This pertains to the project 'Targeting Regional Investigations for Policing Opportunities and Development' or TRIPOD to combat wildlife trafficking among countries: Malaysia, Indonesia, and Philippines which is being carried out by International Fund for Animal Welfare (IFAW), Freeland, and World Wide Fund for Nature Inc. (WWF). The project aims to build capacity among law enforcement agencies in these countries.

One of the trainings to be conducted under the TRIPOD project is on Care for Confiscated Wildlife (CCW). In order to tailor the CCW training so that it will be beneficial for the law enforcement officers, IFAW would like to conduct survey on Care and Handling of Confiscated Live Fauna. The survey will be used to establish baseline data on live animals seized in the country, legal frameworks, current law enforcement capacity, knowledge, experience, and gaps that will inform their training modules.
