(M&E) REPORT FOR THE SECOND QUARTER CY 2022

The PENRO Planning Section monitored and evaluated the performance of this province for the third quarter CY 2022. Please be informed that majority of the targets for this quarter were satisfactory accomplished with submitted Means of Verifications (MOVs). Worth noting are the following accomplishments which exceeded with the annual targets, such as:

- 1. Issuance of cutting/ harvesting permit and WPP (119/30);
- 2. Forest Revenue Collection (Php. 1,126,254.23 /Php.358,685.00);
- 3. CSC Evaluation (289/230);
- 4. Apprehension of undocumented forest products including NTFPs, vehicles and other implements thru proper channels (11,483.43 bd.ft./ 10,000 bd.ft.);
- 5. Hauling of apprehended forest products (12,319.17 bd.ft./10,000 bd.ft.);
- 6. Integrated Protected Area Fund (Php.90,700.00/Php.50,000.00); and
- 7. Water Users and Water Sources Inventory (28/20).

In view of the recorded backlog on patent issuance, the CENR Offices already processing the submitted applications and it is expected to provide the MOVs not later than October 31, 2022. Under Rapid Land Tenure Appraisal (RLTA), the hired enumerators and CDA are still conducting land tenure profiling for the remaining nine (9) barangays. We have recommended that the concerned sections must exert extra effort and formulate strategies in order to cope up with the backlogs.




Fig. 4 Photos during the monitoring of the on-going construction of nursery facilities of CENRO Roxas under eNGP
