In compliance with our CY 2022 target activity on Social Marketing and Mobilization re: celebration of International Coastal Clean-up, respectfully submitted is the accomplishment report regarding the above-cited subject.

Presidential Proclamation No. 470 issued in 2003 declared the third Saturday of September each year as the International Coastal Clean-up Day in the Philippines. This year's ICC theme is "Fighting for Trash Free Seas – Pilipinas: Ending the Flow of Trash at the Source" adopted from the Ocean Conservancy with practical solutions that empower people, strengthen science, engage everyone in solutions and promote good policies.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) – Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (PENRO)-Marinduque celebrated the International Coastal Clean-Up (ICC) through coastal clean-up activity and Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA).

The activity was started at around 6:30 in the morning on September 14, 2022. The venue on the said activity is within the selected barangays in the Municipality of Gasan, namely, Barangays Banuyo, Antipolo and Pinggan, Gasan, Marinduque. Participants from the National Agencies, Local Government Units (LGUs), Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), Civil Society Organizations, Law Enforcers and stakeholders actively participated. A total of 175 volunteers comprising 78 females and 97 males participated in the event. The DENR-PENRO, Marinduque spearheaded the conduct of coastal clean-up and Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) activity. Before the conduct of coastal clean-up activity, Forester Jelomy H. Mahayag gave short briefing about the said activity.

In collaborative effort of the participants, the clean-up activity was successfully done. During the clean-up activity, it was noticed that the identified site for the clean-up have lot of garbage/wastes composed of agricultural waste and the waste that came from settlers near the coastal area such are plastic bottles, diapers, food wrappers and fishing gears. According to the BLGU officials some of the wastes/garbage are from their adjacent barangays/provinces when the southwest monsoon comes. Based on the Volunteers Ocean

Trash Data Forms, a total of 24 sacks (9,635 pieces) of the non-biodegradable waste were collected from 3.9 kilometers coastal areas of the three barangays.

Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) was conducted after the clean-up activity. The venue of this event is in barangay hall of Pinggan, Gasan, Marinduque. The objective of the activity is to recognize our partner stakeholders in the implementation of ENR Laws and discussion on ***“Ecological Solid Waste Management (R.A. 9003)” and “Tayo ang Kalikasan”***.

During the opening prayer, PS Jomari Sore representative of Mayor Rolando O. Tolentino of Gasan and PB Danilo L. Apostol of *Barangay Pinggan, Gasan, Marinduque* gave them welcome remarks. PB Bernabe Sadiwa of *Barangay Banuyo, Gasan* gave his sincere support and gratitude, first of all to the Lord and the implementer of cleaning and caring our mother nature. He said that one of the biggest problem in coastal area are the garbage/waste not only in the Philippines but in the whole world. Ms. Madona P. Corado, *Chief of Regional Strategic Communication Initiative Group (RSCIG)* discussed the objective of the activity. According to her, this activity have been doing for thirty six (36) years and originated in United State of America (USA) together with the volunteers to clean the coastal areas. To mobilize the citizenry to be a partner cleaning and protecting a nature.

Regional Executive Director Lormelyn E. Claudio, CESO IV, gave an inspirational message. She gave thanks the full support of the participants specially the law enforcers, national agencies and also the media who participated in the coastal clean-up. She said that we have been doing it for 36 years, but the waste is still there and it still cannot be solved. They need to be a positive influencer and start it in our home. She also promoted the “NO TO SINGLE USE PLASTIC”. Marinduque is such a beautiful place to promote ecotourism so let’s continue to take care and protect especially solid and hazardous waste. Conduct continue Information Education Communication Campaign (IEC) to know the volume and practices on household, influence the behaviour about nature conservation. She encouraged everyone to clean the coastal area and practice proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment and disposal of solid waste by formulating the best environmental practice in Ecological Solid Waste Management, Act of 2000 also known as Republic Act 9003.

Awarding of Certificate of Appreciation and Recognition was awarded to our partners/stakeholders by our Regional Executive Director Lormelyn E. Claudio for their active support in the implementation of “Ecological Solid Waste Management Act or the RA 9003 and no to single use plastic”.

The *Chief, Regional Environment Education and Information Unit, EMB-MIMAROPA*, Ms. Mabelle M. Manalo, discussed about the RA 8479, known as The Clean Air Act; RA 9275, The Clean Water Act; RA 6969, Toxic Substances and Hazardous Wastes Act; RA 9003, The Ecological Solid Waste Management Act; and PD 1568, Environmental Impact Statement System.

Ms. Madonna P. Corado, discussed “Tayo ang Kalikasan” and promoted the practice of proper waste segregation and further mention that all of us must observed the “No To Single Use Plastic” in the Province of Marinduque.

As a closing remarks by the Chief, Technical Services Division Engr. Cynthia U. Lozano. She thank those who persevered to participate, the resource speakers and she hope that the said CEPA and coastal clean-up activity they learned more about the conservation and protection of our environment.

With the conduct of coastal clean-up and CEPA, was a challenge to the Local Government Units (LGUs) and Law Enforcers on how can they properly manage the solid waste when it comes along the coastal area.
