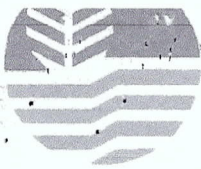

Respectfully forwarded is the report of Forester I Bernadine I. Jasul et.al dated 20 May 2022, relative to the turned-over of one (1) Philippine Scops Owl (*Otus megalotis*).

Per report, personnel of this Office facilitated the turn over and assessment of said wildlife through physical examination. It was identified as juvenile Philippine Scops Owl (*Otus megalotis*) and considered a least concern species. There is no injury on its body or fracture on its wings. Furthermore, PSMS Tyrone N. Paglicawan of PNP-MPS of Mogpog, Marinduque was interviewed and accordingly, a certain Emerson Aguilar Mangi of Barangay Balanacan, Mogpog, Marinduque voluntarily surrendered said wildlife species on May 14, 2022 to their Office. The Philippine Scops Owl was accidentally found in the private vehicle (motorcycle with sidecar) of Mr. Aguilar in Barangay Balanacan, Mogpog, Marinduque.

On May 16, 2022, the said wildlife was turned over to Forest Technician I Corazon Pelaez, In-Charge, Biodiversity Conservation Unit under Conservation and Development Section for the proper custody and safe keeping.



On the same day, the undersigned Forest Officers proceeded to the police station of Mogpog, Marinduque to conduct interview, physical examination and gather other pertinent data of the said wildlife.


Based on the interview with PSMS Tyrone N. Paglicawan of PNP-MPS Mogpog, Marinduque the said wildlife was voluntarily surrender to their Office by Mr. Emerson Aguilar Mangi of Barangay Balanacan, Mogpog, Marinduque on May 14, 2022. The Philippine Scops Owl (*Otus megalotis*) was accidentally found in his private vehicle (motorcycle with sidecar). As per examination, it is identified as a juvenile Philippine Scops Owl (*Otus megalotis*) and considered a least concern species. There is no injury on its body and fracture on its wings. 
SUBJECT : UPDATE ON THE RETRIEVED BRAHMINY KITE FROM
MUNICIPALITY OF SANTA CRUZ

Relative to the status of the retrieved Brahminy Kite (*Haliastur indus*), hereunder is the update on the condition of the said wildlife that was rescued from being captive to being rehabilitated in the Marinduque Wildlife Rescue Center (MWRC).

Please be advised that the wildlife in subject is still under the rehabilitation process in the MWRC, located at Barangay Bonliw, Torrijos. The wildlife remains healthy and is growing gradually, while learning how to fly after being trapped in a small cage for a long time. The caretaker makes sure that the Brahminy Kite is able to take flight from a higher point by increasing the height of the perching rod day by day or as necessary. He also trains the predator bird to shred the fish meat on its own as part of the acclimatization of living in the wild.

Attached are the geotagged pictures taken last June 15, 2022 for reference.

The predator bird's feathers on the steel matting which indicates that it had undergone molting. *Molting* is the replacement of feathers on birds as they shift from fledgling to juvenile stage. Hence, the Brahminy Kite in the picture can be concluded as a juvenile.

SUBJECT : **REPORT ON THE SOFT RELEASING OF THE TURNED-
OVER BRAHMINY KITE FROM THE MUNICIPALITY OF
SANTA CRUZ**

In relation to the report regarding the turned-over Brahminy Kite (*Haliastur indus*) from a funeral home located at the Municipality of Santa Cruz, please be informed that upon checking with the Marinduque Wildlife Rescue Center caretaker, the wildlife had already left its cage.

Accordingly, the caretaker had took care of the wildlife for more than a month, feeding it with fresh fish catch daily, providing water for drinking and bath and training it to fly with adjusting perching pole. The wildlife had grown quite big and can flap its wings while making a good landing onto the ground when it flew from a higher point. As part of the soft releasing, the caretaker had left the cage open three weeks after the wildlife was turned-over to the rescue center. He said that the wildlife would sometimes leave the cage but would come back immediately within the day. And on July 20, 2022, upon checking of the undersigned with the caretaker, he informed that the Brahminy Kite had already left its cage. It had not returned since then and it was concluded that the wildlife had already acclimatized with the outside environment. However, the undersigned advised the caretaker to check daily if the wildlife will return to the cage or within the vicinity of the rescue center.
