he discussed positive ways on how the student council can help in conserving and protecting the environment by being a citizen scientist/wildlife watcher of Mindoro Wildlife Watch (by sending information on illegal poaching) and Mindoro Biodiversity Citizens Scientist (by sending photos, time, location and status upon encountered of Mindoro's wildlife species for their data base update and conservation). ## REPORT OF THE CEPA CAMPAIGNS CONDUCTED DURING THE MONTH OF THE OCEAN CELEBRATION 2022 AT CALINTAAN, OCCIDENTAL MINDORO

In celebrating Month of the Ocean with the theme, "Protect and Restore Ecosystems and Biodiversity; The Science We Need, for the Ocean We Want", this Office in partnership with the Task Force Cali-Kasan conducted series of activities that was attended by different partners including the Fraternity Organizations, Municipal LGU, Barangay LGU, other government offices and the ENR Ambassadors of Calintaan, Occidental Mindoro.

The celebration was also participated by PENRO Ernesto E. Tañada, the DENR Task Force Tayo ang Kalikasan Executive Director/ Assistant Director, SCIS - Maria Matilda A. Gaddi, SCIS-DCD Chief- Adona P. San Diego and team.

#### MAY 18, 2022 - Meeting with Lecture

In preparation for the continuous Mangrove rehabilitation and expansion project at Sitio Marsumbol, Brgy. New Dagupan, Calintaan, Occidental Mindoro, TF Cali-Kasan held a meeting with the New Dagupan Barangay Officials, Bantay Dagat members and the community surrounding Marsumbol River on May 18, 2022.

The meeting took place to inform the residents and explain the on-going ENR activities within the area. Likewise, it served as the venue to discuss the importance of the activities such as Mangrove planting, and its maintenance and protection to the safety of the community as well as their livelihood.

CENRO Efren L. delos Reyes discussed Mangroves and its importance together with the related policies being implemented. Also, he explained the impact of the activities in Marsumbol River to Marsumbol Marine Protected Area (MPA) and its resources.

As part of the continuous endeavor of Task Force Cali-Kasan to engage the youth sector, a small group discussion was held at So. Wawa, Brgy. Iriron, Calintaan. The meeting was initiated by SK Federation President and ENR Ambassador Giebon L. Quiros immediately after the Seventh Day Adventist youth reached out and asked to join the Mangrove conservation and protection programs in Calintaan.

MENRO Delmer B. Garingalo and CENRO Efren L. delos Reyes attended the meeting and conferred the different programs that the Task Force have been implementing. Also, a brief discussion on the importance of Mangrove to the community and the environment took place. It was also emphasized that the programs executed in Calintaan are heading for sustainability and stability.

The ENR Ambassadors also attended the meeting and shared their contribution in protecting and maintaining the Mangrove rehabilitated area in So. Wawa. The young Adventists expressed their willingness and committed themselves into being part of the ENR projects and programs within their Municipality.

#### MAY 21, 2022 - Meeting with Lecture and Clean-up drive

Through the active involvement of the ENR Ambassadors of Brgy. Iriron, Calintaan, youth sectors from other Barangays had begun to appreciate the environmental activities conducted and reached out to be part of these interventions. Thus, another meeting was held at So. Wawa that was facilitated to cater the newly enlisted ENR Ambassadors from Brgy. Concepcion, Calintaan.

The meeting was done to further explain the role of ENR Ambassadors in the implementation of ENR projects in the municipality. The existing rehabilitation in So. Wawa Mangrove area was also presented during the meeting. The ENR Ambassadors shared their actual activities and contributions in the protection and maintenance of the area. Mangrove ecosystem, its importance and regeneration process was briefly discussed during the on-site meeting. Afterwards, a clean-up activity was done while explaining the importance of proper solid waste management in the protection of the coastal and marine resources and habitats.

#### MAY 25, 2022 - Bamboo and Bitaog (Calophyllum inophyllum) planting

Emphasizing the Task Force Cali-Kasan's ridge-to-reef conservation and protection approach in implementing its projects and activities, phase three (3) of the Bamboolution

project was conducted at the adopted Anahawin River in the celebration of the Month of the Ocean 2022. A total of 150 bamboo culm of *Kawayang Tinik* was planted during the event that was participated by DENR Task Force Tayo ang Kalikasan Executive Director/ Assistant Director, SCIS - Maria Matilda A. Gaddi, SCIS-DCD Chief- Adona P. San Diego and team. Barangay New Dagupan Officials together with other National and Local government offices also joined the activity.

During the program, CENRO Efren L. delos Reyes reiterated that the protection of the River systems must be consistent to compliment the coastal protection and conservation efforts made in consideration with the connectivity and interdependence of both ecosystems.

Right after the activity, bamboos planted during World Water Day celebration last March 22, 2022 were visited as part of the TF Cali-Kasan's regular monitoring and maintenance and protection of the area.

Late in the afternoon, Bitaog tree planting took place at So. Wawa that was participated by Task Force Cali-Kasan, Bantay Dagat of Iriron and Barangay Officials. Planting of 100 seedlings of Bitaog tree was conducted as a kick-off activity to highlighting the beginning of the Beach Forest establishment project of the Task Force along the 18-kilometer coastal area in Calintaan.

Bitaog (*Calophyllum inuphyllum*) is an evergreen tree that is best for beach forest establishment. The above-cited project aims to protect the coastal and marine resources and habitat as well as the communities residing near the coastal areas. TF Cali-Kasan implements beach forest establishment specifically Bitaog planting to also prevent further construction of permanent structures within the easement/salvage zones in coastal barangays of Calintaan.

#### MAY 26, 2022 - Mangrove Planting

Mangrove planting was conducted at So. Marsumbol, Brgy. New Dagupan in consonance with the Month of the Ocean Celebration and as a continuation of Mangrove expansion project within the area. The Task Force continued the enrichment planting of 1,000 propagules of Bakhaw Bato (*Rhizophora stylosa*) that was participated by different Offices, Fraternity partners and the Task Force Tayo ang Kalikasan.

Simultaneously happening during the celebration were clean-up drive as part of the maintenance and protection of the previously planted Mangroves, and planting of 100 Bitaog tree seedlings in the coastal area of Marsumbol Marine Protected Area.
