



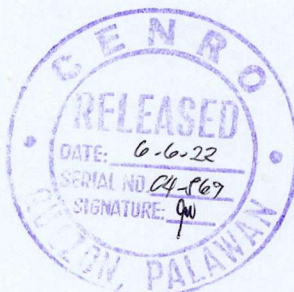

I. EVALUATION OF THE COURSE:

a. Technical Content:

The two (2) day face to face Orientation and Workshop on Environmental Law Enforcement is very important as it covers the discussion of Sec. 77 of PD 705, the enforcement Revised Forestry Reform Code of the Philippines, RA 9147, Wildlife Resources, Conservation and Protection, Penalizing the unlawful and exploitation of wildlife resources and their habitats, RA 7942, Philippines Mining Act of 1995 or the Theft of Minerals by violators and DAO 97-32 of 1997, Rules for the Administrative Adjudication of Illegal Forest Products and the Machinery and Equipment, Tools and Conveyances.

• Impression/Comment:

The three (3) Attorneys, Atty. Haziell Pascua, Atty. Venus Aquilla, and Atty. Twinkle Rodriguez discussed well their assigned topics. I observed their support and assistance to every personnel's concern when asked to them. They answer our query to the best of the knowledge and learnings acquired in law university, and I learned the importance to recite by the apprehending personnel, the Miranda Doctrine when apprehending illegal forest products and arresting violators, in order to inform them of their human rights, as impose in the Phil. Constitution.

I also learned the warrantless search, it was undertaken seeing on the plain view. How to secure search warrant from a judge on products not seen or stored in safety place. When approved it's validity is only 10 days, if not serve within the regulatory period for unknown reasons, must secure again. It was encourage to use the body worm camera for safety and protection of personnel who will be conducting the search warrant.

Safety and protection of personnel must be first enjoined in doing the apprehension, arresting the forest violators and doing search warrant as advice by our legal attorneys.

REVISED FORESTRY CODE

Section 77 of PD 705, as amended

Cutting, Gathering, Collecting Timber or other Forest Products without License.

Any person who shall cut, gather, collect, removed timber or other forest products from any forest land, or timber from alienable or disposable public land, or from private land without any authority.

There are Three (3) Element to prove the violations:

1. The offender cuts, gathers, and/or collects timber or other forest products.
-Evidence needed to prove the elements: Geo-tagged pictures/videos, Apprehension/Seizure Receipt and Talley Sheet
2. The cutting, gathering, and/or collection of timber or other forest products is without license.
- Evidence needed to prove the elements: Certification of no permit from the PAMB, Executive Order No. 23 Series of 2011(Moratorium on the cutting and harvesting of timber in natural and residual forest.
3. The timber or other forest products were obtained from any forest land.
-Evidence needed to prove the elements: Sketch Map of the location of violations.

E-NIPAS ACT

Section 18 of RA 11038

Possessing or transporting outside the Protected area any timber, forest products, wildlife or by-products derived therefrom which are ascertained to have been taken from the protected area other that exotic species, the cutting of which has been authorized under an appropriate permit.

KAINGIN OUTSIDE THE PROTECTED AREA

Three (3) Elements to prove the Violations:

1. The offender is in the possession of timber, forest products, wildlife, or by-products.
-The evidence needed to prove the elements: Geo-tagged pictures/videos showing that the character is in actual possession of timber, forest products, wildlife or by-products, Apprehension/Seizure Receipt/Talley Sheet and affidavit of witnesses.
2. Without an appropriate permit.
-The evidence to prove the elements: Certification from the PAMB that the act performed by the offender has no permit.
3. It has taken from the protected area.
-The evidence to prove the elements: Sketch Map of the location of violation and certification from the PAMB that the act performed were done inside the protected area.

KAINGIN WITHIN PROTECTED AREAS

Three (3) Elements to prove the violations:

1. The offender cuts, gathers and collects timber or forest products.
-Evidence needed to prove the elements: Geo-tagged pictures/videos, Apprehension/Seizure Receipt/Talley sheet and affidavit of a witness attesting to the cutting or gathering.
2. The act is without necessary permit, authorization or certification.
-Evidence needed to prove the elements: Certification from the PAMB that the act performed by the offender has no permit.
3. The timber or forest products were obtained from a protected area.
-Evidence to prove the elements: Sketch Map of the location of violation and certification from PAMB that the act performed were done inside the protected area.

