This pertains to your Memorandum dated September 29, 2022 addressed to the Director of Financial Management Service regarding the Unutilized and Unreleased fishpond areas in Marinduque province. Kindly be informed that the same was copy furnished/referred to this Office for our information and reference.

In this regard, may we respectfully request for the list of the unutilized fishpond areas including the maps and/or technical descriptions in Marinduque. Based on the attached list endorsed by DA- Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) to DENR, there is no data on the fishpond areas already covered under the National Greening Program (NGP) within Marinduque. Moreover, we would also like to seek updates on the status of the NGP mangrove plantations over these fishpond areas. The requested information would be helpful in commencing data consolidation in relation to AUUFs.

Lastly, please be informed that the DENR, in partnership with USAID - Sustainable Interventions on Biodiversity, Ocean and Landscapes (SIBOL), organized a 5 day AUUF 101 Orientation and Workshop in Iloilo last October 17-21, 2022. One of the objectives of the workshop is to come-up with the guidelines on the administrative reversion process of the AUU fishponds. As of this writing, the DENR National Technical Working Group (NTWG) for AUUF reversion is in process of drafting the guidelines and is targeting the issuance of the guidelines before the end of the CY 2022. While waiting for the guidelines, the DENR NTWG for AUUF reversion instructed Regional and Field Offices to conduct preparatory activities in relation to the reversion process. Please see the attached Memorandum from the



Office of Assistant Secretary for Policy, Planning and Foreign- Assisted and Special Projects dated 27 October 2022, for further information/details.

This refers to DENR Special Order (SO) No. 2021-274 entitled, "Creation of the DENR Technical Working Group for the Reversion of the Abandoned, Undeveloped and Underutilized (AUU) Fishponds and Other Related Mangrove Conservation and Rehabilitation Policies", which directs the creation of Regional Technical Working Groups (TWG) for the purpose and defines their roles and responsibilities.

An Orientation and Levelling-Off Workshop on AUU Fishponds (AUUFs) was held on 17-21 October 2022 in Iloilo City. This was participated in by representatives from the DENR Regional Offices concerned, National TWG member-agencies and USAID SIBOL Project. Central to the activity was the crafting of a draft DENR Administrative Order on the Reversion and Management of AUUFs.

Moreover, the workshop participants agreed among others, that the DENR Regional Offices may undertake the following while awaiting the approval/issuance of the guidelines:

- 1. Creation of TWG at the PENRO/CENRO level, as applicable;
- 2. Holding of initial discussions with counterparts in the DA-BFAR, DILG, and DAR, and LGUs concerned on AUUFs;
- 3. Validation of the location and status of DA-BFAR-reported reverted Fishpond Lease Agreements (FLAs) in coordination with counterparts in DA-BFAR; and
- 4. Desktop processing/mapping of FLAs based on mangrove zonification data and/or maps from FMB and NAMRIA.

Furthermore, submit to the undersigned copies of orders/directives on the creation of Regional TWG and other pertinent documents in compliance with SO 2021-274.
