This is to inform that the undersigned staff of Mt. Mantalingahan Protected Landscape (MMPL) Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) conducted the above subject with assistance from Conservation International (CI) on September 13-14, 2022 at Canvas Hotel, Barangay San Miguel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan.

The workshop was conducted in two phases, the first phase was participated mostly by representatives from DENR Offices such as the PENRO, CENROs Brooke's Point, and Quezon along with PCSDS and IDEAS and was done to ease the decision making and finalization of the strategy. For the second day of the workshop, the mentioned DENR personnel along with representatives from concern agencies/offices such as PNP, AFP, LGU MENROs and NTFP-EP attended/participated.

The workshop started with a prayer and singing of the national anthem followed by opening message from Ronnie G. Gandeza, OIC Chief for Technical Services Division at DENR PENRO, Palawan.

The workshop continued under the facilitation of Conservation International thru Atty. Edward Lorenzo, the Policy and Governance Advisor of Conservation International – Philippines (CI-Philippines) and conducted the following activity and discussions:
