This pertains to the memorandum dated December 23, 2021 from the Regional Executive Director, Maria Lourdes G. Ferrer which was received by this office on April 18, 2022 regarding the Port Zone Delineation (PZD) Application of Port Management Office-Palawan located in San Fernando, El Nido, Palawan.

In compliance to the above mentioned memorandum, personnel of this office were instructed to conduct an investigation on April 26, 2022 to ascertain if the area is covered by Mangroves. Report (attached) disclosed that a total area of 5,361.64 sq. m is covered with Mangroves. The reclamation of portion of the foreshore and submerged area with embankments is one of the cause of deposition of sand to the other side of the proposed Port Zone Delineation where the mangrove area is located. This might affect the flow/supply of seawater to the mangrove areas in the near future. The mangroves near the proposed PZD is a small portion only of the total mangrove areas of Barangay San Fernando, El Nido while the greater portion of the mangroves are found at the opposite side of the proposed PZD.





This pertains to the memorandum dated December 23, 2021 from the Regional Executive Director, Maria Lourdes G. Ferrer which was received by this office on April 18, 2022 regarding the Port Zone Delineation (PZD) Application of Port Management Office-Palawan located in San Fernando, El Nido, Palawan.

In compliance to the above mentioned memorandum, the undersigned as per instruction conducted an investigation on April 26, 2022 to ascertain if the area is covered by Mangroves. Based on ground verification, a total area of 5,361.64 sq. m is covered with Mangroves. The reclamation of portion of the foreshore and submerged area with embankments is one of the cause of deposition of sand to the other side of the proposed Port Zone Delineation where the mangrove area is located. This might affect the flow/supply of seawater to the mangrove areas in the near future. The mangroves near the proposed PZD is a small portion only of the total mangrove areas of Barangay San Fernando, El Nido while the greater portion of the of the mangroves are found at the opposite side of the proposed PZD. Also, there are no DENR projects within the vicinity of the PZD that will be affected.

### Recommendation

- 1. The undersigned would like to reiterate the recommendations cited in the Completed Staff Work (CSW) report dated June 4, 2019 and August 19, 2021.
- 2. This Office may issue a memorandum interposing no objection on the proposed project with out prejudice on the imposition of penalties for violation such as but not limited to the following environmental laws:
  - ECC is defined under item "F" of Section 2 of DAO (DENR) 2000-25 dated March 9, 2000. Section 4 of Presidential Decree No. 1586 dated June 11, 1987:"xxx No person, partnership or corporations shall undertake or operate any such declared environmentally critical project or area without first securing Environmental Compliance Certificate xxx."

- ii. Gratuitous Permit pursuant to Section 73.a of Department (DENR) Administrative Order 2010-21: "Any Government entity/instrumentality in
  - need of quarry, sand and gravel or loose/unconsolidated materials in the construction of building(s) and/or infrastructure for public use or other purposes may apply for a Government Gratuitous Permit (MGB Form 8-3B) with the Provincial Governor/City Mayor through the Provincial/City Mining Regulatory Board xxx. The applicant shall submit a project proposal stating where the materials to be taken shall be used and the estimated volume needed.":
- iii. The usage of dead corals is unlawful pursuant to Section 27 of Republic Act 9147 (Wildlife Resource and Conservation Act dated July 30, 2001);
- 3. The proponent should secure a separate ECC for the reclamation area and the Gratuitous Permit for the scraping of the hill as source of filling materials; and
- 4. Finally, the proponent/contractor should coordinate with this Office and provide the necessary permits secured (ECC, Environmental Protection and Enhancement Plan (EPEP) among others) for the operation of San Fernando Port in order for this Office to monitor their compliance as well as their rehabilitation of the area.

