### **RESOLUTION NO. 2022 - 02**

**Resolution Authorizing the Task Force Cali-Kasan's Chairperson, Hon. Dante C. Esteban, Municipal Mayor, to Enter Into a Concrete Partnership with Organized Groups and Volunteer Organizations for the Purposes of Environment and Natural Resources Project and Activities' Implementation, Monitoring, Maintenance and Protection and Other Purposes in the Municipality of Calintaan, Occidental Mindoro**

***WHEREAS***, the state shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature (*Sect. 16, Art. II, Phil. Constitution*);

***WHEREAS***, the Local Government Units (LGUs) shall share with the National Government the responsibility in the management and maintenance of ecological balance within their jurisdiction in order to enhance the right of people to a balanced ecology by way of implementing environmental, biodiversity conservation and forestry related programs and projects such as, but not limited to Community-Based Forest Management (CBFM), Integrated Social Forestry (ISF), Communal Forest and Tree Parks (*Sect. 3-i, Chap.1; Sect. 16, Chap. 2 & Sect. 17-2ii, RA 7160*);

***WHEREAS***, the DENR is mandated as the primary government agency responsible for the conservation, management, development and proper use of the country's environment and natural resources, specifically forest and grazing lands, mineral resources including those in reservation and watershed areas, and lands of public domain, as well as the licensing and regulation of all natural resources as may be provided by law in order to ensure equitable sharing of the benefits derived therefrom for the welfare of the present and future generations of Filipinos (*Sect. 4, EO No. 192*);

***WHEREAS***, the national government particularly the DENR encourages and promotes multi-sectoral cooperation and participation between and among different national government agencies, Local Government Units (LGUs), Non-Government and Civic Society Organizations (NGOs/CSOs) and concerned volunteer groups and family partners in the implementation of ENR programs/projects to combat and address the impact of climate change, biodiversity conservation, poverty alleviation and social justice and environmental stability through massive forest and watershed rehabilitation and restoration under National Greening Program (*EO No. 23, EO 26 & EO 193*);

***WHEREAS***, the multi-sectoral Task Force CALI-KASAN (*Calintaan Para Sa Kalikasan*) has been created as primary stewards of the environment and natural resources within the territorial jurisdiction of LGU Calintaan that shall plan, protect, rehabilitate, manage, conserve, oversee, implement programs and activities, monitor actual scenarios and prevailing status, and evaluate performances or actions taken (*Executive Order No. 3 series of 2021*);

***WHEREAS***, the Task Force CALI-KASAN acknowledges the need for an intensified community participation and involvement towards the protection and conservation of the environment and natural resources of Calintaan;



60 After determining the attendees of the meeting, the Presiding Officer called the meeting to order and  
61 immediately presented the agenda that were motioned for approval by Hon. Reynaldo B. Dormido,  
62 Sangguniang Bayan, Chairperson, Committee on Environment and was unanimously seconded with the  
63 agreement that matters including the plans and proposed programs and activities to be raised by the  
64 members will be included and discussed under No. 5 Other Matters, as follows:

73 ***1. Presentation of the TF Cali-Kasan's Accomplishment and Sustainability Mechanisms of the***  
74 ***Conducted ENR Projects and Endeavors***

75 In the continuation of the meeting, the Presiding Officer called on the MENRO, Delmer B. Garingalo to  
76 facilitate the presentation of accomplishments of the Task Force. MENRO Garingalo started with the  
77 updates on the Forestry programs as follows:

- 78 1. Bamboolution Project Implementation supplementing the Anahawin River Adoption that was
- 79 executed at Barangays Iriron, Poblacion and Poypoy;
- 80 2. Mangrove Rehabilitation, Enrichment, and Monitoring of Wawa, Marumbol, Anahawin,
- 81 Bingag, and Banus Mangrove areas;
- 82 3. Enrichment of Concepcion Watershed through Planting of Narra (*Pterocarpus indicus*) during
- 83 the Philippine Arbor Day;
- 84 4. Continuous Development of the Established Municipal Nursery; and
- 85 5. Reforestation Project in Barangay Tanyag as the Proposed Carbon Neutral Area of Calintaan.