WILDLIFE ACT

Section 27 of RA 9147

In Section 27. Illegal Acts- Unless otherwise allowed in accordance with this Act, it shall be unlawful for any person to willfully and knowingly exploit wildlife resources and their habitats, or undertake the following acts: a). Effecting any of the following acts in critical habitats, b). Squatting or otherwise occupying any portion of the critical habitat.

-Possible violations: Squatting or otherwise occupying any portion of the critical habitats.

The Elements to prove the violation:

1. There is squatting or occupation of a place by the violator.

The Proof/Evidence needed:

- Photo/video showing squatting or occupation of a place.
- Report on the squatting or occupation and,
- Affidavit of witnesses on the squatting or occupation of place by the offender.

Amos

2. The place occupied is a critical habitat as declared by the DENR Secretary in accordance with Section 25 of R.A. 9417.

WATER CODE

Building structures in easement areas (Section 51 of PD 1067).

"Article 51. The banks of rivers and shores of the seas and lakes throughout their entire length and within a zone of Three (3) meters in urban areas, Twenty (20) meters in agricultural areas and Forty (40) meters in forest areas, along their margins are subject to the easement of public use in the interest of recreation, navigation, footage, fishing and salvage, no person shall be allowed to stay in this zone longer than what is necessary for recreation, navigation, footage, fishing or salvage or to build structures of any kind.

Possible violations: Overstaying and building structures in easement areas.

Elements to prove the violations:

The offender is any person, natural or juridical and the offender stays or build structures within the easement areas.

Evidence to prove the elements:

- a). 3 meters along the margin of the river, streams and shores in urban areas.
- b). 20 meters in agricultural areas.
- c). 40 meters in forest areas

PHILIPPINE MINING ACT R.A. 7942

THEFT OF MINERALS

Elements to Prove the Violations:

- Report on the extraction or disposition of minerals
- Photo/video
- Sample of minerals
- Seizure Receipt
- Result/certification of kind and volume of minerals
- Affidavit of apprehending/arresting officer and witnesses, if any, on extraction and disposition of minerals.

Evidence to prove the elements:

- MGB certification as to the lack of mining agreement, lease, permit, license.
- MGB certification as to the lack of Ore transport permit or Delivery Receipt.

VIOLATION OF THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE ECC IN A MINING AND QUARRYING PROJECTS

Elements to prove the violations:

- Offender is a holder of an ECC in a mining or quarrying project
- Offender willfully violates or grossly neglects to abide by the terms and Conditions of the ECC
- The failure or neglect caused environmental damage through pollution

Evidence to prove the elements:

- Air, land, water sample
- Result/certification of laboratory examination of samples
- Affidavit of witness as to the as to the environmental damage through pollution

ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ACT OF 2000

VIOLATIONS:

- Littering, throwing, dumping of such matters for public places such as roads, Canals, streets, park and establishments.
- Open burning of Solid waste
- Causing or permitting the collection of non-segregated or unsorted waste.
- Open dumping or burying of biodegradable or non-biodegradable materials in flood prone area.
- Unauthorized removal of recyclable materials intended for collection by authorized person.

STRATEGIC LAW SUIT AGAINST PUBLIC PARTICIPATION (SLAPP) AND PLEA BARGAINING IN ENVIRONMENTAL CASES

- This refer to an action filed with the intent to harass, exert undue pressure upon the law enforcer for the acts of enforcing environmental laws or protecting the environment.

PLEA BARGAINING

- Refer to the process whereby accused and the prosecution work out a mutually satisfactory disposition of the case subject to court approval.
- The present and consent of concerned government agency is required in Plea Bargaining for environment.

When both parties agree to the plea offered by the accused, the court should issue an Order which contains the plea-bargaining arrived at, proceed to receive evidence on the Civil aspect of case, if any, and render and promulgate judgement of conviction, Including the civil liability for damages.