COMPLETE STAFF WORK (CSW) ON PROPOSED ROLL-ROLL-OFF (RORO) PORT PROJECT IN SAN FERNANDO, EL NIDO, PALAWAN SUBJECT OF THE LETTER DATED JULY 19, 2021 OF MR ELIZALDE M. ULSON, ACTING PORT MANAGER OF THE PHILIPPINE

PORT AUTHORITY PALAWAN

This pertains to the request for a Comprehensive Clearance/Endorsement in relation to the proposed Port Zone Delineation of Port San Fernando in El Nido, Palawan. Hereunder are the documents available in this Office regarding the action taken in chronological order.

- 1. On June 31, 2014 in this Office, Mr. Deogracias S. Velasco (Velasco for brevity) filed a request for a certification as to the land classification status of the area proposed for RORO Pier Project of the Philippines Port Authority joint with the Provincial Government of Palawan in Barangay San Fernando, El Nido, Palawan (Annex 1). On September 9, 2014, the desired certification was granted (Annex 2).
- On November 16, 2015, then CENRO Felizardo B. Cayatoc sent a memorandum (Annex 3) for then PENRO concerning the reported wanton destruction and use of corals for pier construction. In substance the memorandum states:
  - a. The Palawan Council for Sustainable Development (PCSD) Staff had already issued a Cease and Desist Order (CDO) since August 2014.
  - b. Coordination with the PCSD on November 16, 2015 disclosed that it conducted a recent inspection and found out that the contractor resumed the construction despite lack of Strategic Environmental Plan (SEP) clearance and Environment Clearance Certificate (ECC).
  - c. PCSDS was already acting on the matter.
  - d. The Project site is outside of the El Nido-Taytay Managed Resource Protected Area, and

- e. This Office (CENRO) is conducting IEC and monitoring/protection activities in the area and nearby communities thereof.
- 3. The preceding memorandum of then CENRO Cayatoc was forwarded to the Regional Director per PENRO memorandum dated November 26, 2015 (Annex 4). The Regional Office acknowledged the receipt of the report in its undated memorandum with specific instruction (Annex 5). Again, PENRO referred the Regional Director's instruction to this Office (Annex 6) and, in turn, this Office forwarded the same to ENTMRPA Protected Area Superintendent on January 25, 2016 (Annex 7).
  - 4. Meanwhile, another letter on the matter from Mr. *Velasco* was received in this Office (Annex 8) on August 18, 2016 requesting for an inspection, assessment, and delineation of the proposed project. With that, former OIC CENRO Felizardo B. Cayatoc issued CENRO Special Order No. 019, Series of 2016 (Annex 9) but there is no report submitted on record. The Special Order is particularly:

"Creation of a joint team for the inspection/ assessment of the proposed Roll-on, Roll-off joint project of the Provincial Government of Palawan and the Philippine Ports Authority located at Brgy. San Fernando, El Nido, Palawan."

- 5. On November 9, 2016, Mr. Velasco submitted an application of the Provincial Government of Palawan for a Forest Land Use Agreement (FLAg) for Other Lawful Purposes (Roll-on, Roll-off Port and Other Port Facilities) over an area of Thirty-Two Thousand (32,000) square meters together with other related documents for evaluation (Annex 10 to 10a). The said application was referred to then Forest Management Section (FMS). Then, again, Records show no specific action on the letter. The letter cited the following attachment:
  - a. Copy of Tax Declaration No. 13-014-03417 (not available in the files)
  - b. Sketch Plan of the proposed Roro Port project (Annex 11 and 11a)
  - c. Sangguniang Barangay (San Fernando) Resolution 2014-20 endorsing the project (Annex 11<sub>b</sub> to 11<sub>c</sub>).
  - d. DENR Certification dated September 09, 2014 (identical to Annex 2)
- 6. Subsequently, then CENRO Cayatoc on February 2, 2017 inquired with the PCSD of an update on the result of hearing by their Adjudication Board in relation to the letter dated August 27, 2015 of Atty. Robert Chan, Executive Director of Palawan NGO Network, Inc. (PNNI) on the wanton destruction and use of corals for a pier construction Annex 12). Again, Records show no response from PCSD.
- 7. A memorandum from Forest Ranger Jenuel Casel (Casel) of ENTMRPA dated February 22, 2017 was submitted to this Office informing that the port terminal was constructed using boulders and partially covered with soil (Annex 13). The report also noted that the port construction used dead corals. The said memorandum was then referred to the Conservation and Development Unit for preparation of technical report.

