Binasa ng tagapanguna ang katitikan nang pagpupulong na isinagawa noong ika - 25 ng Nobyembre taong 2021.

Matapos ang pagtatama sa katitikan ng nakaraang pagpupulong inirekomenda ni PMAJ Bronson C. Caramto ang pag-endorso nito na sinegudahan naman ng karamihan.

IV. New Business

1. Letter of Ms. Ma. Louella M. Aranas, managing partner of LMA LAW OFFICES requesting the PAMB Endorsement for Binga Beach Brothers, Inc. located at Sitio Lumambong, Barangay Binga, San Vicente, Palawan.

Inilahad ni PASu Clarissa P. Pador ang nilalaman ng nasabing proyekto. Ayon sa kanya ito ay tinalakay na ng PAMB Executive Committee meeting at para sa pag-apruba at affirmation ng PAMB Enbanc. Idinagdag rin niya na ang nasabing proyekto ay nasa Alienable and Disposable (A&D) land na may sukat at lawak na Five Thousand, Two Hundred Eighty Two (5,282) square meters, na may TCT No. 065-2018001432 na matatagpuan sa Sitio Lumambong, Barangay Binga, San Vicente, Palawan at nasa Multiple Use Zone (MUZ) ng Malampay Sound Protected Landscape and Seacsape (MSPLS). Humihingi ang proponent ng PAMB endorsement/resolution mula sa Board para sa kanilang proyekto na pag-aari ng Binga Beach Brothers Inc. (60% Filipino at 40% foreign) at ang nabanggit ay isa rin requirement ng Tourism Infrastructure & Enterprise Zone Authrority (TIEZA).

Ayon kay Hon. Reynaldo Rodriguez, IPMR representative ng San Vicente, base sa presentasyon na ipinakita ay mayroong requirements na magmumula sa NCIP. Dagdag pa niya na sa Barangay Binga ay mayroong ancestral domain at kung tenurial instrument ang hahanapin ay kasalukuyan nagproproseso at nangangalap ng mga dokumento. Ang kanyang nais ipaabot ay magkaroon ng konsultasyon sa lugar bago magbigay ng Certificate of Non overlap ang National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP).

Itinanong naman ng tagapanguna kung mayroon bang kinakailangan na e comply ang proponent na endorsement from the NCIP.

Sagot naman ni PASu Pador opo base sa mga dokumento isinumite sa PAMO-MSPLS ay mayroon letter request ang TIEZA address kay Dir. Mary Grace T. Pascua Regional Director ng NCIP na may pets ana ika 29 ng Setyember 2021 na humihingi ng NCIP Clearance para sa Bingan Beach Brothers subalit hanggang sa ngayon ay walang sagot ang NCIP.

Itinanong ng tagapanguna si IPMR Rodriguez, kung sa area ba na pagtatayuan ng proyekto ng proponent ay sakop ng kanilang ancestral domain?

Sagot naman ni IPMR Rodriguez na ito ay nasa loob ng kanilang ancestral domain.

Ayon sa tagapanguna ang lugar na pagtatayuan ng proyekto ay A&D at may TCT, paano ito ay napasok sa ancestral domain claim? dapat ito ay labas sa claim ng ancestral domain.

 Sagot ni IPMR Rodriguez, ang nais lamang nila ay kailangang dumaan sa proseso magkaroon ng konsultasyon sa lugar ipaliwanag ng proponent kung ano ang gagawin proyekto dahil ang NCIP Clearance ay ibibigay kapag compliance ang proponent.

Dagdag ng tagapanguna na kailangan talaga ang Certificate of Non Overlap/NCIP Clearance sa usapin ng pagtatayo ng proyekto ng Binga Beach Brothers, Inc. at ayon kay PASu Pador ang PAMB Executive Committe ng PAMB ang nag endorso ng proyekto sa Enbanc kaya nais niyang makahingi ng ibang opinyon mula sa iba pang members for the record na wala pang Certificate of Non Overlap.

Ayon naman kay PASu Pador for the meantime ay wala pang naisusumiting approved Certificate of Non Overlap ngunit mayroong application at nareceived ito ng NCIP.

Suhestyon ng tagapanguna kay IPMR Rodriguez na gawing pormal ang kahilingan patungkol sa compliance ng proponent ng Certificate of Non-Overlap.

Ayon naman kay IPMR Rodriguez ay hinihiling lang niya na magkaroon ng Certificate of Non-Overlap and proponent para magkaroon ng kasiguraduhan ang mga IPs sa Barangay Binga.

