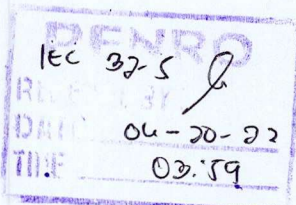

## IV. HIGHLIGHTS



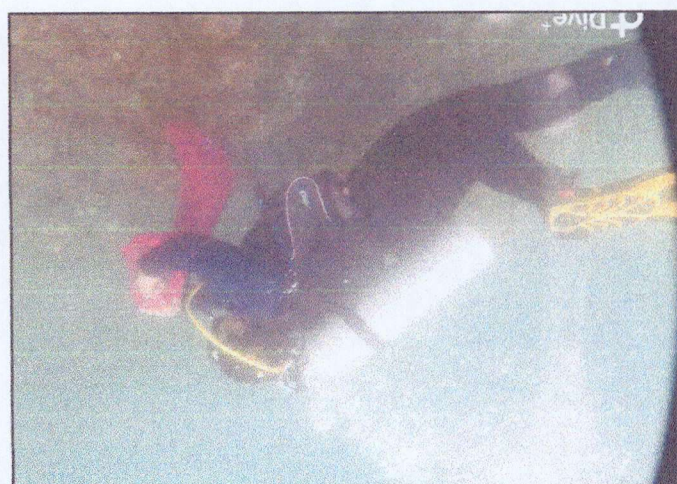



## I. TITLE

### ACTIVITY REPORT ON MARINE BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION CAMP IN APO REEF NATURAL PARK.

## II. INTRODUCTION

In the Philippines, the month of May each year is celebrated as the *Month of the Ocean* (MOO). This is being conducted by virtue of Presidential Proclamation No. 57 issued in 1998 during the administration of former President Joseph Ejercito Estrada. This year, the theme of MOO is "*Protect and Restore Ecosystems and Biodiversity*" which is also listed as one of the Ocean Decade Challenges.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) is among the agencies mandated to conduct activities during the annual celebration of the Month of the Ocean. In accordance to this mandate, the DENR Community Environment and Natural Resources Office – Sablayan (CENRO-Sablayan) prepared a series of activity with the goal of increasing the engagement of locals towards the conservation marine ecosystems within its jurisdiction. This report focuses on the Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp which was facilitated by Apo Reef Natural Park – Protected Area Management Office (ARNP-PAMO) and participated by the youth leaders of Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro.

## III. OBJECTIVES

This activity aimed to a.) provide youth leaders a background on marine ecosystems and, b.) orient them on existing citizen science initiatives that they can participate in.

## IV. PARTICIPANTS

The Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp at Apo Reef Natural Park was participated by members of the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) in coastal barangays of Sablayan and Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) officials. It was facilitated by personnel from ARNP-PAMO and Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) of Sablayan.

## V. HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITIES

The Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp was held at Apo Reef Natural Park, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro from May 27 to 28, 2022. The program was opened by Ms. Anna Ritchelle D. Nicanor, Special Collecting and Disbursing Officer of ARNP-PAMO. She oriented the participants on the goals and objectives of the Camp and ran through the schedule of activities. In addition to these, she discussed the code of conduct which the participants were expected to follow. Ms. Hugo Salvador, CMEMP Extension Officer of ARNP-PAMO, delivered a lecture on marine ecosystems afterwards.



Ms. Salvador started her presentation by providing a brief background on three marine ecosystems: mangrove forests, seagrass meadows, and coral reefs. All of which are present in Sablayan and are well-known among the locals. She highlighted the state of these ecosystems both globally and locally, providing data from best-available science, and the threats that they face. The threats tackled were climate change (primarily sea temperature rise and ocean acidification), Crown-of Thorns Starfish (CoTS) outbreaks, land reclamation, overfishing and destructive fishing practices, illegal poaching, and marine pollution. Ms. Salvador closed her lecture by enumerating ways how the youth and other citizens of Sablayan may help in the conservation of the marine ecosystems discussed. Here, she presented existing citizen science initiatives that the participants may contribute to including the Mindoro Citizen Scientists, Mindoro Biodiversity Wildlife Watch, and Philippine Coral Bleaching Watch. These initiatives will be further discussed later in the day.

