SUBJECT : STATUS REPORT ON TYPHOON PAENG

Please be informed that the Tropical Storm Paeng had not caused any significant damage to properties, equipment and projects of this Office, and aside from one (1) personnel who reported to have transferred with his family to the Barangay Evacuation Center, all staff and personnel are safe and accounted for.

Be informed further that as early as October 29, moderate rain was already prevailing in Occidental Mindoro. And while typhoon signal no. 2 was imposed on Occidental Mindoro the following day October 30, strong winds with intense rain showers were experienced in the municipalities under the jurisdiction of CENRO San Jose (San Jose, Magsaysay, Rizal and Calintaan). By 9:00 pm of the same day, the National Highway in Labangan Poblacion was already flooded, resulting to the entry of flood water to the CENRO San Jose Office grounds, kitchen and stockroom, soaking some chainsaw units stored in the area. Flooding rose knee-deep but had not reached the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the office building and the Records Office, and has immediately subsided a few hours after. Note that an office emergency kit is always in place. Everyone was also reminded to stay updated via the Office's group chat, same with the assigned Quick Response Team on standby for any incident that may arise. Working confiscated chainsaw units under the custody of this Office are ready if needed for roadside clearing and other related use.

There was a power outage on the whole province of Occidental Mindoro last October 30 morning and was restored October 31 at 8:30 pm. Moderate to heavy rains was still prevalent last November 1 but it was particularly sunny on the resume of Office operations yesterday, November 2. The Office has a generator set on standby in case.