86 It was followed by updates on the implementation and compliance of the municipality to Republic Act  
87 9003 or the Ecological Solid Waste Management of 2000 as follows:

- 88 1. Existing Barangay Materials Recovery Facilities (MRFs) reiterating its proper management,
- 89 operation and maintenance re segregated collection from the sources and storage thereof at the
- 90 facility;
- 91 2. Completion of the Safe Closure and Rehabilitation of the Municipal Solid Waste Management
- 92 Facility including the presence of the Municipal Diversion Depot as the center for some diverted
- 93 materials of the LGU;
- 94 3. Ongoing Operation of Municipal Residual Containment Area (RCA) wherein the Municipal
- 95 Collection Personnel of the MENR Office will only collect residual and hazardous/special wastes
- 96 from the Barangay MRFs;
- 97 4. Existence of COVID 19 Health Care Wastes Vault;



5. Stricter Observance of Municipal Segregated Collection of Wastes;
6. Continuous and stricter Implementation of Segregated Collection by the BSWMC; and
7. Employment of two (2) SWM Stewards and three (3) Waste Collection Personnel per Barangay.

Immediately after the presentation of accomplishments and updates, a video documentation of the actual conduct of the above-cited projects was shown. Then, MENRO Delmer Garingalo proceeded with the presentation of partners who have been actively participating in the different projects led by the Task Force. He also shared some of the screenshots and social media posts featuring Task Force Cali-Kasan (TFC) as well as its partnership to different sectors and volunteer organizations within and outside Calintaan. It was mentioned that the visit of the Task Force Tayo ang Kalikasan headed by Executive Director, Ms. Maria Matilda Gaddi, has awoken Municipal and Barangay leaders, as well as the community folks to religiously love environment and natural resources and doing all means for its protection and conservation for the welfare of the present and future generations. This visit was said to be a recognition to LGU Calintaan being one among the local government units in the country in saving the environment from its destruction. He also added that there were video materials produced by Task Force Tayo ang Kalikasan that could be used as IEC materials of the Task Force for a deeper understanding and compliance of the community. He thanked the unwavering and unconditional support to LGU Calintaan in general headed by Forester Efren L. delos Reyes and team for being very hands – on in coaching specially MENRO personnel now and then to achieve a ridge- to – reef ENR protection and conservation.

To be able to understand and better appreciate the aforesaid projects and activities, CENRO Efren L. delos Reyes presented the one-control map comprising specific details of the projects and their areas including the status of apprehension of undocumented lumbers and chainsaw.

## 2. *Observed Issues and Concerns and the Proposed Solutions*

In order to ensure the sustainability of the projects implemented by TFC, regular monitoring, maintenance and protection activities were enumerated and deliberately undertaken. As a result, the team observed the status of the projects including the threats for its sustainability. The observed natural and man - made threats and the proposed solutions were as follows:

- ☐ Hitching of animals closer to the projects
- ☐ Presence of unhitched or astray animals
- ☐ Improper planting by the volunteers
- ☐ Pulling up of the planted bamboo cuttings

The Bamboolution/Anahawin adoption status was presented through a video presentation showing the threats and causes of the mortality of planted bamboos. It was observed that proper execution of planting is an essential factor for its survival, however, its maintenance and protection is in a challenging situation since there are astray animals within the areas surrounding Anahawin River particularly along the projects areas.