Mungkahi naman ni Gng. Josephine Dela Cruz kinatawan ng Peoples Organization na baka habang wala pa ang Certificate of Non-Overlap ng proponent galing sa NCIP ay hindi ba pwedeng eendorse o bigyan ng temporary endorsement para makakuha ng iba pang requirement sa ibang ahensya dahil kung hihintayin ang NCIP ay sobra ng matatagalan at ang lugar na pagtatayuan ng proyekto ay nasa A&D at may titulo.

Sagot naman ng tagapanguna hindi yung motion ang issue kundi ang kawalan ng NCIP Certification.

Dagdag naman ni Gng. dela Cruz, ang PAMB Enbanc members ba ay hindi pwedeng bigyan ng endorsement ang Binga Beach Brothers?

Ayon sa tagapanguna, ayon sa mga requirements ay kulang ang isinumiteng papel ng proponent, kinakailangan muna nilang isumite ang hinihinging dokumento.

Nagtanong si Atty. Jefrie Sahagun kinatawan ng Congressman 1nd District ng Palawan kung ang area ba ay pasok sa CADC or CADT?

Pahayag ni IPMR Rodriguez, na ang inaaplayan ng Binga Beach Brothers, Inc. ay nasa loob ng ancestral domain ng Barangay Binga at ang CADT ay nasa proseso pa lamang. Kasalukuyang ginagamit ng IPs ay ang IPRA Law RA 8371, Sections 3, 59 at 66 na ang mandato ay kapag may naninirahang IPs sa isang lugar ay kinakilangan ng pagkonsulta sa mga ito at ecomply ang sinasabing Certificate of Non-Overlap.

Dagdag naman ng tagapanguna, ang issue ni IPMR Rodriguez ay e-pending ang pag-endorso ng project dahil wala pa silang nakukuhang Certificate of Non Overlap.

Naitanong rin ni Atty. Sahagun kung requirements ba ng PAMB na kumuha ng clearance from NCIP?

Saad naman ni PASu Pador na ito ay requirements ngunit hindi mandatory ng PAMB considering na ang area ay A&D at mayroong titulo ang lupa. Ang hinihiling lamang ng proponent ay mabigyan ng PAMB endorsement para sa pag-usad ng application nito. Dagdag pa ni PASu Pador, na kapag naibigay na ang NCIP Clerance/Certificate of Non-Overlap at maisumite sa PAMO ay maari na silang e-endorso lalo at may hawak rin silang titulo. Binigyan nya rin ng pagkakataon ang Board na magdesisyon kung ito ay eendorso dahil ang dokomento naman na kulang ay hindi sagabal at mayroon ng sulat na ipinadala ang para sa paghingi ng Certificate of Non-Overlap sa NCIP ngunit wala pang sagot hanggang sa ngayon.

Ayon naman kay IPMR Rodriguez bilang isang member ng Board maari ng e-endorse ang proyekto ngunit ang tinitingnan niya dito kapag na endorso ito ay baka balewalain ng proponent ang requirements sa NCIP at baka mawala na ang karapatan na konsultahin ang mga IPs sa lugar.

Saad naman ni Atty. Sahagun na siya mismo ang tatawag sa proponent at ginagalang niya ang NCIP, samantala pagdating sa PAMB na nagpapatung-patong ang mga requirements na dapat e comply, ang hinihingi na requirements ay hindi mandatory, pangalawa ito ay saklaw ng isang ahensya na hindi requirements ng PAMB, kaya naitanong niya kung pwede ba bigyan ng permit ng PAMB na walang requirements galing sa NCIP? Kasi kung siya lang, ay eendorso na niya ang project ng Binga Beach Brothers, Inc. at sisiguraduhin na magkakaroon ng consultation with NCIP sa Binga kahit A&D ang area.

Ayon naman sa tagapanguna, may motion na mula kay Atty. Sahagun to approve the endorsement and subject to the compliance of requirements for NCIP, dagdag pa niya na hindi ito mandatory requirements at mayroon siyang neutral proposal to endorse the project, subject for the submission of the proponent of the Certificate of Non-Overlap from NCIP.

Susog ni Atty. Sahagun ay bahala na ang proponent makipag usap sa NCIP dahil ang rule ng PAMB ay e-endorse ang project.

Saad rin ni IPMR Rodriguez, may rights ang Board na mag endorso, ang tinitingnan lang niya ang papel nila as Indiginoues People ng Barangay Binga na manatili pa rin kaya kailangan e-fafacilitate ang NCIP clearance at ang lahat ng proyekto ng gobyerno o pribado ay dadaan sa NCIP.

Sa kadahilanang wala ng iba pa katanungan sa nasabing usapin inirekomenda ni Atty. Sahagun ang pag-apruba nito na sinegundahan ni Gng. Josephine G. Dela Cruz ng MPMPC.

