

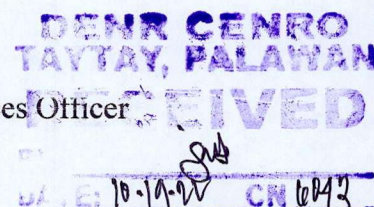

This pertains to the target activity on the Maintenance and Protection of Coastal and Marine Ecosystem (e.g. reduction of threats and enforcement)- Conduct of direct activities under 001 Management of Coastal and Marine Resources/Areas of Malampaya Sound Protected Landscape and Seascape (MSPLS), Taytay-San Vicente, Palawan.

Please be informed that the following are the activities conducted by this Office in relation to the abovementioned subject.

ACTIVITY	REMARKS
1. Report on the conducted coastal clean-up activity at Park Ranger Station, barangay Tumbod, Taytay, Palawan on September 19, 2022. That Office was able to collect plastics bags/labos weighing two (2) kilograms, plastic bottles weighing one (1) kilogram and other various types of non-biodegradable waste weighing three (3) kilograms with a total of five (5) kilograms. Likewise, the non-biodegradable waste was transferred in the Material Recovery Facility (MRF) of Barangay Liminangcong, Taytay, Palawan for proper disposal.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• With endorsement memorandum to PENRO dated September 21, 2022• With endorsement memorandum to CENRO dated September 19, 2022
2. Report on the conducted coastal clean-up activity at Barangay Old Guinlo, Taytay, Palawan on September 21, 2022. 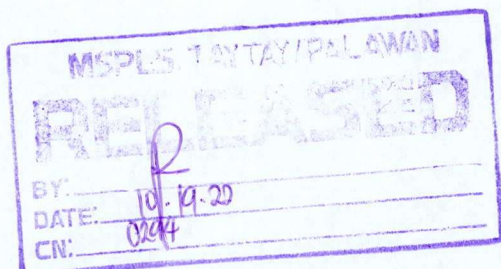


of non-biodegradable waste (i.e. candy wrapper, plastic labo, plastic bottles, plastic spoon, diapers, ropes, fishing net, hose, cans, styrofoam, rubber) were collected during the activity. The non-biodegradable waste was buried in the sand while non-biodegradable waste was brought to the designated Material Recovery Facility (MRF) of the barangay for proper disposition.	
3. Report on the conducted Crown of Thorns (<i>Acanthaster planci</i>) extraction at Malapenya Island, Barangay San Jose, Taytay, Palawan on October 12, 2022. Based on the COTs control guidelines of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority, one of the process conducted by the MFI in order to minimize its proliferation and dealing with its outbreak is to directly inject the COTs with vinegar, because accordingly the vinegar is toxic to COTs starfish when injected into their bodies and not necessary to move them or take them out of the reef. Likewise, a total of 121 COTs at Malapenya Reef SPZ was injected and it was observed in the staghorn corals which has a worse case infestation.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• With endorsement memorandum to PENRO dated October 19, 2022• With endorsement memorandum to CENRO dated October 19, 2022

The undersigned recommends the conduct of Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) campaign to the Barangay LGUs in coordination with the partner agencies regarding the Republic Act 9003 known as Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) and continuous monitoring of the crown of thorns (COTs) within the marine areas of MSPLS to prevent its proliferation.

This will serve as **Means of Verification (MoV)** on the said target activity.


