## 2023 FIRST QUARTER ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT ON

#### 2. IEC AND ADVOCACY

#### CONDUCT OF DALAW TURO

For CY 2023, TCP have three (3) target activity of Conduct of Dalaw Turo for the First Quarter. Three (3) *Dalaw Turo* was conducted on First Quarter as accomplishment of the said activity.

## Methodology:

The basic procedure employed in carrying out the *Dalaw-Turo* included the following: (1) coordination to the target schools in Occidental MIndoro; and (2) preparation of the *Dalaw-Turo* program. The program included a combination of the informal teaching methods such a lectures on Biodiversity, Tamaraw and Tamaraw Conservation Program, film showing and games.

#### Participants, Date and Venue:

The *Dalaw-Turo* activity was conducted in San Jose, Occidental at the following Schools and participants:

- January 23, 2023 at San Jose National High School, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro.; participated by eighty (80) students composed of thirty-four (34) males and forty-six (46) females;
- February 8, 2023 at Ambulong Island Integrated School, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro; participated by fourteen (14) public school teachers composed of three (3) males and eleven (11) females;
- February 10, 2023 at Iling National High School, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro; participated by forty-three (43) public school teachers and students composed of eight (8) males and thirty-five (35) females;

### **Program Proper:**

#### A. Opening Program

The *Dalaw-Turo* started with a short opening ceremony (prayer and singing of Philippine National Anthem) thru AVP Presentation followed by the welcome address of Teacher-In-Charge per schools. The program facilitated by TCP-Planning Staff Rona Jean B. Gacusan.

## B. Summary of the course outline

The *Dalaw-Turo* activity in the said community was consist of lectures, games and giving of information materials such as twenty-five (25) brochures as twenty-five (25) leaflets to the host schools.

## C. Lectures

### Tamaraw and The Tamaraw Conservation Program

One of the *Dalaw-Turo* team member presented the Tamaraw and The Tamaraw Conservation Program. This lecture aimed to:

- a. Understand the background information of the Tamaraw and the Tamaraw Conservation Program;
- b. Describe a Tamaraw and identify their distribution and their general behavior;
- c. Enumerate the program components and accomplishments of the Tamaraw Conservation Program, and;
- d. Understand the laws and policies governing the Tamaraw, other wildlife and the Environment in general.

## Mindoro Biodiversity

At this part, one of the *Dalaw-Turo* team member discussed first the presentation "When and Where Mindoro Island originated" which was followed by the concepts Mindoro Biodiversity, importance, uses and functions and the threats confronting the biodiversity in order to inculcate consciousness to the audience about the environmental issues.

#### D. Games

To maintain the interest of the participants in the activity, environmental games were conducted as ice breaker after the lectures. The teachers and students actively participated in the games "Tamaraw Quiz", and other games such as finding your mate and recycling..

#### E. Culminating

Before the closing program, the TCP *Dalaw-Turo* Team distributed information materials such as brochures and leaflets about the Biodiversity, Tamaraw and the Tamaraw Conservation Program. The TCP team expressed their gratitude to all the participants and hoped that they understood and appreciated the importance of biodiversity and value the environmental conservation in Mindoro especially using the Tamaraw as the flagship species.

An open forum was held before the end of the program wherein participants shared their experiences and asked questions about the Tamaraw and biodiversity.