Mr. Joselito A. Tiongson, Park Maintenance Foreman of MENRO Sablayan, was the last speaker of the morning. He introduced the locally-managed Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) in Sablayan to the participants and provided them information on the management zoning that is being implemented in each MPA. Furthermore, Mr. Tiongson discussed the results of their recent coral reef assessments using Reef Check, highlighting the decrease in coral cover and fish abundance observed in some MPAs this year.

In the afternoon, Ms. Salvador presented the process of contributing to citizen science initiatives, focusing on the initiatives of PCBW and Mindoro Biodiversity Conservation Foundation Incorporated (MBCFI). She ran through the Bleaching Report Form which the participants may easily access online and the rules to be followed when joining Mindoro Biodiversity Wildlife Watch and Mindoro Citizen Scientists. At around 3:00 PM, the participants together with ARNP-PAMO personnel proceeded simulate the conduct of a basic coral bleaching and CoTS surveillance. The participants were towed from Ego Wall to Aladin while in snorkeling gear. Afterwards, they discussed their observations with the facilitators. Some participants recorded minimal bleaching (>20% of coral colonies are bleaching) and all of them did not record individuals of CoTS.

After the simulation activity, certificates were awarded to each of the participants who attended the Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp. The awarding was led by Ms. Anna Ritchelle D. Nicanor and MENR Officer, Mr. Robert P. Duquil. Each participant also received a token from ARNP-PAMO. MENRO Duquil then delivered his closing remarks, thanking the participants for their attendance and encouraging them to use what they have learned to help conserve the marine ecosystems in Sablayan.

The participants and facilitators rose early the following morning to conduct a coastal clean-up activity and daytime nesting beach survey along the sandy beach in Apo Island, Apo Reef Natural Park. Different marine litter types were collected during the coastal clean-up activity including single-use plastic and derelict fishing gears (DFGs). Meanwhile, there were no fresh sea turtle tracks recorded during the day. Ms. Salvador resorted to using old tracks to discuss the nesting habit of green turtles (*Chelonia mydas*) and hawksbill turtles (*Eretmochelys imbricata*) and method used acquire data from the tracks left by nesting sea turtles. After these activities, everyone had their breakfast and headed back to mainland Sablayan.



## VI. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The topics covered in the Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camp were relevant to the participants of the event. The lecturers were successful in delivering the presentations to a non-science audience. This was evidenced by the active participation of the SK members and BJMP officials


It is recommended for future Marine Biodiversity Conservation Camps to have a larger number of participants from the youth and longer duration. Doing such will improve the learning outcomes of the activity but at the same time, entail the need to procure additional survey equipment such as snorkeling gears.



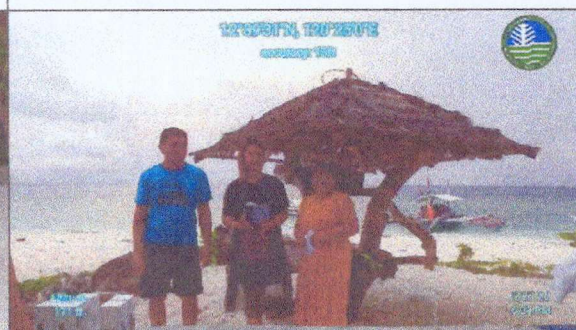

In relation to Memorandum dated April 25, 2022 from the DENR Regional Office, the DENR CENRO Sablayan joined the conduct of "OPLAN BAKLAS" to intensify the promotion of an environmentally conscious national election campaign.

Personnel from DENR-CENRO Sablayan were able to remove illegal elections paraphernalia posted on trees and tarpaulins that did not comply with the prescribed rules of COMELEC prior and after the May Election. A total of 736 pieces of tarpaulins were removed by the Sablayan and MAPSA personnel. Likewise, personnel from Mount Calavite Wildlife Sanctuary-Protected Area Management Office (MCWS-PAMO) were able to removed 10.1 kilos of illegal election paraphernalia.


In relation to Memorandum dated April 25, 2022 from the DENR Regional Office, the DENR CENRO Sablayan joined the conduct of "OPLAN BAKLAS" to intensify the promotion of an environmentally conscious national election campaign.

On March 25, 2022, prior to the upcoming May election, the DENR-CENRO Sablayan together with other government agencies joined the COMELEC Oplan Baklas. This activity aims to remove illegal elections paraphernalia like tarpaulins posted on trees and tarpaulins that did not comply with the prescribed size of the COMELEC.

