OCTOBER 25-26, 2022

Respectfully submitted is the activity report of Data Manager Julius F. Landrito of Snake Island- NCMCR on the conducted waterbirds assessment at Snake Island.

As reported, thirty (30) bird species were observed, nineteen (19) of which are waterbirds with a total of two hundred eight-nine (289) individuals recorded and eleven (11) forest birds with a total of nineteen (19) individuals counted. The species with the most individuals recorded is the Greater Sand Plover, which has 117 individuals, while the species with the fewest individual observed are Common Redshank, Grey Heron, Little Stint, Pacific Reef Heron, Sanderling, and Striated Heron which have only one (1) individual record. There were also large numbers of Whimbrel and Grey wagtail recorded. The team also conducted night monitoring and recorded the Mantanani Scops Owl for the first time, with a total of two (2) individuals. The activity was conducted in partnership with CENRO PPC, City ENRO, ERDB, and BMB.

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ACTIVITY REPORT ON CONDUCTED 4th QUARTER WATERBIRDS ASSESSMENT AT SNAKE ISLAND NCMCR ON OCTOBER 25-26, 2022

As part of the regular monitoring of waterbirds population in Snake Island-National Coastal and Marine Center for Research, a quarterly assessment was programmed to monitor its population and analyze it for further studies. For the 4th quarter of the year 2022, the monitoring team from PENRO Palawan in partnership with CENRO PPC, City ENRO, ERDB and BMB conducted the assessment on October 25-26, 2022.

During the two (2) days assessment, thirty (30) bird species were observed, nineteen (19) of which are waterbirds with a total of two hundred eight-nine (289) individuals recorded and eleven (11) forest birds with a total of nineteen (19) individuals counted. The species with the most individuals recorded is the Greater Sand Plover, which has 117 individuals, while the species with the fewest individual observed are Common Redshank, Grey Heron, Little Stint, Pacific Reef Heron, Sanderling and Striated Heron which have only one (1) individual record. There were also large numbers of Whimbrel and Grey wagtail recorded. The team also conducted night monitoring and recorded the Mantanani Scops Owl for the first time, with a total of two (2) individuals. On the first day of monitoring, it was cloudy and high tide; on the second day, it was the same. The table below also shows the conservation status of these waterbirds based on the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Redlist of Endangered Species version 2020-2, Department of Environment and Natural Resources Biodiversity Management Bureau (DENR BMB): Philippine Redlist of threatened wild fauna Part 1 - Vertebrates and the Palawan Council for Sustainable Development (PCSD) Resolution No. 15-521.
