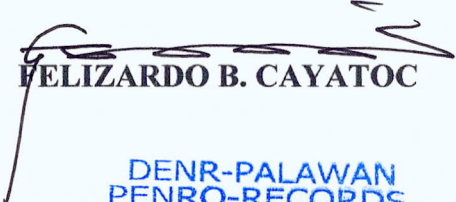

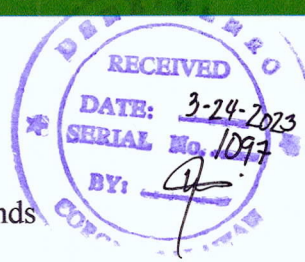

With the implementation of the Lawin Monitoring and Patrolling System, respectfully submitted is the detailed report of the Busuanga Pasture Reserve Management Office (BPRMO) on the results of the Lawin monitoring and patrolling conducted in the Municipalities of Coron and Busuanga, Palawan within the BPR area for the month of March 2023.

I. Findings and Result

Two (2) Patrol Teams are dispatched during the conduct of this activity within the Forest Conservation Area (FCA) of BPR situated in the Municipalities of Coron and Busuanga, Palawan. The target distance for the month of March 2023 is 30 kilometers (km) based on the Lawin Patrol Plan for the 1st Quarter of 2023. For clarifications, there is no Lawin activity on January 2023 by the BPRMO personnel since all of the personnel/patrollers were not yet renewed until February 2023. In order to compensate the target distance of 30 km for the month of January 2023, the BPRMO personnel adjusted the target for the month of March from 30 km to 60 km. As a result, the patrol of BPRMO personnel for the month of March 2023, patrollers were able to traverse an aggregate distance of 67.40 km or 224.67 % and the overall target accomplishment included the month for January is 112.33% (Table 1).

**The accomplishment rate is computed based on the 30 kilometer target per CENRO/CA per month compared to the sum of the distance patrolled per CENRO/CA.*

Table 2 shows a total of 825 Forest Condition Counts (FCCs) recorded during the patrolling. Open-Uncultivated (OUC) appears to have the highest figure recorded for March 2023 with 329 counts or 40%, while Old Growth Forest (OGF) has the least recorded observation with 27 counts or 3%. The remaining forest conditions such as Advanced Secondary Forest (ASF), Early Secondary Forest (ESF) and Open-Cultivated (OC) with corresponding total figures of 115 (14%), 215 (26%), and 139 (17%), respectively. Based on the SMART analysis, the total FC with the good condition has a total count of 357 or 43% which includes OGF, ASF, and ESF.

For the presence of natural regenerants, 449 FCCs or 54% of the total FCC was recorded with the presence of natural regenerants while 376 FCCs or 46% were with the absence of natural regenerants. There were eleven (11) or 1% recorded dense natural regenerant, while two hundred twenty-one (221) FCCs or 27% and two hundred seventeen (217) or 26% recorded as moderate and sparse natural regenerants, respectively (Table 3).

Table 4 shows the observed and recorded threats within the FCA of BPR. A total of fifteen (15) threats were observed and recorded during the Lawin Patrolling for the month of March and this were accounted to nine (9) slash and burn farming (kaingin), four (4) cutting of trees, one (1) charcoal making and one (1) non-timber forest product.

As can be viewed from the map in Annex C, the threats observed/documented in the FCA during the month of March 2023 are found in Barangays of San Nicolas, Guadalupe, Decalachao, Coron and Barangays of Bogtong, Sagrada, San Rafael, Old Busuanga, and New Busuanga, Busuanga, Palawan. The current threat index for this month was computed as 0.22 threats per kilometer (T/Km). However, the value can change since the target patrol distance were adjusted from 30 km to 60 km to compensate the target for the month of January 2023 as indicated in Part I.

II. Future Actions

As initial action of the BPRMO on the threats observed/ recorded during the conduct of Lawin activity, will send a communication letters to the concerned barangays for their information regarding the illegal activities in their area within BPR.