On May 10, 2022, after the election, the EMS staff of CENRO Sablayan conducted Oplan Baklas within their jurisdiction. The team removed a total of 736 tarpaulins along the public road and national highway. The tarpaulins were stocked at CENRO Sablayan Coordinating Office, Mamburao and Yapang Central Monitoring Station, Batong-Buhay, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro.

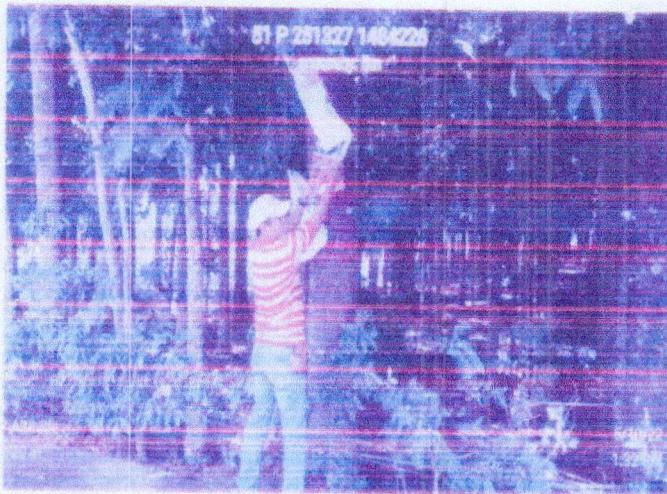

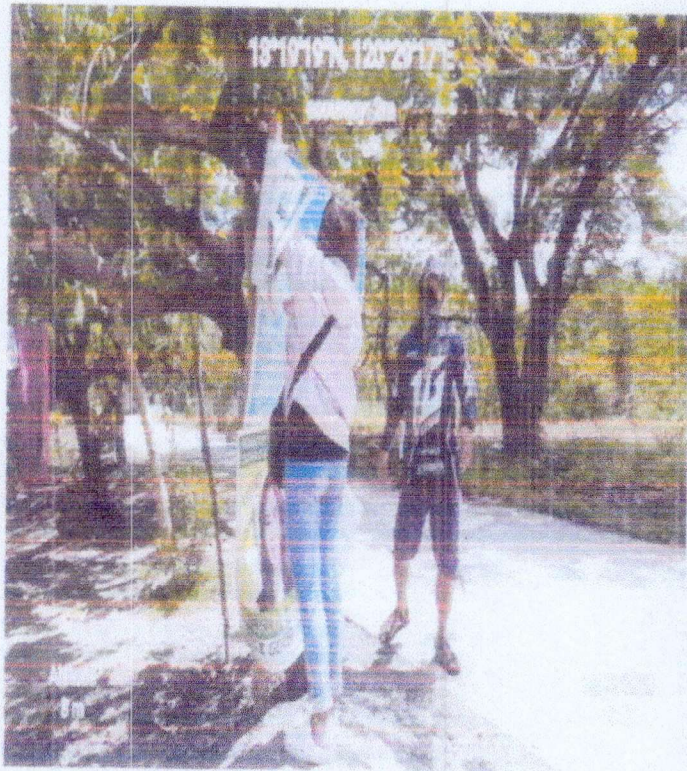

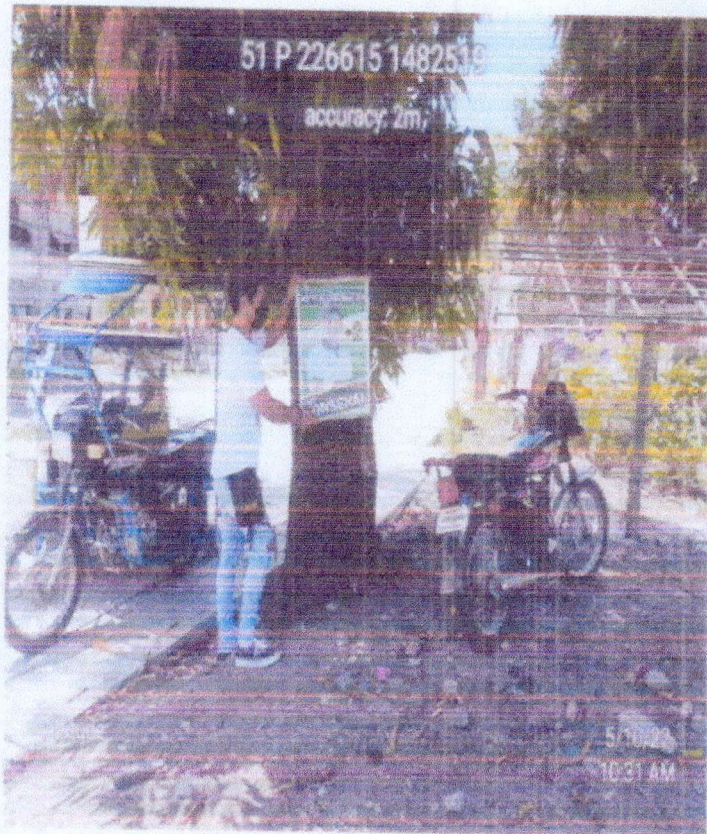

15 Ritchelle Nicanor, For. I April Amores and GAD Staff Ofhel Martin. She also mentioned that  
16 the said CEPA activity was an effort of DENR office in expressing support and unity to the  
17 celebration of Month of the Ocean 2022.

18 For a welcome remarks, OMSC Campus Director Julie Urieta Lopez mentioned that they are  
19 grateful that OMSC students were given the opportunity to be a recipient of the said  
20 information drive relative to conserving and protecting environment, wherein they can employ  
21 their skills and knowledge as a youth to be an asset of the present generation, to promote and  
22 spread environmental concern and awareness.

23 It was followed by an introduction of the first resource speaker who was a graduate of UP LOS  
24 Banos Laguna and the current CMEMP Officer of APO Reef Natural Park DENR CENRO  
25 Sablayan, Mr. Hugo Ignacio Salvador.

26  
27 **II. DISCUSSION**

28  
29 The first speaker Mr. Hugo Ignacio Salvador discussed about Marine Ecosystem,  
30 present status, threats and the possible help to employ to conserve and protect the  
31 marine ecosystem as follows:

- 32  
33 • Briefly discussed that Month of the Ocean was celebrated thru the verge of  
34 Presidential Proclamation No. 57, s. 1998 every month of May because it was  
35 the month of peak fishing season.

36  
37 **Defined Three types of Marine Ecosystem**

- 38  
39 • First was the Mangrove forest (bakawan) characterized by trees or shrubs that  
40 can live on loose and wet soil and salt water that serves as nursery for small  
41 fishes. Presented a video showing how Bakawan protect coast from storms and  
42 tsunamis.



- Next was sea grass meadows (lusayan) characterized by underwater plants who have leaves, flowers, seeds and roots keeping the water clear, serves as food for marine animals and provide home to small fishes.
- Then Coral reefs (bahura) which composed of colonies of thousand animals or coral polyps. Played videos showing the importance and function of coral reefs.

