

GUIDELINES FOR 2023 TAMARAW POPULATION COUNT

Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro April 16-April 26, 2023

Tamaraw Count is a yearly scientific activity that aims to capture present number of tamaraws in its core habitat. This is not an excursion or a tourism related activity but rather a highly scientific endeavor, thus, the following must be strictly observed at all times during the counting.

DOs

- Participants and observers must be physically and mentally fit
- Participants and observers are required to attend the tamaraw count workshop on April 17, 2023 at MIBNP Magtangcob station (station 1). Failure to do so will be prohibited to participate in 2023 tamaraw count.
- In trekking, always observe discipline and follow the instructions of the guide for the safety of everyone.
- Bring your own sleeping bags or mat, equipment such as potable stove, binoculars, gadgets, etc. Bring also toiletries, medicines and other essentials enough for the number of days staying inside the park. Although food will be provided, you may also bring your own food specially trail foods such as energy bars.
- Have your luggage, items and paraphernalia inspected by the PASu or his staff.
- Participants and Observers must be accompanied by key personnel from MIBNP and TCP at all times to ensure safety.
- In case of emergency, notify key personnel from MIBNP and TCP immediately.

DON'Ts

- Do not bring illegal and prohibited drugs inside the park.
- Do not gather, hunt, kill or disturb any Wildlife. Mere possession of any plant and animals is also prohibited by law. Participants and observers must apply the saying: *Take nothing but pictures leave nothing but footprints, kill nothing but time.*
- Do not litter at all times. Please keep in your pocket all garbage/ food wrappers.
- Smoking on the trail or during rest stops in strictly prohibited.
- Wearing of bright colored clothing is prohibited as it will distract the wildlife specially tamaraws.
- Trotting and transferring from one camp to another is strictly prohibited inside the observation area to minimize disturbance of the tamaraws.
- Unnecessary loud noises are strictly prohibited.

- Jacket/ Windbreaker
- Trekking pole (Optional)
