PROJECT HELD ON SEPTEMBER 6 TO 9, 2022

Forwarded is the memorandum dated October 14, 2022 of PASu of Mounts Iglit-Baco Natural Park (MIBNP) regarding submission of Accomplishment Report on the conducted Law Enforcement Training under the Biodiversity Conservation and Management of Protected Area (BCAMP) Project held on September 6 to 9, 2022. The activities was conducted in compliance with the approved Work and Financial Plan of Biodiversity Conservation and Management of Protected Areas in ASEAN (BCAMP) Project and to capacitate MIBNP field personnel in law enforcement and administration.

The training aims to strengthen the technical knowledge and skills of MIBNP personnel on relevant environmental and wildlife laws and enforcement procedures. The event was attended by forty-seven (47) participants composed of forty-one (41) male and six (6) female. The following topics were presented and discussed during the training:

- 1. Module 1: Applicable Laws and Policies in Protected Areas (RA 7586, RA 11038, RA 7160, RA 8371, RA 7611, and PD 705;
- 2. Module 2: Jurisdictional and Operational Mechanism in Protected Area Law Enforcement;
- 3. Module 3: Operations;
- 4. Module 4: Approaches in Actual Environmental Law Enforcement Operations;
- 5. Module 5: Case Buildup and Litigation; and
- 6. Module 6: Legal Forms and affidavits
