Based on the results of the monitoring, the team have noted some observations and recommendations for the improvement of SBBM facilities.



Respectfully submitting the report on the assistance to field validation and monitoring of Biodiversity-Friendly Enterprise (BDFE) of Samahan sa Bakawanan ng Barangay Maidlang (SBBM).

Prior on the conduct of monitoring, the Sanguniang Barangay and Samahan sa Bakawanan ng Barangay Maidlang (SBBM) conducted meeting regarding turn-over ceremony of the new set of Officials. Based on the meeting, the former President Mr. Labay turned-over all the documents of SBBM to the newly elected President Mr. Ricky Alcantara.

The Sangguniang Barangay represented their full support to the PO. The meeting went well on the members of the PO and the Sagguniang Barangay were inited to improve the management of the project particularly the facilitites.

On September 16, 2022, this Office assisted the BMB personnel in the conduct of monitoring in the area. After some interviews with the members, the team came up with some observation and recommendations, to wit:






Figure 2. Coordination and interview with the SBBM Official


Figure 4. Loose and broken handrails and flooring of boardwalk.


