

SUBJECT : **SUBMISSION OF CY 2022 THIRD QUARTER REPORT ON TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO LGUs ON COASTAL AND MARINE RELATED CONCERNS.**

In compliance with our target activity on Coastal Resource and Foreshore Management Unit (CRFMU) under the Technical Services Division, submitted is the CY 2022 Third Quarter Accomplishment Report.

Pleased be informed that Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) regarding the Provision of Technical Assistance to Local Government Units (LGUs) on coastal and marine related concerns was conducted on August 30, 2022 at around 9:30 in the morning in Barangay Cagpo, Torrijos, Marinduque. The target participants are the LGU Officials and constituents especially the local fisher folks. Resource speakers were from Marinduque State College (MSC) Mr. Regie F. Mampusti, Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) SWEET Michelle S. Macariola and SWEET Jonathan M. Motol, personnel from the Provincial Fisheries Office (PFO) and representative from the Municipal Agriculture Office (MAO).

The activity started with an Opening Prayer followed by singing of the National Anthem. Punong Barangay Ricky L. Robles gave his welcome remarks. FT 1 Corazon R. Pelaez introduced the participants for the said activity and gave an overview about the coastal and marine ecosystem. She informed the participants that Barangay Cagpo, Torrijos, Marinduque is part of the Locally-Managed Marine Protected Areas (LMMPAs) specifically Torrijos Marine Protected Area.

Mr. Regie F. Mampusti from MSC Gasan-School of Fisheries discussed the Management of Marine Protected Area (MPA) and other fishery-related activities. His presentation is about 1) What is Marine Protected Area; 2) Example of MPA in the Philippines; 3) How to manage the Marine Protected Area; 4) Other fishery-related activities and 5) What are the role of academe as state/college in the province. He elaborated that the MPAs in the province are not under NIPAS but rather it is managed by the local government. He also said that RA 8550 was amended by RA 10654 known as the Philippine Fisheries Code. He presented some sample maps of MPA, their boundaries even if it is covered by core zone and buffer zone. He also mentioned the different laws in accordance with their municipal ordinance. He mentioned some possible issues that will be encountered in the establishment of MPA namely, a) lack of supplemental and alternative learning; b) finance mechanism; and c) management capacity development. According to him, some of the coral reefs in the province are poor due to illegal fishing and coral bleaching. He mentioned that the criteria to become an MPA is to have sustainable development goals to conserve and sustain uses of the oceans, seas and marine resources. He said that in 2020, 10% of the marine water should be a part of the protected area. It was also mentioned that the Philippines is a part of the Coral Triangle having the highest marine diversity in the world and has a record of 1,600 MPAs. He emphasized that the Verde Island Passage (VIP) is the world's "center of the center of marine shorefish biodiversity".

Mr. Danny L. Domingo, from the Provincial Fisheries Office discussed about fisheries in relation to coastal and marine ecosystem, importance of Marine Protected Area and Fisheries Code and the Legal Basis, Ordinance and National Law on how to protect and conserve coastal and aquatic resources. He also explained the RA 10654 also known as an Act to Prevent and Eliminate Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated Fishing and elaborated the punishment on illegal fishing and other illegal activities. The participants were able to identify the current issues and fishing practices that should not be tolerated.

Solid Waste Enforcers and Educators Team (SWEET) Environmental Monitoring Officer (EnMO) Jonathan M. Motol of EMB Marinduque about the different types and categories of waste, and the corresponding disposal. He enumerated the fines and penalties that offenders will have to pay upon violation of the RA 9003. He informed the participants on the current status of the dumpsites in the province, as well as the activities being conducted in monitoring and evaluating the disposal system of each municipality. He also showed pictures of the model dumpsites in other areas and how Marinduque Province are also aiming to achieve the same.

After the said of lecturer, an open forum, issues and concerns that had been aired/raised were properly addressed and explained by the concerned presenter. The resource speakers were acknowledged for their time and effort imparting knowledge to the participants. Their lectures provided necessary information and details for the participants to have a better understanding of the existing laws and how they affect the behaviour of the individuals that are benefiting from the coastal and marine resources, and especially in the protection and conservation of marine protected areas. It was agreed that a separate CEPA be conducted in Barangay Cagpo solely as the implementation of ESWM project/program in response to the request of the Sangguniang Barangay of Cagpo headed by Punong Barangay Ricky L. Robles.




