





Respectfully submitted herewith is the consolidated apprehension report of Enforcement and Monitoring Section personnel of this Office. This is in compliance/justification to the actual accomplishment as compared to the target volume of apprehension of undocumented forest products for the 1st Quarter based on the Approved Work and Financial Plan for CY 2022.


As per reports submitted, a total of **497.98** board feet of undocumented forest products (lumber and timber) were apprehended by the personnel of DENR CENRO Brooke's Point Balabac Sub-Office and the operatives of 2nd Special Operation Unit- Maritime Group Balabac SBU/Rio Tuba Detachment which is equivalent to **26.35%** of the total target volume for the quarter which is **1,980** board feet.

The strengthening of linkages and continuous coordination with other concerned agencies and the intensified forest protection activities undertaken by the Enforcement and Monitoring Section personnel of this Office resulted to the limited volume and incidences of apprehension. Moreover, the filing of cases against the identified violators/perpetrators facilitated during the previous years has been a great factor in promoting community awareness that this office is seriously implementing our existing environmental laws and policies. Likewise, Information Education and Communication Campaign/Activities have been intensified and are regularly being conducted.

Further, aside from patrolling, monitoring and surveillance activities, livelihood programs such as NGP and CARP projects were introduced and established within the four (4) municipalities under the jurisdiction of this Office. In addition, the reactivation of the Multi Sectoral Forest Protection Committee in the Municipalities of Bataraza and Sofronio Española which had encourage/solicit the involvement, support and active participation of other law enforcement and partner agencies has been crucial specifically in the determination and/or detection of existence/possibility of illegal activities in a particular area.

Conduct of regular patrolling and surveillance activities; 3. Introduction and establishment of livelihood program/project such as the National Greening Program in the Municipality of Sofronio Española, Palawan; 4. Reactivation of the Multi-Sectoral Forest Protection Committee (MFPC) wherein the involvement of different agencies has been very useful specifically in the determination of existence of possible illegal activities in a particular area; 5. Filing of cases against identified perpetrators which becomes one of the factor to stop/minimized illegal activities and further promote awareness of the community re: the serious implementation of environmental policies; 6. Strengthening of linkages with other concerned agencies; 7. Continuous support from the LGU Sofronio Española in the conduct of IEC and regular patrolling activities.



Introduction and establishment of livelihood project/program such as the National Greening Program (NGP) particularly in the coastal and terrestrial areas; 3. Strengthening of linkages with the other law enforcement and concerned agencies like the PNP Maritime, PNP Municipal Police Station and Philippine Marines among other; 4. Continuous coordination with Barangay Officials to solicit/encourage their support and active participation in the conduct of forest protection related activities within their respective areas of jurisdiction. 5. Filing of cases against perpetrators if evidences warrant. This serves as an indication to the community that the Department is seriously implementing our existing environmental laws and policies.

Intensified LAWIN patrolling, conduct of ground validation/inspection/survey, IEC and other forest protection activities particularly in identified areas within the municipality where there are many reported previous incidents of apprehension; 2. Regular patrolling and surveillance activities; 3. Introduction and establishment of livelihood program/project such as National Greening program both in the coastal and terrestrial areas; 4. Strengthening of linkages with other agencies such PNP Maritime, Philippine Marines, PNP and other concerned agencies;

				5. Continuous coordination with Barangay Officials to encourage/solicit their support and active participation in the conduct of forest protection related activities within their respective areas of jurisdiction.

The regular Lawin patrols conducted in the area; 2. Visibility of rangers/forest officers in the area due to regular monitoring of livelihood programs/project such as the National Greening Program (NGP) which was introduced and established in Balabac; 3. Regular seaport monitoring in two (2) identified port in Balabac; 4. Regular mobile patrolling in identified "local hotspot" areas in the municipality; 5. Strengthening of linkages with other agencies such as the Municipal PNP and PNP Maritime Police and other concerned agencies re: ENR issues and concerns.