- 8. On January 11, 2018, Mr. Velasco again filed a letter covering the submission of documentary requirements requesting evaluation, assessment, final survey, and endorsement to the DENR Secretary for the issuance of corresponding FLAg for other lawful purposes (Annex 14). Accordingly, the said project is in consonance with the pronouncement of former President Aquino during the ASEAN Day on August 9, 2010 aiming to boost the tourism potential of the Province, accelerate Regional Development and lower the cost of transport of goods and commodities within the Region. Since then, the records reveal no progress documentation.
- Other related records include the favorable endorsement Sangguniang Bayan (El Nido) Resolution No. 17-22 dated February 6, 2017 (Annex 15 and 15<sub>a</sub>) and Sangguniang Panlalawigan (Palawan) Resolution No. 13075, Sries of 2017 dated March 28, 2017 (Annex 15<sub>b</sub> and 15<sub>c</sub>).
- 10. Lately on May 10, 2019, Mr Kevin Kenneth E. Perez (*Perez*) who is an embedded Science Research Specialist II of the Mines and Geoscience Bureau (MGB), and joined by some personnel of this Office and embedded personnel of the Environmental Management Bureau conducted an update inspection/investigation Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) in response to the complaint of certain Ruby Raess-Dante alleging of a plan to reclaim the beachfront of her property as part of the port project. *Perez*, reported that there is a fish by sanctuary adjacent to the port project and based from the Google Earth Image dated November 10, 2016 and Topographic Map from the National Mapping and Resource Information Authority (*2953-IV Dipnay*), the reclaimed area overlies a fringing coral reef. He also mentioned that the filling materials in the reclamation ranging from silt to boulder size were from adjacent hill (Annex 16 to 16h).
- 11. A memorandum was issued to Environment Officer Noel S. Sanchez and the Conservation and Development Section of this Office to trace on their actions on the matter (Annex 17). A letter was also made for PCSD following up the outcome of its investigation on the wanton destruction of corals (Annex 17<sub>a</sub>).
- 12. A memorandum dated June 4, 2019 containing the Complete Staff Work of the said project was submitted by the undersigned to the PENRO enumerating the above documents with recommendations of issuance of corresponding notice and fine appropriate under the law and submission of a feasibility study of the project (Annex 18).
- 13. On March 5, 2021, Mr. Elizalde M. Ulson, Acting Port Manager of the Philippine Port Authority (PPA) Palawan filed a letter to the DENR MIMAROPA Regional Office covering the submission of documentary requirements requesting for a Comprehensive Clearance/Endorsement relative to their application for the proposed Port Zone Delineation (PZD). Same letter was sent to this Office on August 2, 2021 requesting for assistance in the facilitation of issuance of the said clearance. The said application was referred to then Regulation and Permitting Section (RPS), thus this Complete Staff Work (CSW). Upon receiving the said request, records shows that the latest action made by this Office was still the memorandum dated June 4, 2019 containing the Complete Staff Work of the said project signed by the undersigned (Annex 18). The subject letter cited the following attachment:

a. Port Development Plan and Aerial Photograph of Completed Port Project;

b. Proposed Port Zone Delineation Plan with corresponding technical description;