The actual survival rate of the planted bamboos was as follows:

- 1. So. Kintangan, Barangay Iriron**
  - Bamboo planted – 200 cuttings
  - No. of survival - 40
  - Survival rate - 19.52%
- 2. So. Tuburan, Barangay Iriron**
  - Bamboo planted – 100 cuttings
  - No. of survival - 24
  - Survival rate - 24%
- 3. So. Marumpungin, Poblacion**
  - Bamboo planted – 120 cuttings
  - No. of survival - 98
  - Survival rate - 81.67%
- 4. Barangay Poypoy**
  - Bamboo planted – 136 cuttings
  - No. of survival - 94
  - Survival rate - 69%



This presentation has caught attention of the TFC's members and were calling one another's plans of action to ensure that everyone's time and effort should not be put in vain and the purpose of the project was still achieved. Therefore, it was requested that the barangay where the project was located has to find means to protect the planted bamboos against all odds. In fact, despite of the very limited funds for this project, this could be called successful due to the observed conditions and the possibility of community resilience in the coming years.

### 3. SGLG Targets for CY 2023

In the continuation of the meeting, MENRO Delmer B. Garingalo presented the SGLG targets for CY 2023 covering the environmental sector. Included were the regular meeting of the Local Solid Waste Management Board, the approved 10-Year Solid Waste Management Plan, Materials Recovery Facilities, Access to Sanitary Landfill Facility, Profiling of Biodiversity conservation and enhancement programs focusing on conservation of inland wetlands and enhancement programs including but not limited to rivers, streams, creeks, springs, waterfalls, lakes, natural ponds and pools, freshwater swamps and marshes, and peatlands, Profiling of Biodiversity conservation and enhancement programs focusing on: public parks and green open spaces, and strengthening of Wildlife Law Enforcement. It was emphasized that the solid waste management was one among the devolved functions of the Barangays and therefore, must be seriously managed through thick and thin. It was also reiterated that the Office of the MENRO has always been in full support as the Barangays perform functions and to make every Barangay a RA 9003 compliant.

### 4. Reconstitution of the Task Force Cali-Kasan

The need to reconstitute the Task Force Cali-Kasan was considered fundamental for the continuous implementation of all Environment and Natural Resources (ENR) programs, projects, and activities even under the new administration. It was discussed that in order to continuously implement the different ENR programs and activities, updating and reconstitution of the Task Force shall be first taken into consideration. It was emphasized that aside from updating the Chairmanship, other members shall be reorganized based on the present officers and representatives per sector. It was also agreed that the members of the Task Force must identify authorized and regular alternates in case of the member's absence during the meeting.

As a result, a Resolution was drafted and critiqued by the members. *Resolution No. 2022-01 also known as the Resolution on the Reconstitution of the Task Force Cali-Kasan with the Inclusion of the Members' Permanent Alternates/Representatives* was moved to be approved on July 20, 2022 on motion of Hon. Daisy T. Gongora and was duly seconded by Hon. Leonora Z. Guiral.

Upon the approval of the said resolution, the Presiding Officer solicited suggestions on the observed threats and issues during the monitoring and maintenance and protection activities conducted to the projects implemented by the Task Force.

The Chairman, Committee on Environment, Hon. Dormido suggested to conduct weekly monitoring of the projects. He said that the Barangay must assign Barangay Tanod or Kagawad to regularly monitor the projects within the Barangay. CENRO mentioned that after the monitoring, a report must be submitted or forwarded to the MENRO. Punong Barangay Gerry Chavez said that he already assigned the monitoring of Marumbol Mangrove Area to the Bantay-Dagat and the community within the area.

SB Dormido also suggested that aside from the barangay concerned, the Task Force must ask for the assistance of the concerned citizen. The discussion focused on finding partners to adopt the projects conjointly maintained and protected by the Task Force. MENRO Garingalo asked for the commitment of the barangay officials to identify partners and volunteer organizations that could possibly adopt the ENR projects of the TF Cali-Kasan.

In order to institutionalize the recommendations, a resolution was again drafted, presented and critiqued. *Resolution No. 2022-02 also known as the Resolution Authorizing the Task Force Cali-Kasan*
