

Monitoring of turtle nesting sites, validation of (1) dead and (1) by-catch Green Turtle (Chelonia mydas) including rehabilitation and release of (3) Hawksbill Turtle (Eretmochelys imbricata) were done in CENRO Socorro for the 3rd Quarter CY 2022.

Further, the Protected Area Coastal and Management Unit (PACMU) of CENRO Roxas conducted a monitoring activity on marine turtle nesting sites in Brgy. B. Del Mundo and Brgy. Wasig, Mansalay, Oriental Mindoro. During the activity, no sightings of marine turtles laying eggs or captured were recorded.

Conduct of Community, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) and distribution of Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials regarding marine turtle conservation and protection was continuously undertaken.

In line with this, the Office commends the prompt action and support of the personnel involved towards the protection and conservation of our wildlife.

Respectfully submitted is the Memorandum dated September 28, 2022 of PENRO Palawan regarding the above subject in compliance with the target under OO1: Natural Resources Conservation and Development Program: Protected Areas, Caves and Wetlands Development and Management Sub-program: I. Proclaimed and Legislated PAs: 4. PA Habitat Protection; A. Implementation of Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS) within El Nido — Taytay Managed Resource Protected Area (ENTMRPA) in Palawan.

BMS was conducted using five (5) methods: Field Diary, Transect Walk, Transect Swim, Photo Documentation and Focus Group Discussion.

### 1) Field Diary

Field Diary was conducted on six (6) barangays, namely: 1) Brgy. Aberawan, 2) Brgy. Manlag, 3) Brgy. Villa Libertad, 4) Brgy. Bucana, 5) Brgy. Pasadena and 6) Brgy. Corongcorong. Several important and threatened endemic species were observed such as Palawan Hornbill (Anthracoceros marchei), White-bellied Sea Eagle (Haliaeetus leucogaster) and Green Sea Turtle (Chelonia mydas).

# 2) Transect Walk

Significant coral bleaching was observed at Pasandigan, Cadlao Island due to presence of Crown of Thorns (*Ancaster planci*). Continuous collection and extraction of Crown of Thorns, patrolling and monitoring activities were conducted.

In the previous reports, it was consistently observed that all monitoring sites especially in Pinagbuyutan Island exhibited degraded coral reefs which can be attributed to lack of mooring buoys and influx of tourists. In order to address this, rehabilitation and maintenance activities were conducted such as continuous monitoring in the established areas, coastal clean-up and installation of mooring buoys.

### 4) Focus Group Discussion (FGD)

FGD was conducted on July 14, 2022 and August 09, 2022 among the Community Monitoring Groups (CMG) of four (4) coastal barangays; namely: 1.) Sitio Lamoro, Brgy. Pasadeňa; 2.) Sitio Calintang, Brgy. Bucana; 3.) Sitio Manlalic, Brgy. Manlag; and 4.) Sitio Dagal – dagal, Brgy. Corong – corong, El Nido, Palawan. It was reported that illegal fishing caused by transient fisherman was the main issue of the locals. Continuous patrolling and monitoring within the protected area was conducted.


### 5) Photo Documentation

Series of photo documentation were done in the re-established sites in the mangrove areas and mountain portions of So. Silaga and So. Litsud, Brgy. Corong – corong, So. Danat, Brgy. Manlag, and So. Lamoro, Brgy. Pasadeňa. No negative changes were observed in these areas.



Environmental greetings!

This refers to the recent virtual Joint Meeting of Regional Multi-Sectoral Forest Protection Committee (RMFPC) and Regional Anti-Illegal Logging Task Force (RAILTF) pursuant to DAO 1995-17 and Executive Order No. 23, series of 2011, respectively, aiming to serve as a collection point of information on illegal environmental activities and strengthen our law enforcement in MIMAROPA Region.

During the meeting which was attended by concerned Other Government Agencies (OGAs) and Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), chaired by the undersigned, one of the issues raised by the members is the apprehension of conveyances loaded with undocumented forest products. Thus, the undersigned requested the Land Transportation Office (LTO) representatives for the inclusion of Section 77 of Presidential Decree No. 705, otherwise known as the "Revised Forestry Code of the Philippines" and Department Administrative Order No. 97-32, otherwise known as the "1997 Rules for the Administrative Adjudication of Illegal Forest Products and the Machinery, Equipment, Tools and Conveyances Used in Connection Therewith", as topics for every training/seminar required for all applicants securing/renewing their Driver's License. This is to ensure all applicants are well-informed that loading of forest products without a Transport Permit from the DENR is a violation of existing environment and natural resources-related laws, rules and regulations.

In this regard, this Office respectfully requests to include the above said environmental laws and policies in every training/seminar before the issuance and/or renewal of a Driver's License as one of the identified mitigating measures in abating illegal transport of forest products.

In support of the above proposal, may we also suggest that our Office thru the Regional Strategic Communication and Initiatives Group (RSCIG), the information and communication arm of the agency and our Enforcement Division to sit down with your agency to craft a "Forest Product Transportation" training module. Further, may we request for LTO's assistance in the conduct of IEC campaign for TV and radio plugging to educate the public particularly the drivers on the prohibition on transport of wood and

other forest products without the permit being issued by the DENR. It would be also appreciated if we can set a meeting for further discussion this concern.

Steadfast conservation of our natural resources is certainly achievable through partnerships. Hence, we are looking forward to successful collaboration with you in this endeavor through your support in unfolding intensive information about laws geared towards protection, conservation and sustainability of our environment and natural resources.