III. Remarks and Recommendations

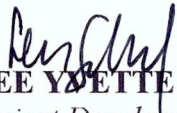
1. Frequency of the visibility of patrolling and Lawin monitoring within the Forest Conservation Area of BPR is being intensified to include weekends, if necessary, in order to prevent and immediately address any possible threats within the forested areas of BPR;
2. As stipulated in the future actions, will send letter addressed to the concerned Barangays with a record of threats observed in every conduct of Lawin patrolling and monitoring to inform and assists them if it requires urgent action;
3. Observed unlawful activities on the ground are being thoroughly investigated and documented and filing of appropriate criminal complaints against the offenders pursuant to Presidential Decree No. 705 and other environmental laws, if so warrant;
4. For this year, this office is targeting the conduct of seminar/IEC to the Local Government Unit (LGUs)/Sangguniang Bayan for information of unlawful activities within the area covered by the BPR in their municipality; to provide awareness and possible collaboration for crafting possible solutions on the recorded illegal activities;
5. Conduct of rehabilitation activities such as tree planting, enrichment planting and assisted natural regeneration to maintain and accelerate the recovery of forest cover; and

6. The BPRMO will communicate through Lawin Helpdesk for the deletion of error patrol data which was synched to the SMART Connect of the BPR.

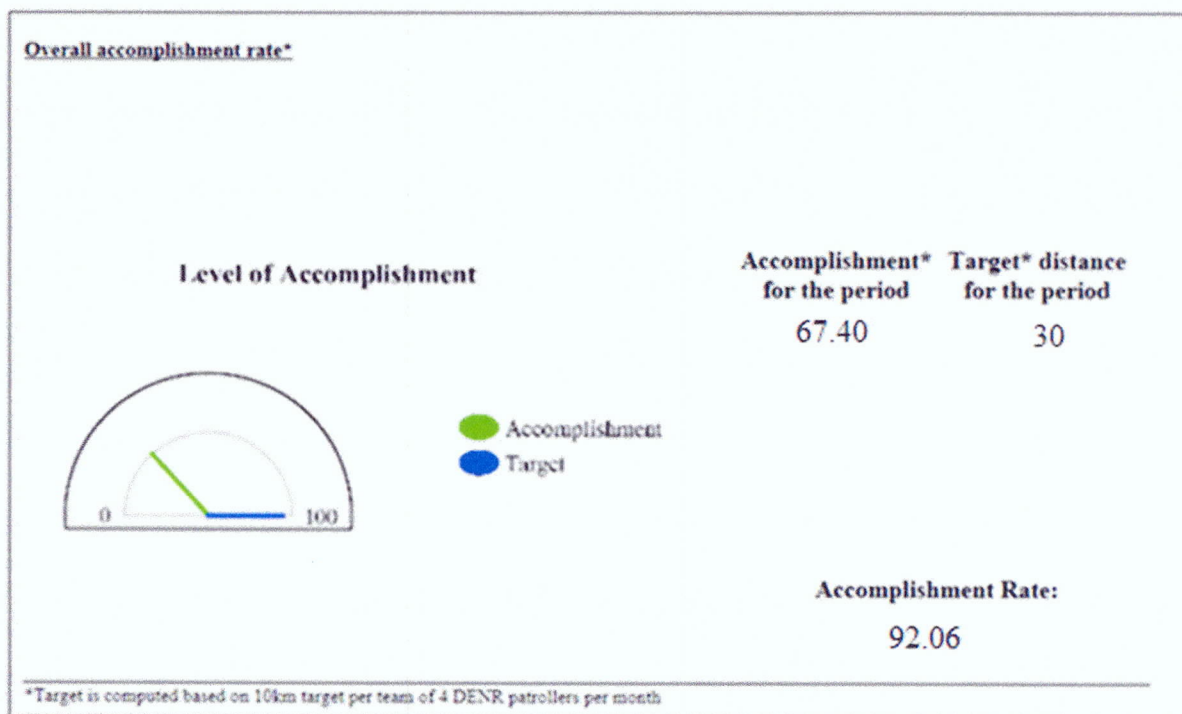

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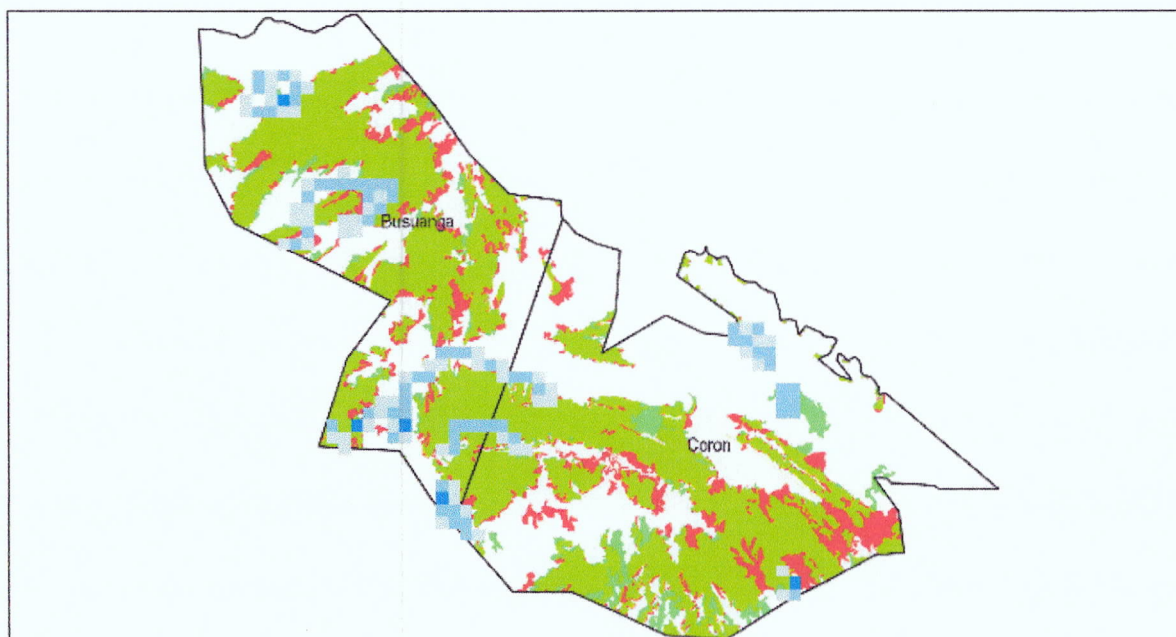

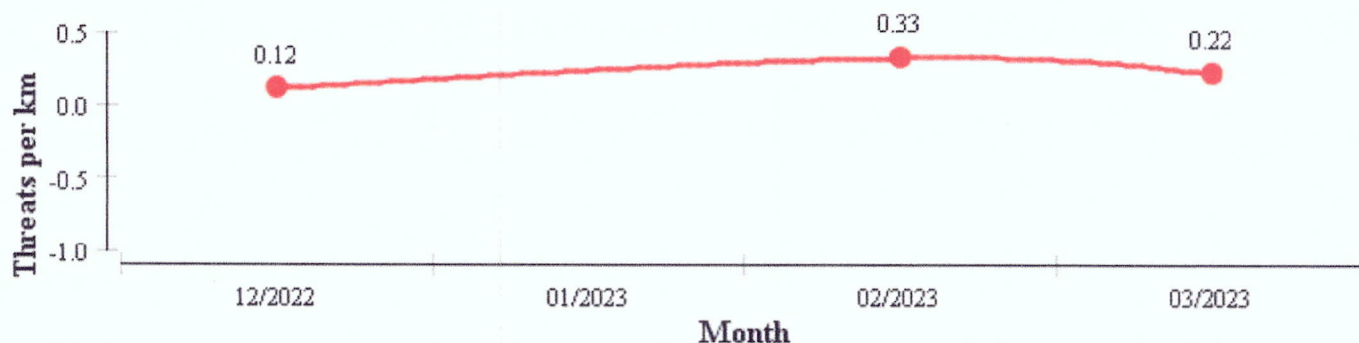

This reports presents trends in observations of forest condition, regeneration, threats and indicator species. The combined presentation allows for an evaluation if protection efforts are effective, conservation targets are met and the forest achieves the desired future forest condition. Protection efforts are effective, when records of forest condition, regeneration and indicator species show an upward trend towards more observations more and denser regeneration, particularly in degraded forest areas. Increasing trends in indicator species suggest that the improved forest condition is providing a better habitat for forest dependent species. All trends presented are put in relation to the patrol effort to provide comparability. Forest cover data were derived from 2003 and 2010 NAMRIA land cover maps.