#### **Stated current status of Marine Ecosystems**

- For Mangrove Forest, 0.21% average lost annually globally. In the Philippines 0.5% lost due to deforestation from 2000-2012
- For sea grass, according to data from 1989-2009, 29% were lost and as for this day, rough estimate it could only be around 50% were only remains or even less.
- For coral reefs, study shows on year 2021, 50% were lost and fish catch decreased to 60% showcasing great impact on the livelihood of fisherfolks.

#### **Defined Threats to Marine Ecosystems**

- Climate change can cause high temperature on sea surface turning to acidic ocean resulting to coral bleaching. Also played video (titled "chasing coral") showing coral bleaching due to climate changes.
- Land reclamation/land-use Change as for example was the construction of San Miguel Aerotropolis on mangrove forest in Talipitip wherein greatly affect and caused destruction of the mangrove forest as well as eliminating the resting site for the endangered black face spoon bill. Another example mentioned was the Chinese reclamation site at Kagitingan Reef and Zamora reef.
- Overfishing and destructive fishing practices particularly on the use of cyanide fishing and bottom trawling.
- Illegal poaching, cited example was poaching of hawksbill turtle for jewelry and accessories.
- Marine pollution or through the single use of plastics throwed to the ocean causing pollution resulting to fish kill and spread of microplastics pollutions which was according to study were now also transferred to human blood. He stressed out that it is true that what we throw to the nature will eventually come back to us.
- Lastly, he discussed positive ways on how the student council can help in conserving and protecting the environment by being a citizen scientist/wildlife watcher of Mindoro Wildlife Watch (by sending information on illegal poaching) and Mindoro Biodiversity Citizens Scientist (by sending photos, time, location and status upon encountered of Mindoro's wildlife species for their data base update and conservation). Can also send photos of bleaching corals and the the presence of TAM-AG or the crowned thorned starfish to Coral Bleaching Watch. He also mentioned that students can also participate on online campaign supporting environment conservation, but what matters most was supporting candidates who has platform for environmental advocacy. He ended his discussion by stressing out that everyone can make an effort but only



government has the power to do so much to change and there is only little time left to save our planet so everyone are encouraged to act very quickly.

