





Dear distinguished Representatives and focal officials of the participating countries,

Warm greetings from the Secretariat.

Under Green Partnership, the Secretariat plans to launch 'Let's Forest – Plantree', in response to the growing interest in planting trees by individuals, organizations, and companies, whether as part of one-time tree planting campaigns, donating a portion of their profits to forest restoration, or hosting a tree planting event on special occasions such as Arbor Day.

Through Let's Forest – Plantree, any individual, public or private entity will be able to plant a tree for the establishment of forests with a monetary contribution of less than USD 10. Plantree will contribute to raising public awareness of sustainable forest management and facilitating private-sector engagement which can result in more collaboration opportunities for new programs and projects of a larger scale. Hence the Secretariat strongly recommends that member countries join Plantree so that donors will have a wider range of afforestation/restoration activities could be carried out.

For the launch of the program, the Secretariat intends to secure up to five ready-to-plant sites in AFoCO member countries to conduct planting activities one to two times a year. The Secretariat will request member parties propose ready-to-plant sites for Plantree in accordance with the Guidelines (Attachment-1). Upon receiving the site proposals, the Secretariat will conduct an internal review and assessment to select suitable sites and inform the selected countries to proceed to signing an agreement between the country and the Secretariat on tree planting activities under Plantree.

Therefore, the Secretariat would like to request that the member countries carefully read the guidelines and fill out the site information form attached to this letter and submit it to the Secretariat (Ms. HAN YoungJu, <u>yi.han@afocosec.org</u>) by 10 February 2023.




