

SUBJECT : **REPORT ON THE CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING ON PROTECTED AREA POLICIES FOR THE PAMO-MSPLS PERSONNEL FOR MALAMPAYA SOUND PROTECTED LANDSCAPE AND SEASCAPE (MSPLS), TAYTAY-SAN VICENTE, PALAWAN**

This pertains to the target activity on PAMB Operationalization item 5.a Capacity Building under Protected Area Management and Development for Malampaya Sound Protected Landscape and Seascape (MSPLS), Taytay-San Vicente, Palawan.

Please be informed that on March 28-29, 2023, the Protected Area Management Office – MSPLS together with Conservation and Development Section (CDS) conducted the Capacity Building Training on Protected Area Policies for PAMO-MSPLS personnel. The activity was conducted based on the results of the Training Needs Assessment (TNA) for MSPLS - Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) personnel conducted last CY 2022 which identified the learning intervention needed by the PAMO personnel to effectively managed the protected area.

The overall objective of the activity is the continuous capacitation of the PAMO-MSPLS personnel through the provision of training on salient provisions of DAO No. 2004-32 “PACBRMA and its governing guidelines, DAO 2007-17 “Special Use Agreement in Protected Areas (SAPA), RA 11038 ENIPAS and DAO 2019-05 as its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) focusing on Section 5, PA Dis/Establishment Process; Sec 12, Environmental Impact Assessment, and Sec. 24, Facilities within PA.

The Capacity Building training for the PAMO-MSPLS personnel was conducted to enhance the knowledge of the personnel on Protected Area policies that could help them in the day to day operation and management of the protected area. Specifically, the activity aims to:

1. Provide the participants basic knowledge on Special Use Agreement in Protected Areas (SAPA) including process flow, evaluation of documents and computation of annual fees;
2. To familiarize the participants with the legal definition of tenured migrants and the process of issuance of Protected Area Community Based Resource Management Agreement (PACBRMA);
3. To enhance the knowledge of the participants on Protected Area Dis/Establishment Process (Sec. 5 of DAO 2019-05);
4. To gain deeper understanding of legal easement in accordance with Sec. 24 of DAO 2019-05, inventory of existing facilities within PA and other related laws and policies; and

5. To provide knowledge to the participants on Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), processes and online application.

On March 28, 2023, the undersigned presented DAO No. 2004-32 "PACBRMA and its governing guidelines to the participants. During her presentation, she discussed the salient features of PACBRMA including the qualification of applicants, scope and coverage, processes including the assistance provided by the PAMO and CENR Office to the interested Indigenous community and organized tenured migrant. The application, processing and approval were also discussed to familiarize the participants with the process. The undersigned highlighted the definition of the tenured migrant or tenured migrant communities in order for the participants to fully understand who are the tenured migrants

On the afternoon session, PA Superintendent Clarissa P. Pador presented the DAO 2007-17 "Special Use Agreement in Protected Areas (SAPA). She discussed the salient features of SAPA including who may apply, list of requirements, fees and highlighted that SAPA can only be given within the multiple use zones of the protected area. She also discussed how to compute SAPA fees to guide the PAMO personnel on the proper computation. Participants were given several practice drill to familiarize them with SAPA fees computation. Also, PASu Pador discussed with the participants on how to evaluate SAPA application. She guided the participants on how to evaluate each requirement to ensure the correctness and completeness of the documents submitted.

During the second day of the activity on March 30, 2023, Engr. Grizzel Bea A. Sabado, Chief EMS of Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) in Roxas, Palawan discussed the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), and guided the participants in the online application process for Permit to Operate (PTO), Discharge Permit, Hazardous Waste Permit, Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) and Certificate of Non Coverage (CNC). She discussed the requirements, how to download forms as well as how to upload filled forms for each of the permits discussed. The said activity broadens the understanding of the participants on the online application process of the EMB which the participants can use to assist/help the protected area stakeholders particularly the BLGU seeking PAMB clearance.

PASu Pador also discussed Sec. 24 of Republic Act 11038 Existing Facilities within the protected area. During her presentation she discussed that upon the effectivity of RA 11038, an inventory of all existing facilities such as roads, buildings and structures, water systems, transmission lines, communication facilities, heavy equipment, and irrigation facilities among others, within the protected area shall be conducted. The PAMB, with the assistance of the DENR, may impose conditions for the operation of facility found to be detrimental to the protected area until its eventual relocation. However, if the conditions are violated, the owner of the facility shall be made liable pursuant to Section 21(d). She reiterated that existing facilities allowed to remain within the protected area shall be charged a reasonable fee by the PAMB based on existing guidelines. Structures found within the forty (40) meter easement shall be demolished unless proven necessary to protect the shoreline and mitigate habitat destruction. The PAMB shall levy a reasonable fee for the use of such easement for their continued operations. Wharves shall be kept accessible to the public. Her presentation enhanced the knowledge of the participants on existing facilities within the protected area and the legal easement.

In the afternoon session, PASu Clarissa P. Pador discussed the Sec. 5 of Republic Act 11038 PA Dis/Establishment Process. She explained to the participants the extent of the system as well as the process needed for the dis/establishment of the remaining initial component as protected areas through an act of congress.

PASu Pador also discussed RA No. 11313 Safe Spaces Act also known as the Anti-Bastos Law in in consonance with the celebration of National Women's month. She discussed that the said law provides for the policy of the state to value the dignity of every human person and guarantee full respect for human rights. It likewise provides that the state recognizes the role of women in nation building and ensures the fundamental equality before the law of men and women. She also discussed the prohibited acts as well as its corresponding penalty.

The provision of capacity building training for the PAMO-MSPLS personnel greatly enhanced their skills and understanding on protected area policies. The said learning development intervention is beneficial to the PAMO-MSPLS personnel which equipped the participants with fundamental knowledge on protected area management as well as skills to apply appropriate knowledge in assessing protected area tenurial instrument application and how to address issues within the protected area. Many participants strongly believed that the capacity building training helped them better understand concepts in protected area management, and ultimately will helped them perform better in their work. A total of twenty (21) participants attended the activity composed of twelve (11) males and nine (9) females.

Recommendations:

The undersigned recommends for continuous provision of capacity building training to the PAMO-MSPLS personnel to enhance their knowledge on protected area policies that could help them in the day to day operation and management of the protected area. Moreover, the PAMB members should also be capacitated in order to enhance their knowledge in protected area management being the policy making body of the protected area.



1.0 Rationale

In order to develop an appropriate, logical and effective management strategy for sustainable development of Malampaya Sound Protected Landscape and Seascape (MSPLS), a Training Needs Assessment (TNA) for the MSPLS Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) personnel was conducted last CY 2022 to identify the learning intervention needed by the PAMO- personnel to effectively managed the protected area. The results of the TNA serves as basis for the provision of Capacity Building Training for the personnel to develop and enhance their knowledge in protected area management.

2.0 OBJECTIVES