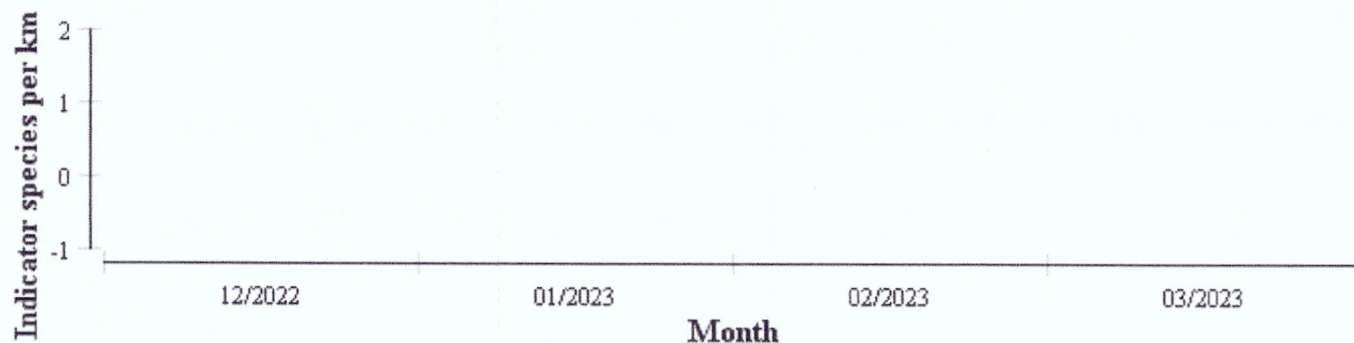
Trends of Observations per Patrol Kilometer in the Forest Conservation Area

Trend in Threats



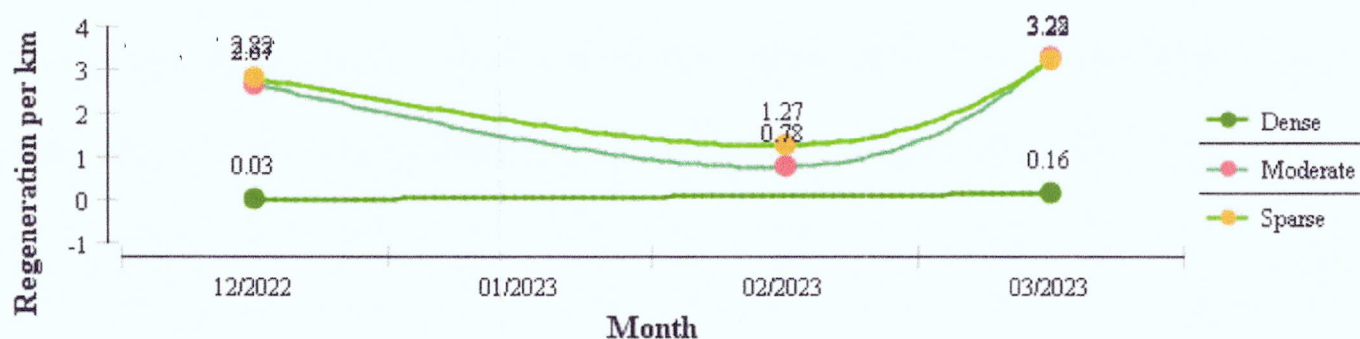
A decreasing trend in threats in the forest conservation area mean effective forest protection; an increasing trend means the opposite.

Trend in Indicator Species



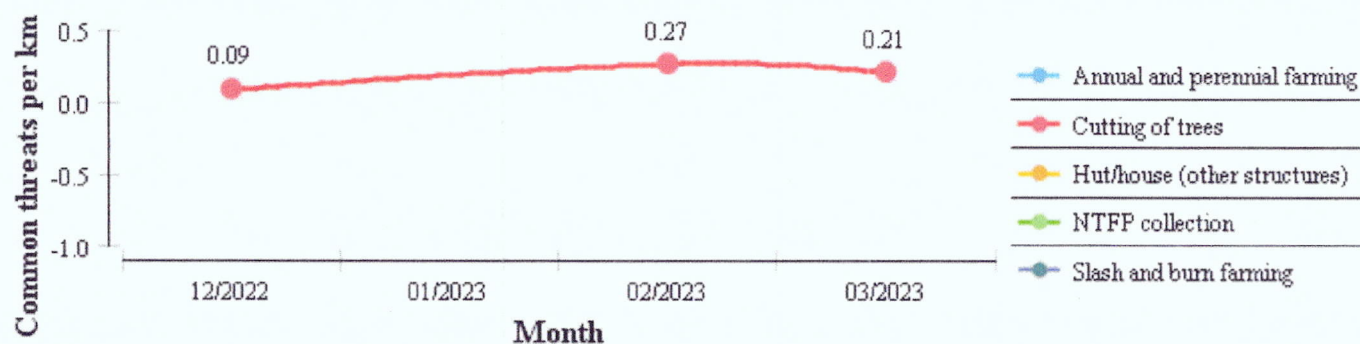
An increasing trend in indicator species in the forest conservation area means effective forest protection; a decreasing trend means the opposite.

