
The following activities are conducted in support of the 59th Fish Conservation Week:


Please be informed that a *tarpapel* (improvised tarpaulin made of paper) was displayed in front of the receiving area of CENRO Socorro Office starting September 14, 2022 until end of the month so that employees as well as the clients and visitors will be informed and aware of the said celebration. The *tarpapel* is used in compliance to the DENR MIMAROPA Regional Special Order No. 219 series of 2022 – Reiteration of the Prohibition on the Use of Styrofoam and Single-use Plastics in DENR MIMAROPA Regional and Field Offices.

Part of the celebration, 10,000 bangus (*Chanos chanos*) fingerlings were dispersed in Naujan Lake particularly part of Barangay Batongdalig, Socorro on September 28, 2022. The activity was initiated by BFAR MIMAROPA and CENRO Socorro thru Naujan Lake National Park – Protected Area Management Office (NLNP-PAMO). This activity aimed to restock fish in the lake to support the biodiversity and economic needs of every stakeholders. The fingerlings were dispersed at least 100 meters from the lakeshore. The activity is also supported under NLNP-PAMB Resolution No. 4, Series of 2021 titled Resolution endorsing the "Balik Sigla sa Ilog at Lawa" (BASIL) Program of Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) MIMAROPA in Naujan Lake National Park (NLNP), whereas, based on the studies conducted by BFAR in Naujan Lake from 1970-1996, fish production trends for endemic, exotic and migratory fishes has been declining, hence, dispersal of native Bangus or Milkfish in the lake has been proposed.