1. Barangay Local Government Unit projects within timberland.

Ipinaliwanag ni PASu Pador ang tungkol sa mga proyekto ng Barangay Local Government Unit (BLGU) na nasa loob ng Protected Area at napapaloob sa kategorya timberland. Ayon sa kanya, ang lahat na ipinasa na resolusyon sa Regional Office ay may komento ng dating Regional Executive Director (RED)/PAMB Chairperson Maria Lordes Ferrer CESO IV na kung saan ang naging rekomendasyon ay lahat ng mga proyekto ng LGU/BLGU na nasa loob ng Protected Area at ang kategorya ay Timberland ay mag-aaplay ng Special Agreement within Protected Area (SAPA). Binanggit din niya na nakipaguganayan siya sa Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) hinggil sa mga proyekto ng LGU/BLGU ipinaliwanag na kapag mga proyekto ng BLGU ay kailangan magbayad ng rental ngunit one (1) time payment lamang para sa mga Non-Earning projects ng Barangay. At ito ay dapat pag-usapan upang malaman kung ano ba ang magiging stand ng mga Barangay para sa mga projects na gagawin, sa ngayon ay walang bumalik na Resolution para sa mga BLGUs projects.

Ayon sa tagapanguna, makipag-ugnayan sa tanggapan ng PAMO-MSPLS para sa mga proyekto ng Barangay Local Government Unit na nasa loob MSPLS para malaman kung ano ang dapat gawin.

2. C3 Philippines proposed signages for MSPLS in partnership with PAMO-MSPLS.

Inilahad ni PASu Pador na noong nakaraang Execuive Committee meeting ay nagkaroon ng presentasyon ang C3 Philippines, Inc. sa pangunguna ni G. Helbert G. Garay patungkol sa proyekto na watch tower sa Barangay Liminangcong at propose directional signages na ilalagay sa loob ng MSPLS, ipinahayag din nya na ang nasabing mga directional signages ay kanilang pinag-usapan kung ano ang mga ilalagay sa nasabing signages. Ipinakita ni G. Garay ang tatlong (3) directional signages na ilalagay sa mga strategic location ng Malampaya Sound at para sa karagdagang mungkahi ay ilalahad ulit ni G. Garay ang nasabing signages in coordination sa PAMO-MSPLS.

Ipiniresenta ni G. 

4.1 DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Cultural Consideration

The benefits to the communities of Binga town and Barangay, and to Palawan and the Philippines (apart from the simple influx of tourism dollars to the area) will be fourfold:

Education

Our project will drive the economy of the town of Binga which currently has no tourism accommodations, eateries or activities for tourists.

We will drive hospitality concepts and skills to enable the community to deal with international and regional tourists and visitors. The 6-8+ employees will learn valuable skills in addition to their employment that will prove valuable as they work with us and better prepare them for future employment.

Environmental

The Binga Beach partners are very concerned about the global and local environment. Our project includes a substantial solar installation which will provide us with abundant power and will require fuel-powered generators only in emergency. Our proposed septic and water systems in the Tieza Master Plan are top of the line. Overall our project will have a net positive impact on the area to make it as beautiful and as peaceful as possible. Our ecological perspective and solar-powered sustainability are important parts of our future marketing endeavours to attract like-minded guests who want to minimise their impact on the environment.

We have a zero-tolerance policy towards trash and single-use plastic and will continuously invest in beach clean-ups, thus helping instill greater environmental awareness and standards within the community.

Charity

Our partners have already been contributing to and establishing charity projects in Binga. The resort is a paying annual sponsor of the foundation for the last three years, and in the broader San Vicente area, sponsors surgeries for children to have facial/dental reconstruction surgery in Alimanguan.

We intend to continue our dedicated and ongoing charity efforts in Binga town through donations to schools and by delivering medical supplies. We are exploring the opportunities to establish a registered charity, donate to local charities and make direct donations to residents who need help.

Promotion of Filipino and local Binga Culture

The design of our glamping tent villas will include traditional Filipino cultural and design elements. Our food menu will be predominantly Filipino and support the local fishing and farming industries.

Our staff will be encouraged to interact with guests and share local experiences.

We will explore the opportunity to share local art and craft techniques, arrange fishing and hiking trips with local guides and educate guests regarding local traditions and cultural

hobbies - We want to provide our guests with an opportunity to learn and explore the real heart and soul of the people of Binga.

Local Considerations

Community and Stakeholder Acceptability

Our project has received very positive feedback so far from the communities in and around Binga Proper and Lumambong Beach. We meet regularly with local leaders and are already utilizing local help and labor in preparing the property.

We are proud to be providing economic opportunities to the local community and indigenous peoples in order to help reduce poverty across the municipality.