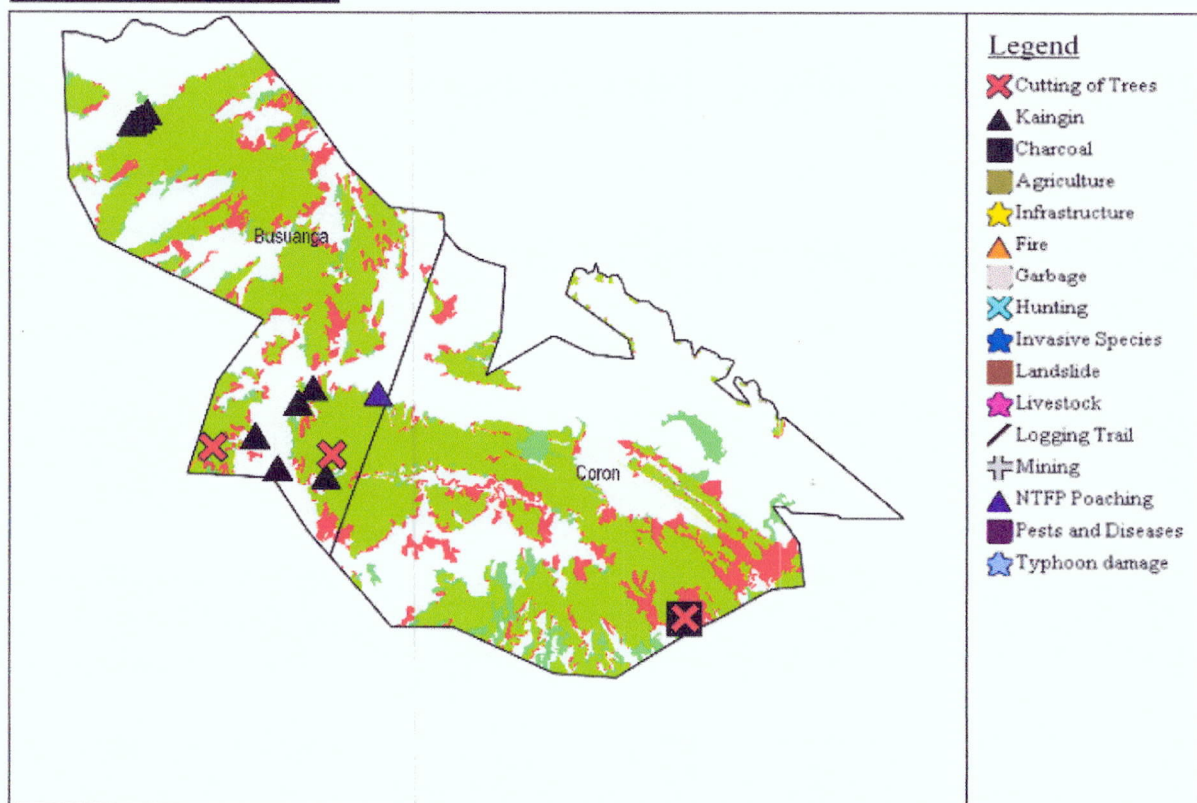

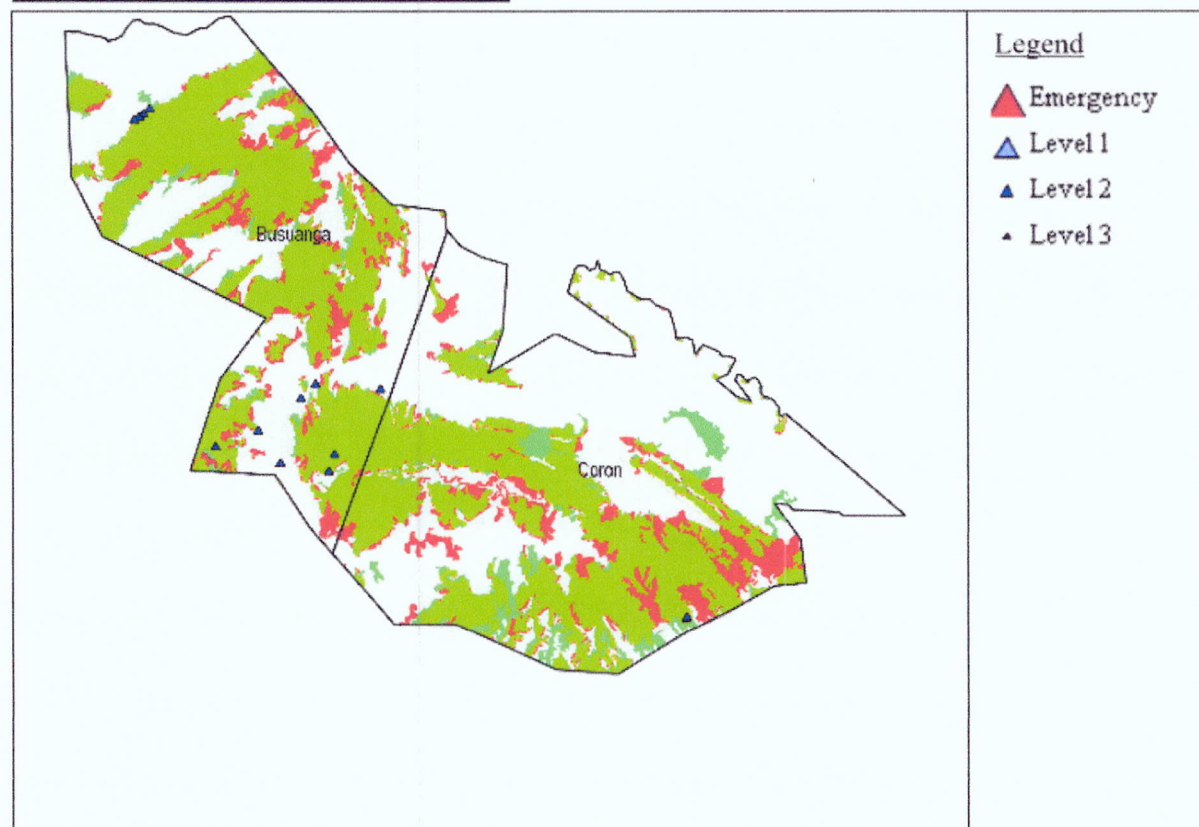

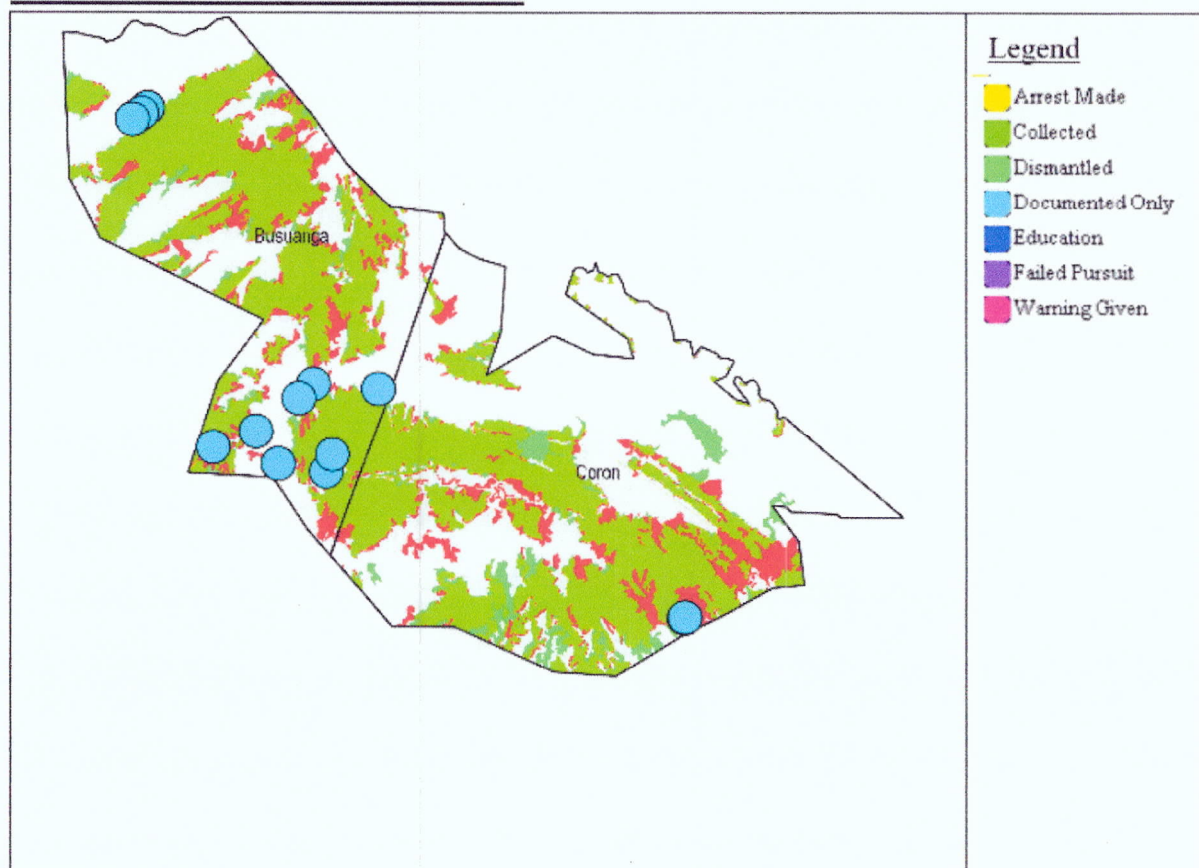
