The team monitored and assessed the area of the United Marinduqueians, Inc. from September 20 to September 23, 2022.

### II. BACKGROUND


The Socialized Industrial Forest Management Agreement (SIFMA) is an agreement entered into by and between a natural or judicial person and the DENR wherein the latter grants to the former the right to develop, utilize and manage a small tract of forestland consistent with the principle of sustainable development. (DENR Administrative Order No. 96-24).

The United Marinduqueñians, Inc. represented by Ms. Ellen s. Yarisantos, a community-based organization, is a holder of SIFMA which was issued on June 10, 2010, and will expire on June 10, 2035. The agreement with number SIFMA R4B-11-2010 has an approximate area of Three hundred sixty-nine (369) hectares of public forest lands located in the Barangays of Tabionan, Antipolo and Banuyo, Gasan, Marinduque.

Before the compliance monitoring and assessment of the tenured area, the team coordinated with the Barangay Official of Bachao-Ibaba. Gasan to inquire the house of Ms. Ginalyn L. Selva, staff of Ms. Ellen S. Yarisantos. The team discussed the rationale of the activity with Ms. Selva and Ms. Yarisantos via teleconferences and requested assistance from the members of UMI during the ocular inspection.

### III. FINDINGS

- 1. Ms. Ellen S. Yarisantos disclosed some issues within the organization and some factors affecting the management and development of the SIFMA area. Subsequently, despite these issues and concerns the organization continue the development of the SIFMA area.
- 2. Accordingly, the holder planted some forest trees like Rubber tree, Gmelina and Narra. At first, they planted seedlings of Rubber tree, however, due to some typhoon that hit the province these were damaged. They shift from Rubber tree to Narra and Gmelina which they think is more resilient during typhoons. During the planting activity, the UMI hired

The Socialized Industrial Forest Management Agreement (SIFMA) is an agreement entered into by and between a natural or judicial person and the DENR wherein the latter grants to the former the right to develop, utilize and manage a small tract of forestland consistent with the principle of sustainable development. (DENR Administrative Order No. 96-24).

The United Marinduqueñians, Inc. represented by Ms. Ellen s. Yarisantos, a community-based organization, is a holder of SIFMA which was issued on June 10, 2010, and will expire on June 10, 2035. The agreement with number SIFMA R4B-11-2010 has an approximate area of Three hundred sixty-nine (369) hectares of public forest lands located in the Barangays of Tabionan, Antipolo and Banuyo, Gasan, Marinduque.

Before the compliance monitoring and assessment of the tenured area, the team coordinated with the Barangay Official of Bachao-Ibaba. Gasan to inquire the house of Ms. Ginalyn L. Selva, staff of Ms. Ellen S. Yarisantos. The team discussed the rationale of the activity with Ms. Selva and Ms. Yarisantos via teleconferences and requested assistance from the members of UMI during the ocular inspection.

- 1. Ms. Ellen S. Yarisantos disclosed some issues within the organization and some factors affecting the management and development of the SIFMA area. Subsequently, despite these issues and concerns the organization continue the development of the SIFMA area.
- 2. Accordingly, the holder planted some forest trees like Rubber tree, Gmelina and Narra. At first, they planted seedlings of Rubber tree, however, due to some typhoon that hit the province these were damaged. They shift from Rubber tree to Narra and Gmelina which they think is more resilient during typhoons. During the planting activity, the UMI hired

workers from other provinces, particularly in Mindanao and some residents of Barangay Tabionan, Gasan.

- 3. During the interview with Ms. Yarisantos, the team asked if they are willing and interested to continue the management and development of the area which was answered positively by the holders. They are still interested in managing and developing the SIFMA area.
- 4. The team reminds the holder that to qualify for renewal of the agreement or to avoid the preemptive cancelation of the tenurial instrument they need to comply with the provision stipulated in the agreement specifically the Annual Report, payment of annual rental fee and compliance to any instruction that will emanate from the Regional Office or PENRO Marinduque.
- 5. Ms. Yarisantos assures the team that they will convene and meet her co-holders regarding the said matters. The team also informed Ms. Ginalyn Selva that this Office would send a formal letter to the holder in connection with the said matter for their information.
- 6. The team was accompanied and assisted by Mr. Jimmy Mendeja, one of the workers of Ms. Ellen S. Yarisantos in planting forest trees like Narra and Gmelina trees within the area together with Mr. Edwin Selva, husband of Ms. Ginalyn L. Selva.
- 7. Per inspection and verification conducted, the team found that the area was planted with Narra and Gmelina. Said trees were already matured and already harvestable. Mr. Mendeja disclosed that they started to plant Narra and Gmelina seedlings in an elevated/high portion of the SIFMA area. In addition, the undersigned found that a portion of the area is planted with coconut palms, "palay" and fruit-bearing trees like mangoes and lanzones. Likewise, some portion of the SIFMA area is vegetated with grass, cogon, and naturally growing trees like Lauan, Maligango and Ipil-Ipil.

### IV. REMARKS AND RECOMMENDATIONS


