

### I. EVALUATION OF THE COURSE

Technical Content:

Component 2: Application of integrated network design and management of biodiversity corridors.

Indicator 9: Number of regional, provincial and local plans that mainstream objectives of integrated ecosystem management (IEM) within the biodiversity corridors: RDIPs, PPFPs, CLUPs/CDPs, ADSPPs

Output 2.1 Integrated ecosystem management framework developed and adopted for two biodiversity corridors

Activity 2.1.4. Organization of, and support to multi-sectoral corridor advisory committees through co-facilitation of the R/DENR, R/NEDA, and PLGUs concerned.

The CAAC was created by the Regional Development Council MIMAROPA Council of the Whole Meeting on June 2, 2023 under Resolution # No. 2023-082-1180 (*Approving the Creation of the Corridor Alliance Advisory Committee for the Mindoro Biodiversity Corridor Project*).

It's launching and 1<sup>st</sup> Organizational Meeting approved its Rules of Procedures and schedule of its quarterly meetings starting in 2024. It also discussed the Integrated Ecosystem Management Framework and the Island Ecosystem Approach presented by Dr. Ernesto Guiang, NPMU Consultant and Dr. Marius Agua, representing Calapan City Mayor Morillo, respectively. Based on the RDC Resolution, its main functions include the following:

- a) Ensure commitment, support, and participation to the BD Corridor Project especially on activities where a specific member agency/ies is/are needed;
- b) Develop a common understanding of strategic issues and opportunities in the Mindoro corridor and provide guidance on the resolution of issues identified within the corridor and during the implementation of the BD Corridor Project;
- c) Develop consensus on outstanding vision priorities, strategies and actual conservation targets based on situational analysis that use updated information on environment and natural resources trends;  
Adopt a recommended land use framework and High Conservation Value (HCV)-based IEM implementation plan for the corridor that will guide the development of mandated regional or provincial land use plans;
- d) Leverage funding, co-financing, and private sector and impact investments in the Mindoro corridor consistent with the HCV-based IEM framework and implementation plans;



- e) Recommend activities, interventions, and mechanisms towards the attainment of the BD Corridor Project's objectives;
- f) Launch a corridor advocacy campaign for multi-sectoral corridor alliance to achieve corridor targets.

## **II. RELEVANCE OF THE LEARNING EVENT TO PARTICIPANT'S WORK/FUNCTION**

The CAAC is a mechanism that institutionalizes the BD Corridor and its framework and approaches and concepts promoting sustainable development and improving life on land, addressing climate crisis through sustainable land and forest management, biodiversity-friendly enterprises, ecotourism, improving management effectiveness in Protected Areas and identification of local conservation areas (under LGUs management) and Other effective area-based conservation measures (OECM). Through the CAAC, the Mindoro Biodiversity Corridor Project can demonstrate and promote the above framework and sustainable practices to other provinces in the MIMAROPA region. The co-chair of the CAAC is Romblon Gov. Riano together with the 2 governors of Occidental and Oriental Mindoro who can help champion the BD Corridor.

## **III. RECOMMENDATIONS**

There is a need to strengthen the CAAC secretariat. Per RDC resolution, MBC acts as the Secretariat. There is also a need to strengthen the coordinating mechanism of the Secretariat with the CAAC members to have efficient and productive quarterly meetings.