Location of observed threats



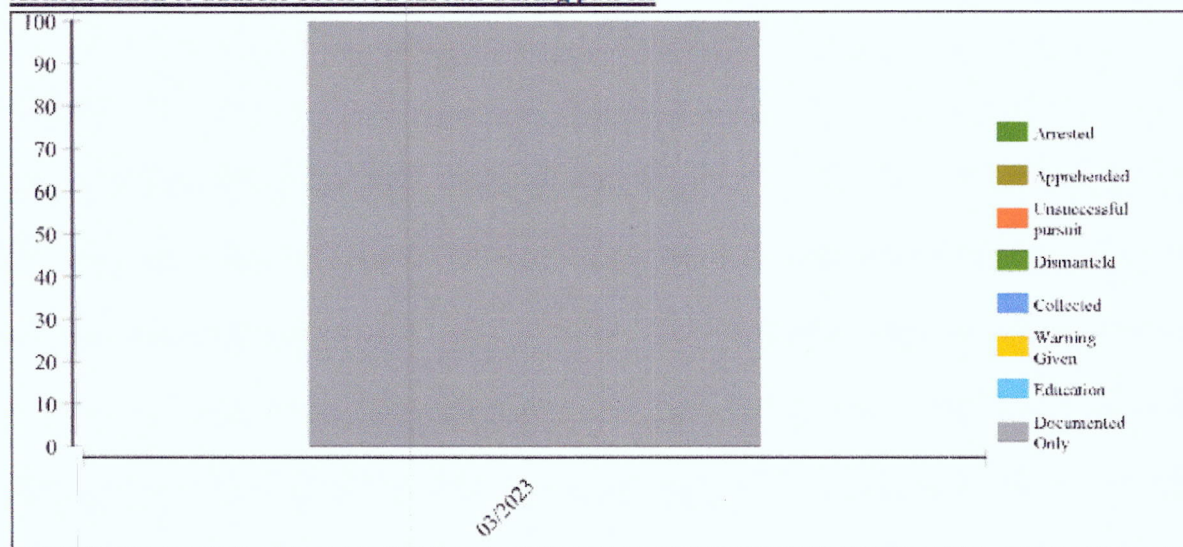
Locations and urgency of responses needed



Locations of actions taken to address threats

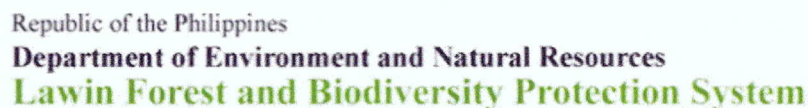


Actions taken to address observed threats during patrols