 Provincial Development Council Resolution No. 11 series of 2020 dated August 11, 2020;

d. Sangguniang Bayan of El Nido Resolution No. 20-132 dated May 11, 2020;

e. LGU-El Nido Municipal Development Council Resolution No. 03 series of 2020 dated May 8, 2020

 f. Sangguniang Barangay of San Fernando Resolution No. 29-19 series of 2019 dated Augsust 26, 2019; and

g. Sample DENR (Regional Office) Certification

### Comments with review of related legal bases

It may be apparent from the above that there may be lacking actions of the Office. Accordingly, a report hereon was submitted by retired Environment Officer Mr. Noel S. Sanchez recommending for the proponent to first carry out an Environment Compliance Certificate (ECC). His report, however, is not present in the records of this Office consequent of the old practice that reports of Environmental Sector are not coursed through CENR Offices.

Both the reports of Casel and Perez (Annex 13 and Annex 16 to 16h, respectively) say of several environmental violations consequent of absence of ECC like reclamation, usage of dead corals, and extraction (earth movement). These activities crucially need the application of laws, to wit:

- ECC is defined under item "f" of Section 2 of DAO (DENR) 2000-25 dated March 9, 2000. Section 4 of Presidential Decree No. 1586 dated June 11, 1987: "xxx No person, partnership or corporation shall undertake or operate any such declared environmentally critical project or area without first securing Environmental Compliance Certificate xxx"
- 2. Gratuitous Permit pursuant to Section 73.a of Department (DENR) Administrative Order 2010-21: "Any Government entity/instrumentality in need of quarry, sand and gravel or loose/unconsolidated materials in the construction of building(s) and/or infrastructure for public use or other purposes may apply for a Government Gratuitous Permit (MGB Form 8-3B) with the Provincial Governor/City Mayor through the Provincial/City Mining Regulatory Board xxx. The applicant shall submit a project proposal stating where the materials to be taken shall be used and the estimated volume needed."
- 3. The usage of dead corals is unlawful pursuant to Section 27 of Republic Act 9147 (Wildlife Resource and Conservation Act dated July 30, 2001).

- 4. The reclamation is deemed unlawful outside of compliance of Section 2 of Executive Order 672 dated October 19, 2007 requiring a DENR permit authorizing/clearing a particular area to the site of the proposed reclamation and preconditions an ECC under Section 3 thereof.
- 5. The letter dated July 19, 2021 of Mr. Ulson pertaining to the request for a Comprehensive Clearance/Endorsement along with the attached documents relative to the PZD application should be accompanied by a (1) development program of the port facilities; (3) project components; (2) basis of the program (e.g. master plans, feasibility studies, and pre-feasibility studies; (3) status of program/project preparation/implementation; and (4) inventory of existing land use and status of ownership of the areas under consideration. This is based on the Executive Order No. 410 dated July 3, 1990, "Providing for New Guidelines for the Processing of Application for Port Zone Delineation".

#### Recommendations

- 1. The noted violation deserves issuance of corresponding notice and fine appropriate under the law. Stoppage of operation, meantime, should be maintained as called for in this Office' letter dated May 20, 2019 (Annex 18). Item (3)(iii) of Section 17 of Republic Act 7160 mentions about the Provincial Government to take part in the protection of the environment. The same is true also for them Municipal Government under item (2) (ii) of the same law.
- 2. Consistent with the Philippine Ports Authority's objectives pursuant to item 1 of Article II, Section 2 of PD 857 which includes **construction** of ports and its facilities.
- 3. The Philippine Reclamation Authority created by virtue of Presidential Decree No. 1084 has to take the lead and responsibility in the reclamation activity in the project site with prior Area Clearance from this agency (DENR) including ECC thereby addressing the issues on earth movement (quarry) and the reported extraction of dead corals likely in violation of Republic Act 9147.
- 4. Forest Land Agreement may also be a misplaced instrument to cover the whole project site encroaching largely to the bay and even to coral reefs. Hence, meticulous technical review is recommended. For this purpose, it is apt for the proponent to submit a feasibility study of the project.

