On Audit Recommendation to maintain compliance with DENR Administrative Order No. 2017-03 (revised by DENR Administrative Order No. 2019-03) on the conduct of Survey, Mapping, and Planning (SMP) prior to the plantation establishment to provide recommendations for effective implementation of NGP, specifically on the following:				
A.	Coordination and consultation with stakeholders concerned, and enhanced information, educations, and communication (IEC) campaign.	To avoid the same mistakes committed in the past, this Office reiterates to strictly observe the following protocols when conducting a site assessment, surveying, and mapping of the new sites for NGP development: Stakeholders Consultation -The implementing PENROs and CENROs shall conduct the consultation and IEC campaign to inform prospective partners and surrounding communities about the NGP objectives. -The PENROs and CENROs shall coordinate and consult with stakeholders, partners from the private sector, Local Government Units (LGUs), and communities before site assessment surveying and mapping.	Prior to the conduct of SMP CY 2022 activities, the Office coordinated with the concerned Brgys. of Murtha, Camburay, Narra, Batasan, and Central, San Jose, and Brgy. Tanyag, Calintaan, Occidental Mindoro. After which, IEC campaign was conducted to inform prospective partners and surrounding communities about the NGP objectives. The Survey, Mapping and Soil Sampling Collection and Analysis Team immediately commenced the conduct of site assessment after the IEC Campaign. The Team prepared the necessary tools and equipment that will be used in	

B. Conduct an actual assessment of the planting sites and site-species matching to determine the appropriate species that will best grow under the existing biological condition and the trait or characteristics of the identified planting sites.

Actual Site Assessment,
Surveying, and Mapping
-The implementing PENROs and CENROs shall conduct ground validation to validate the conditions of all identified sites for development.

-They shall assess the identified areas on the ground by conducting soil analysis to determine appropriate species to be introduced and identify interventions.

-The personnel and the Head of Office who conducted the assessment and survey shall certify all identified areas for development.

-Henceforth, the Regional Executive Director shall approve all NGP sites maps and shapefiles changes.

the perimeter survey to determine the exact boundaries including its interior to isolate any areas not suitable for plantation establishment that may be present inside the area.

The purpose of the activity was not only to map the proposed area but also to determine soil properties and potential recommendations of most suitable species that will best grow under the existing condition in the area, as well as to identify interventions to improve the condition of proposed eNGP sites.

The Team was subdivided into two team to cover an extensive area during the activity. Each team collected soil samples per block every 100-200 m distance and took notes for the biophysical assessment and characterization of the whole surveyed area.

2. On Audit Recommendation for the NGP Coordinators and Forest Extension Officers to strengthen the conduct of monitoring on all NGP activities to:

A. Ensure adherence of the NGP Partners to the NGP contract provisions.

B. Properly document and approved all modifications in the Partner's contractor work and financial plan by the RED.

This Office reiterates the following guides and instructions to comply appropriately with the above audit recommendations:

-The NGP coordinator should visit the NGP sites that have funding from the DENR at least once every month, and the Extension Officer assigned at least twice every month to monitor the NGP activities therein.

Contracts of NGP Partners were composed based on FMB Technical Bulletin Nos. 10-A and 30. These contracts were discussed with the Partners/Contractors before they enter into an agreement. Likewise, the provisions under the contract of NGP Partners was followed and implemented with the assistance of assigned Forest Extension Officers in the area under the supervision of the NGP Coordinator who also

5. On Audit Recommendation to strengthen the internal control on the following processes:

- A. Preparing the Inspection Reports to establish reliability and validity of a financial transaction thru:
 - -The designated Inspection Committee Members should conduct the inspection.
 - -Adhere to the protocol on the signatories of the Inspection Report. -Inspection Reports
 - should include details and accomplishments as required in the contract and the work and financial plan or terms of reference, e.g., species, number, quality of seedling produced by the Partners, and its compliance with the standard.
- B. Payments to the Partners based on the provisions of the contracts.
- C. Records management system and proper turnover of documents.

- -The NGP Coordinator and the CENRO shall not sign the Inspection and Acceptance Report (IAR) for the NGP Partner's/Contractor's submitted accomplishments. They can only endorse the IAR or put their concurrence or objection to it for the PENRO to decide. Only designated Inspection Officer or Members of the duly constituted Inspection and Acceptance Committee shall sign the contract.
- -The Regional Office shall adopt a modified format of inspection and Acceptance Report (IAR) following the Commission on Audit (COA) IAR format (Appendix 62 of GAM) for uniformity and consider the required outputs/deliverables under the contract.
- -When paying the Contractors for their accomplishments, follow the provisions strictly under the contract and under existing guidelines.

The format currently used by this Office was the previous prescribed IAR format that reflects the accomplishments as required in the contract and the work and financial plan. Likewise, the NGP Coordinator and CENRO were included in the signatories. The Office shall adhere and adopt the modified format once instructed by the PENRO.

All payments endorsed by the Office were based on the provisions of the contracts of NGP Partners/Contractors.
