


# ABOUT UN WORLD OCEANS DAY

# (<u>Draft</u>) <u>Concept Note</u> Celebration of Coral Triangle Day, 9th June 2022 "Sustaining the Coral Triangle Ecosystems through Blue Economy."

#### Context

The Coral Triangle Day, which is celebrated every 9<sup>th</sup> of June, is an annual open-sourced event that brings together individuals, organizations, and establishments on one special day of the year to shed light on ocean conservation and the numerous ways to protect and conserve the Coral Triangle through Blue Economy.

The CTI-CFF and the Regional Secretariat together with its Strategic Partners share UN's view that 'much more needs to be done to reverse the cycle of decline in ocean health and create improved conditions for the sustainable usage and development of the ocean, seas and coasts.'

As such, CTI-CFF through the CT Day celebration supports and joins UN's initiative on Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development 2021-2030, and in alignment with the <u>UN World Ocean's Day on the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 2022 themed: Revitalization: Collective Action for the Ocean.</u> The June 9 CT Day this year is particularly focused on the importance of Sustaining the Coral Triangle Ecosystem through Blue Economy.

CTI-CFF shall highlight innovations and actions being undertaken by each member country and the partners towards attaining a healthy and sustainable Coral Triangle. Efforts of organizations, institutions, groups, communities, and individuals shall be recognized and promoted to herald a regional, national, and local movement that protects, manages, and improves the health of the marine ecosystems and to strengthen economic conditions of coastal communities through blue economy.

The 2022 Coral Triangle Celebration will build upon:

- The initiatives and/or accomplishments of CT6 at the regional, national and local levels to address issues of climate change, overfishing, illegal and destructive fishing, marine and manmade pollution and natural disasters.
- The initiatives/activities of Strategic Partners in collaboration with various groups and stakeholders that are creating an impact on the ground using innovations.
- The national and/or regional plan of actions of the CTI-CFF.

### Objectives

The objective of the 2022 Coral Triangle Day aims to highlight the importance of Sustainability of the Coral Triangle Ecosystem through Blue Economy. It will highlight innovative solutions/actions being undertaken at the regional, national, and local levels by organization, institutions, groups, communities, and individuals who are already involved in effort towards the promotion and establishment of blue economy and initiatives.

### Specifically,

 To promote the Coral Triangle Ecosystem as one of the most valuable resources in the region benefiting millions of people living in the coastal communities and beyond.

- 2. To promote the importance of sustainability of activities/projects of the CT6 countries towards attaining a healthy Coral Triangle ecosystem.
- 3. To highlight/promote the innovative actions being undertaken by organizations, groups, communities, and individuals at the regional, national, and local levels to address issues faced and threatening the Coral Triangle through Blue Economy.