A memorandum from Forest Ranger Jenuel Casel (Casel) of ENTMRPA dated February 22, 2017 was submitted to this Office informing that the port terminal was constructed using boulders and partially covered with soil (Annex 13). The report also noted that the port construction used dead corals. The said memorandum was then referred to the Conservation and Development Unit for preparation of technical report.
- 8. On January 11, 2018, Velasco again filed a letter covering the submission of documentary requirements requesting evaluation, assessment, final survey, and endorsement to the DENR Secretary for the issuance of corresponding FLAg for other lawful purposes (Annex 14). Accordingly, the said project is in consonance with the pronouncement of former President Aquino during the ASEAN Day on August 9, 2010 aiming to boost the tourism potential of the Province, accelerate Regional Development and lower the cost of transport of goods and commodities within the Region. Since then, the records reveal no progress documentation.
- 9. Other related records include the favorable endorsement Sangguniang Bayan (El

- Nido) Resolution No. 17-22 dated February 6, 2017 (Annex 15 and 15a) and Sangguniang Panlalawigan (Palawan) Resolution No. 13075, Sries of 2017 dated March 28, 2017 (Annex 15b and 15c).
- 10. Lately on May 10, 2019, Mr Kevin Kenneth E. Perez (*Perez*) who is an embedded Science Research Specialist II of the Mines and Geoscience Bureau (MGB), and joined by some personnel of this Office and embedded personnel of the Environmental Management Bureau conducted an update inspection/investigation Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) in response to the complaint of certain Ruby Raess-Dante alleging of a plan to reclaim the beachfront of her property as part of the port project. *Perez*, reported that there is a fish by sanctuary adjacent to the port project and based from the Google Earth Image dated November 10, 2016 and Topographic Map from the National Mapping and Resource Information Authority (2953-IV Dipnay), the reclaimed area overlies a fringing coral reef. He also mentioned that the filling materials in the reclamation ranging from silt to boulder size were from adjacent hill (Annex 16 to 16h).
- 11. Finally, memorandum is issued to Environment Officer Noel S. Sanchez and the Conservation and Development Section of this Office to trace on their actions on the matter (Annex 17). A letter was also made for PCSD following up the outcome of its investigation on the wanton destruction of corals (Annex 17<sub>a</sub>).

### Comments with review of related legal bases

It may be apparent from the above that there may be lacking actions of the Office. Coordination with Mr Noel S. Sanchez who is now functioning at the Provincial Environment Management Unit disclosed that he accordingly had already submitted a report hereon recommending for the proponent to first carry out an Environment Compliance Certificate (ECC). His report, however, is not present in the records of this Office consequent of the old practice that reports of Environmental Sector are not coursed through CENR Offices.

Both the reports of *Casel* and *Perez* (Annex 13 and Annex 16 to 16h, respectively) say of several environmental violations consequent of absence of ECC like reclamation, usage of dead corals, and extraction (earth movement). These activities crucially need the application of laws, to wit:

- ECC is defined under item "f" of Section 2 of DAO (DENR) 2000-25 dated March 9, 2000. Section 4 of Presidential Decree No. 1586 dated June 11, 1987: "xxx No person, partnership or corporation shall undertake or operate any such declared environmentally critical project or area without first securing Environmental Compliance Certificate xxx"
- 2. Gratuitous Permit pursuant to Section 73.a of Department (DENR) Administrative Order 2010-21: "Any Government entity/instrumentality in need of quarry, sand and gravel or loose/unconsolidated materials in the construction of building(s) and/or infrastructure for public use or other purposes may apply for a Government Gratuitous Permit (MGB Form 8-3B) with the Provincial Governor/City Mayor through the Provincial/City Mining Regulatory Board xxx. The applicant shall submit a project proposal stating where the materials to be taken shall be used and the estimated volume needed."
- 3. The usage of dead corals is unlawful pursuant to Section 27 of Republic

Act 9147 (Wildlife Resource and Conservation Act dated July 30, 2001).