On the whole, we believe our vision to create a native light-material glamping resort will hugely benefit the area and attract guests who respect the environment and have a positive financial impact.

Ecological Consideration

Our fully self-sustaining solar-powered approach will keep our environmental impact to a minimum. Our high-standards regarding grounds-keeping and beach maintenance will have a positive impact on the environment. Communications with our staff, the Protective Area Superintendent ("PASU") and the concerned LGU will be carried out in an effective and disciplined manner.

Economic Consideration

With no other such accommodations, restaurants or activities available at Lumambong Beach for tourists and visitors, the Binga Beach project will have a strong positive impact in the small town of Binga. We intend to directly employ 6-8 people at a relatively high wage while indirectly employing more people for stand alone projects such as beach clean ups and all the while working with local farmers and fishermen.

4.2 Development Activities

Binga Beach aims to be a small boutique glamping experience friendly for women, children, persons with disabilities and senior citizens. The project will be implemented as follows:

- 1. Existing structures on the titled residential property
- a. Four (4) staff houses (3 glamping tents, 1 office);
- b. Three (3) toilets;
- c. Kitchen:
- d. Tool and solar room;
- e. Water pump and tower;
- f. 10 KVA Solar system and 18 panels with a back-up generator;
- g. Three (3) car/work station covered area;
- h. Bamboo kubo security house

- 2. The construction of additional improvements includes the remaining two family room glamping tent platforms, second four (4) chamber septic tank, staff quarters and additional PWD ramps plus PWD comfort room with shower; primarily through manual labor with no heavy equipment to keep our environmental impact to a minimum. Projected timeline to complete remaining light material glamping platforms is January 2022.
- 3. The construction of additional improvements will be commenced only after securing the required permits and licenses from the relevant government agencies.
- 4. Total Projected/Building Footprint Area (sq m.) of Binga Beach Resort 652.67 sq meters By Architect Clint Ponce De Leon.
 - percentage of building footprint 12.35%
 - percentage of impervious surface area 5.75%
 - percentage of unpaved surface area 87.65%

5. WASTE DISPOSAL PLAN

Binga Beach waste is disposed of as follows:

a. Solid waste:


Compostable waste - such as fruit and vegetable peelings, leftover food, fish/meat entrails, leaves and twigs undergo biological decomposition under controlled conditions. The material is then used as organic compost for our very own plants and trees.

Biodegradable waste - comprising the majority of the solid wastes normally include yard waste such as leaves and grass clippings, rotten produce, kitchen scraps wastes are reused in the farm as organic compost.

Recyclable material - which can still be used is put in segregated MRF recycling bins (materials recovery facility). This includes ferrous and non-ferrous scrap metal, corrugated cardboard, glass, aluminum, rubber and plastic. Binga Beach does not burn any of its waste products, nor do we use any chemicals in our operations.

b. Liquid waste:

With regard to liquid waste from toilets, sinks and the kitchen, Binga Beach has installed an enclosed concrete four-chamber septic tank. Another septic tank is planned once we start to build the two 'family size' accommodations. We already have installed three (3) grease traps on the property.



6. COMPETITIVENESS AND LONG-TERM SUSTAINABILITY

The Binga Beach project is based on the following strategy:

We recognise the demand for tourism solutions in Palawan. The emergence of the San Vicente area, the expected increase in the number of flights to San Vicente airport and improved roads in the San Vicente – Alimanguan – New Canipo - Binga area are all factors which will attract more visitors to the region.

During the past year of our exploratory work in the area, we have seen continuous development in terms of infrastructure and road-building projects. Reducing the drive time to Binga and improving access will undoubtedly bring more local and international tourists to the area.

In Palawan, there is a saturation of tourist hot spots such as El Nido and Port Barton.

Less explored destinations such as Binga and Lumambong Beach are gaining attention. While there are backpacker and family-focused places for people to stay in the area, these are relatively expensive places. Binga resort will be affordable, clean, well-managed and welcoming to travelers and visitors who want to enjoy the area and explore the beauty of Binga.

7. IMPACT OF THE PROJECT ON THE COMMUNITY

Binga Beach will continue to support the local community of Brgy. Binga in the Municipality of San Vicente.

By maintaining our strong work ethic and strengthening our communications with both the Barangay Binga Officials and LGU San Vicente, Binga Beach is committed to protecting and conserving the local environment while helping to attract and support more small businesses in the area.

Our activities will provide employment opportunities for the local community and indigenous peoples of Barangay Binga. 1st Qtr - not later than March 31st 2nd Qtr - not later than june 30th 3rd Qtr - not later than september 4th Qtr - not later than December 3. Delinquent payments are assessed a penalty of 2% per month of deliquency or fraction thereof.
