Please be informed that in compliance to memorandum thru channel from the DENR MIMAROPA Regional Executive Director dated April 26, 2022 which pertain to the "Submission of Mt. Mantalingahan Protected Landscape (MMPL) Management Plan 2021-2030 (RDATS No. P-2022-79866)", the staff of Mt. Mantalingahan Protected Landscape (MMPL) Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) facilitated the meeting of Special Technical Working Group (TWG) for MMPL PAMB last May 17 to 18, 2022 at Training Hall, DENR-PENR Office, Sta. Monica Puerto Princesa City, Palawan.

The PAMO has selected members from different working committees of the PAMB and created the Special Technical Working Group (TWG) for the revision of the MMPL PAMP 2021-2030 and Manual of Operations. The members are selected based from their direct involvement in the development of the subject and their active participation during PAMB meetings and collaboration in the implementation of MMPL plans and programs.

PASu Gonzaga had first presented to the Special TWG the instruction from the Office of BMB and Regional Executive Director relative to the revision of MMPL PAMP and Manual of Operations giving emphasis on the result of the review of BMB office. Based on their comments and suggestions the group properly discussed and provided needed data and information per item as enumerated in the checklist and there are some data/information will be shared from other TWG member to complete the requirements which they committed to submit, soonest.

Additionally, other agenda such as update on the nomination dossier for the inclusion of MMPL to the UNSECO World Heritage Sites was also discussed during the meeting. It was delivered by Ms. Jeanne T. Tabangay Managing Director for Palawan of Conservation International (CI) - Philippines. It was explained that the primary issue in the development of the dossier was the zoning map of MMPL. Under RA 7586 as amended by RA 11038 or ENIPAS Act of 2018, a protected area is categorized into two zones which is the core zone and multiple use zone, on the other hand, Palawan is also governed by RA 7611 or the SEP law and having Environmental Critical Areas Network or ECAN as its policy guide whereas included is the process of delineating and marking boundaries of different zones (Core zone, Restricted use zone, Controlled and Traditional

use zone). It has transpired during the discussion that elaboration on the details of MMPL Universal Value, additional input in section ie and section if of the dossier and clarification of zones in MMPL and clarification in the zone of MMPL be further discussed among PAMB members specially between DENR and PCSDS.

Attached are pictures taken, attendance sheet during the meeting and tables below to elaborate what has transpired particularly the decisions made by the TWG members during the workshop, to wit:

 Table 1: "PAMP 2021-2030 revision based from Protected Area Management Plan Assessment Checklist from DENR Regional Office of MIMAROPA"; and

2. Table 2: "PAMB Manual of Operation 2021-2030".

In connection to the instruction from the Regional Executive Director regarding the inclusion of results from High Conservation Value Assessment (HCVA) and other tools of USAID-funded project Sustainable Intervention for Biodiversity and Landscape (SIBOL), the PAMO is unable to include such information because the HCVA will commenced next year 2023 based from SIBOL plans and programs for MMPL.

Moreover, comments and suggestions made by the TWG members are subjected for consolidation, further review, evaluation and final adaptation of revised PAMP and manual of operation. The latter shall be presented to the PAMB on the next PAMB en banc meeting for review and adaptation/approval.