4. The reclamation is deemed unlawful outside of compliance of Section 2 of Executive Order 672 dated October 19, 2007 requiring a DENR permit authorizing/clearing a particular area to the site of the proposed reclamation and preconditions an ECC under Section 3 thereof.

#### Recommendations

- 1. The noted violation deserves issuance of corresponding notice and fine appropriate under the law. Stoppage of operation, meantime, should be maintained as called for in this Office' letter dated May 20, 2019 (Annex 18). Item (3)(iii) of Section 17 of Republic Act 7160 mentions about the Provincial Government to take part in the protection of the environment. The same is true also for them Municipal Government under item (2)(ii) of the same law.
- Consistent with the Philippine Ports Authority's objectives pursuant to item 1 of Article II, Section 2 of PD 857 which includes construction of ports and its facilities.
- 3. The Philippine Reclamation Authority created by virtue of Presidential Decree No. 1084 has to take the lead and responsibility in the reclamation activity in the project site with prior Area Clearance from this agency (DENR) including ECC thereby addressing the issues on earth movement (quarry) and the reported extraction of dead corals likely in violation of Republic Act 9147.
- 4. Forest Land Agreement may also be a misplaced instrument to cover the whole project site encroaching largely to the bay and even to coral reefs. Hence, meticulous technical review is recommended. For this purpose, it is apt for the proponent to submit a feasibility study of the project.

### Final comment

Mr Velasco, a Forester by profession had been with the DENR for a considerable length of time. The agency expects of him as nothing less than an environment friendly advocate. This report is meant a complete staff work but it is admitted that long way ahead is yet to be accomplished, evaluated, and coordinated with the proponent and other concerned agencies. The present Office management hereby manifests its sincere cooperation on the matter.



Per DENR CENRO-TAYTAY Travel Order as numbered, the undersigned together with Voltaire M. Delos Angeles, Richard M. Valones, both are personnel of DENR-CENRO Taytay, and Peter Abobot, EMB Personnel detailed in CENRO-Taytay, proceeded, coordinated and conducted investigation in response to the complaint of Ruby Raess-Dante regarding the reclamation of the beachfront of her property at Brgy. San Fernando, El Nido, Palawan.

### **Background Information**

On 06 May 2019, Ruby Raess-Dante went to the office of CENRO-Taytay to complaint about the plan to reclaim the beachfront area of her property as part of the Pier Construction Project adjacent to her property. Upon knowing the complaint, CENRO Alan L. Valle immediately form a composite team consisting of MGB, DENR and EMB technical personnel to conduct investigation as soon as possible.

### Purpose and Scope

1. The fieldwork aims validate the veracity of the complaint and to recommend necessary action to address the issue. The field investigation includes the ocular inspection of the reclaimed beach front in Brgy. San Fernado and the ocular inspection of the origin of the materials used for the land reclamation. Prior to the inspection the team made a courtesy call to LGU of Barangay of San Fernando. Unfortunately, Brgy. Capt. Isidro F. Bacaltos is on other engagement outside the office. However, the team had a dialogue/ interview with Barangay Kagawad Liza T. Castaño who also joined in the ocular inspection.