To proceed more and to discuss Solid Waste Management Practices, Ms. Serna Urieta introduced the next speaker who was a graduate of Environmental Science from Cavite State University, Special Collecting and Disbursing Officer and Pollution Control Officer of Apo Reef Natural Park-PAMO, Ms. Anna Ritchelle Nicanor.

Ms. Nicanor played a video presentation tackling about Ecological Management Practices in School. The video presented the DENR search for country's most sustainable eco-friendly school. As well as imparting the essence of the search for the institutionalized school based solid waste management program which to instill to the students the values and best practices to help accomplish the national goal of zero waste. The video also presented tips and ideas on how to avoid types of waste generated in schools most especially the paper. One of the high lights of the video was the presentation of collaboration between the National Solid Waste Commission and the Department of Education through the National Ecosavers Program wherein all Elementary and High Schools in Manila participated in the said activity. Students will bring different types of recyclable trash from their home and they will earn points on their pass book which points can be exchange to school item products or cash.

She also discussed different major types of waste generated in schools such as food waste, paper plates, disposable spoon and fork, plastic bottles/container, plastic wrappers, garden debris face mask and paper.

She also mentioned hurdles encountered upon implementation of solid waste management in school, such as lack of awareness, infrastructures, technology, manpower, budget, planning and overall management.

To counterpart such issues, she suggested some pointers for the school youth leaders to do, such as follows:

- Aligning school policies, plans and programs on how to manage the solid waste of school.
- Identification of possible Ecological Solid Waste Management Strategy with the assistance from the LGU thru its MENRO.
- Spreading relative awareness through including in some subjects/forum discussion and activities and involvement in the like CEPA activity by the teachers and students.
- Initiative of the school administrator to implement policy such as class monitoring in the proper waste segregation and disposal.
- Providing proper infrastructures, right disposal techniques as well as regulations and implementation of such.



134 She ended her discussion by commending the idealistic traits of the present youth  
135 and emphasized that the power of awareness and concern will result to progress  
136 little by little and then soon materialized.

137  
138 As for the celebration of Biodiversity Day on May 22, 2022, Ms Serna Urieta  
139 introduced the last speaker who is a Forester by profession, graduated from Don  
140 Mariano Marcos Memorial University North La Union Campus, and the current  
141 Chief of Regulation and Permitting Section, Forester I April Amores-Castro.

142  
143 Since biodiversity is a complex topic, For. Amores limited her discussion to the  
144 Province of Occidental Mindoro as the biodiversity hotspot, a home of 1/3  
145 endemic animals in the Philippines and a homeland for eight (8) Mangyan tribes.

146  
147 Occidental Mindoro's topography and climate was discussed. She also  
148 differentiated two types of habitat in Occidental Mindoro such as Aquatic  
149 (composed of coral reef ecosystem, mangrove ecosystem, sea grass ecosystem  
150 and estuarine) and the terrestrial habitat which composed of forest ecosystem  
151 and grassland. She also classified different types of forest as beach forest,  
152 lowland forest, mountain forest and pine forest.


153  
154 Examples of endemic species of Mindoro island was also cited such as Mindoro  
155 Imperial pigeon, Mindoro Bleeding Heart, Mindoro Hornbill, Mindoro Slim  
156 Faced Fruit Bat and the Tamaraw.

157  
158 She also cited the two most important protected areas in Sablayan which were  
159 the Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park, as the primary habitat of Tamaraw and Apo  
160 Reef Natural Park, as a fish sanctuary and "under no take zone policy". She also  
161 discussed reasons behind the decreasing numbers of Tamaraw and the response  
162 of the government to this issue.

163  
164 To end the activity, Ms. Serna Urieta emphasized the importance of conserving  
165 and protecting the environment for the use of the future generation as well as  
166 gratefully appreciating the cooperation and warm support of the school  
167 administration, as well as the students participation in this kind of activities and  
168 endeavor.
