Respectfully submitted is the Travel Report on the field validation and monitoring of the accomplishments and progress of implementation of the Biodiversity Sector's priority programs and projects for the First Semester of CY 2022 per BMB Special Order No. 2022-133). Said activity was conducted by the undersigned technical staff on 12-17 September 2022 in the provinces of Occidental and Oriental Mindoro.

The activity employed document review of the work plan and other pertinent reports, key informant interviews, and site validation. The equipment funded under IPAG-SAGF in 2020, other procured equipment, and ecotourism facilities were also inspected. The protected areas and offices visited are as follows:

- 1. Mt. Calavite Wildlife Sanctuary (MCWS) and its PAMO in Paluan, Occidental Mindoro:
- 2. CENRO-Sablayan in Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro;
- 3. Apo Reef Natural Park (ARNP) in Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro;
- 4. Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park (MIBNP) in Calintaan, Occidental Mindoro;
- 5. Mindoro Biodiversity Rescue and Conservation Center (MBRCC) in Rizal, Occidental Mindoro;
- 6. MIBNP-PAMO and CENRO-San Jose, in San Jose, Occidental Mindoro;
- 7. Wildlife Rescue Center in Roxas, Oriental Mindoro;
- 8. Naujan Lake National Park (NLNP) in Oriental Mindoro; and
- 9. Samahan ng Bakawanan ng Brgy. Maidlang, a Biodiversity Friendly Enterprise (BDFE) project site.

Technical assistance was also provided in the preparation and updating of the Ramsar Information Sheet for ARNP and NLNP, respectively. The Ramsar Site



Information Service, an online information tool for wetlands of international importance, was also introduced to the focal of the said sites.

Constraints in activity execution, project implementation, and site management encountered by the Field Offices at the ground level were also noted. These include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Lack of equipment/gears in the visited rescue centers to properly restrain and/or handle turned over, donated, or confiscated wildlife;
- 2. Lack of technical equipment in conducting waterbird census and monitoring of priority threatened species (e.g., spotting scope, binoculars, camera, among others);
- 3. Lack of technical skills on species identification and caving;
- 4. Lack of standard protocols and guidelines in assessing damage on coastal and marine habitats and corresponding compensation; and
- 5. Lack of resource valuation policy for coastal and marine ecosystems.

Recommendations

Foregoing considered, the Team recommends the following:

- 1. The Bureau to continue providing necessary technical assistance to the field offices particularly through the conduct of training relevant to species identification, wildlife handling, and caving, among others;
- 2. Provide necessary guidance on the application of ARNP as Ramsar Site
- 3. Review the existing policies/ tools such as the Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS) to include directions on the re-identification/establishment of new BMS sites particularly for marine and coastal biodiversity monitoring; and .
- 4. Lastly, BMB to facilitate the drafting of the guidelines on the valuation of coastal and marine habitats for the guidance of our field offices should there be incidences of damages to coastal and marine resources.

ANNEX I. TRAVEL REPORT ON THE CONDUCT OF MONITORING AND VALIDATION OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE BIODIVERSITY SECTOR PRIORITY PROGRAMS FOR CY 2022

Region 4B - MIMAROPA | 12-17 September 2022

I. INTRODUCTION

The field validation and monitoring of the accomplishments and progress of implementation of the Biodiversity Sector's priority programs and projects for the First Semester of CY 2022 was conducted on 12-17 September 2022 in MIMAROPA Region. Among the programs and projects monitored includes ecotourism development, protected area management and development, and caves, wetlands and coastal and marine resources management. The travel also included site visits to select protected areas such as Mts. Calavite Wildlife Sanctuary (MCWS), Apo Reef Natural Park (ARNP), Naujan Lake National Park (NLNP), and Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park (MIBNP) in the provinces of Occidental and Oriental Mindoro.

The monitoring activity is vital in improving the implementation of the programs of the Bureau, as well as, providing recommendations necessary in the decision making process in terms of crafting new policies and/or amending existing policies and formulation of new programs/projects.

II. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the validation and monitoring are as follows:

- 1. To validate and assess the accomplishments of the Biodiversity Sector's priority programs and projects as well as implementation of NIPAS in the Region as contained in the Work and Financial Plans (WFP);
- To interview DENR Regional Office (RO) officials and staff as well as concerned PENRO/CENRO personnel pertaining to their targets vis-à-vis accomplishments; and
- 3. To monitor/visit sites/protected areas relative to the ecotourism development/activities implemented in the area.

III.METHODOLOGY

The Monitoring Team conducted the following activities to validate the accomplishments of the field offices and examine the issues and concerns on the monitored sites:

 Documents review – includes review of the work plan, accomplishment reports, statistical reports, inspection and monitoring reports and other pertinent documents.

- 2. Field/Site Inspection include the following sites:
 - a. Mt. Calavite Wildlife Sanctuary in Paluan, Occidental Mindoro;
 - b. Apo Reef Natural Park in Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro;
 - c. Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park in Occidental Mindoro;
 - d. Wildlife Center in Tamaraw Gene Pool Farm in Brgy. Manoot, Riza, Occidental Mindoro;
 - e. Wildlife Rescue Center in San Mariano, Roxas; and
 - f. Naujan Lake National Park.
- 3. Interviews RO/PENRO/CENRO staff and field implementers were interviewed to raise questions for further clarification and consultation.

IV. HIGHLIGHTS OF THE VALIDATION AND MONITORING ACTIVITIES

- 1. A courtesy meeting was conducted on 9 September 2022 via zoom with DENR MIMAROPA Regional and Field Office staff to present the rationale, objectives, scope, itinerary for site visit, and the validation and monitoring process. The first day (12 September 2022) of the validation period started with a courtesy call at PENRO Mamburao, Occidental Mindoro. Further, the objectives of the monitoring and validation were also presented during the courtesy call.
- 2. The BMB validation and monitoring team conducted the documents' review which include work plans vis-à-vis accomplishments for CY 2022.
- 3. Site visit to selected protected areas in the Provinces of Occidental and Oriental Mindoro. The site validation and monitoring were conducted from 12-16 September 2022. Mt. Calavite WS, Apo Reef NP, Naujan Lake NP, and Mts. Iglit-Baco NP were the identified sites for validation and monitoring. Aside from the said protected areas, wildlife rescue centers in Manoot, Rizal Occidental Mindoro and in San Roque, Bulalacao, Oriental Mindoro were also visited/monitored. In addition, a biodiversity-friendly enterprise (BDFE) project site in Brgy. Maidlang, Calapan, Oriental Mindoro, was also visited and monitored.
- 4. The status of the implementation of priority programs particularly on Protected Area Development and Management and Coastal and Marine Ecosystems Management Program, was briefly discussed with the concerned Protected Area Superintendent. A copy of the matrix on the specific issues/concerns relative to the implementation of priority programs in MIMAROPA Region in particular, protected areas in the Provinces of Occidental and Oriental Mindoro is attached.
- 5. In addition to the monitoring and validation activities, technical assistance was also provided to the Apo Reef NP and Naujan Lake NP on the preparation and updating of the Ramsar Information Sheet, being the former as a proposed Ramsar Site and the latter an established one. In particular, a brief orientation on the requirements for the process of the Ramsar Site designation was provided to the concerned staff of the aforementioned sites. The staff were also walked through

the Ramsar Site Information Service - an online information tool for wetlands recognized internationally for their importance.

- 6. Furthermore, as an offshoot of the National Training for Wetland Managers in the Philippines that was led by CAWED in July this year, the Ramsar Site Management Effectiveness Tracking Tool (R-METT) was pilot tested during the monitoring activities in Naujan Lake NP. However, in the interest of time, the form was not used in its entirety but only served as a guide during the interview with the Assistant Protected Area Superintendent of the said Ramsar Site.
- 7. The Team presented the results of the monitoring and validation to the concerned DENR PENROs and the Regional Office during the Exit Conference on 19 September 2022.

V. ISSUES, CONCERNS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Provided below as **Table 1** are the observed issues and concerns by the validation team with corresponding recommendations and agreements with the concerned field office.