### **Findings and Observation**

- The subject area is located 34 kilometers northeast of the Town Proper of El Nido, Palawan. The subject area is accessible by any land vehicles via well paved Palawan circumferential road and barangay road.
- On 09 May 2019, the investigating team conducted a field investigation in the area.
   Actual extraction and reclamation are observed adjacent to the property of Mrs.
   Raess-Dante, extending along the shoreline. (Photo No. 1)
- 3. The said extraction and reclamation activity were conducted by the Provincial Government of Palawan as part of the pier construction. Consequently, heavy equipment such as dump trucks and backhoe belonging to the provincial government are observed in the area. (Photo No. 2)
- 4. According to Kag. Castaño, there is a fish sanctuary adjacent to the pier construction area and she has no knowledge about the actual plan of the pier. (Photo No. 3)
- Based from the Google Earth Image dated 10 November 2016 and Topographic Map from the National Mapping and Resource Authority with a title of 2953-IV Dipnay.
   The reclaimed area overlies a fringing coral reef. (Photo Nos. 8 & 9)
- 6. As seen in ocular inspection, filling materials used in the reclamation activity are from the adjacent hill. The filling materials is composed of earth materials ranging from silt to boulder size. (Photo Nos. 4 & 5)
- 7. Another contractor is also present in the area. It is the HG-III Construction and Development Corporation. According to Mr. Jet Edillor, foreman of HG-III, they are only contracted to install pile foundation for the pier by the Philippine Port Authority. However, Mr. Edillor added that any further information should be address to their project engineer, a certain Engr. Chris (Mr. Edillor can't remember the full name of Engr. Chris). Unfortunately, Engr. Chris is on other engagement outside the area. The team instructed Mr. Edillor to inform Engr. Chris about the ongoing investigation and communicate with investigating team to have a dialogue/interview. (Photo Nos. 6 & 7)
- 8. To check the legality of the reclamation and extraction activity, and whether it will affect the beach front area of Mrs. Raess-Dante. The investigating team went to the field office of the provincial engineering department in the area, to ask for a copy of the work plan of the pier and supporting documents of the legality of the reclamation

- and extraction and activity. In the field office, the team was entertained by one of the truck drivers of the project, Mr. Rudolfo Villegas. (Photo No. 2)
- 9. According to Mr. Villegas, based from his knowledge the reclamation will continue to expand affecting the beach front property of Mrs. Raess-Dante and the adjacent fish sanctuary. However, he added that to ensure accuracy of the information, we must address are inquiry to their foreman, Mr. Rolly Felipe. Unfortunately, Mr. Felipe is on other engagement outside the area. The team instructed Mr. Villegas to inform Mr. Felipe about the ongoing investigation and communicate with investigating team to have a dialogue/interview.

### Comments and Recommendations

- Based on the field findings, the reclamation and extraction activity in Brgy. San Fernado, El Nido, Taytay will be deemed to be unlawful unless it possesses legitimate mining and other environmental permit.
  - It's worth to mention that the reclamation activity should have an Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC). ECC should not be taken for granted since the activity is environmentally critical due to its consequence to the marine biodiversity in the area.
- 2. As for the earth materials extraction used for the above-mentioned project, the Provincial Government shall have a Government Gratuitous Permit pursuant to Section 73.a of DENR Administrative Order No. 2010-21, which states that:
  - "Any Government entity/instrumentality in need of quarry, sand and gravel or loose/unconsolidated materials in the construction of building(s) and/or infrastructure for public use or other purposes may apply for a Government Gratuitous Permit (MGB Form No. 8-3B) with the Provincial Governor/City Mayor through the Provincial/City Mining Regulatory Board for a period coterminous with the construction stage of the project but not to exceed one (1) year in public/private land(s) covering an area of not more than two (2) hectares. The applicant shall submit a project proposal stating where the materials to be taken shall be used and the estimated volume needed."
- 3. If the provincial government failed to acquire a Government Gratuitous Permit prior to the extraction, the earth materials extracted from the area will categorized under illegally-sourced mineral/mineral products. By the definition of illegally-sourced mineral/minerals products as provided by Section 116, Chapter XII of DENR Administrative Order 2010 - 21;

"Section 116. – Illegally-sourced minerals/mineral products are those which are mined, extracted, removed and/or disposed of without the authority or permit under existing mining laws, rules and regulations."

- 4. Hence, it is recommended that any further extraction and reclamation activity in the project should *cease and desist* until all the supporting documents is provided.
- 5. It is also recommended that the reclamation activity should be reported to the Philippine Reclamation Authority for proper assessment.





