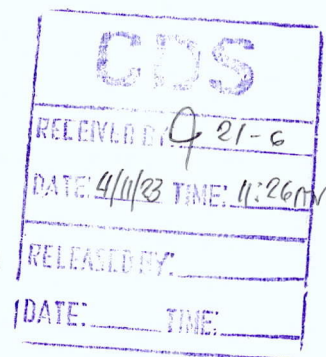
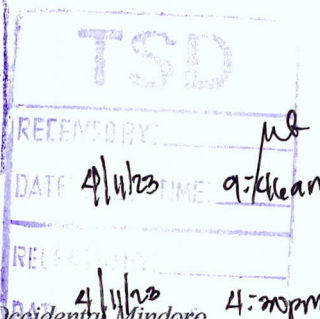
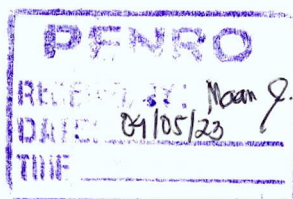

4. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF WILDLIFE RESCUE CENTER

On the maintenance of the Wildlife Rescue Center, TCP have a quarterly target of number of animals rescued, maintained and or released. From December 16, 2022 to March 15, 2023 there are thirteen animals that are currently under rehabilitation (Table 1), 2 rescued animals, and 1 released to the wild.

IV. Routine activities

A. Food preparation of wildlife that are currently under rehabilitation.

- Preparation of live poultry for crocodilian species
- Preparation of omnivorous diet and protein supplementation for testudines.
- Preparation of lean meat for the raptors and supplementation of feathers and calcium for the raptors under rehabilitation.
- Preparation of raw fish, liver and other proteins for the varanids.
- Preparation of legumes and grass for the Philippine deer, and also supplementing its diet with salt and lime.

- f. Collection of fruits and other roughage such as Madre de cacao, Ipil, dioscorea and etc. for the macaque.

B. Maintenance of enclosures and facilities.

- a. Cleaning and repair of the Philippine deer enclosure.
- b. Weather proofing animal enclosures.
- c. Draining and washing of turtle and crocodile enclosures.
- d. Daily grass trimming and weed removal.
- e. Checking of the perimeter fence.
- f. Patrolling the area.
- g. Maintaining the cleanliness of facilities.

C. Routine Animal Health assessment.

- a. Weakly Physical examination
- b. Deworming
- c. Vaccination of raptors
- d. Fecalysis and hematology
- e. Wound debridement and wound repair (*Varanus bangonorum*)
- f. Radio-ulnar joint realignment surgery.


