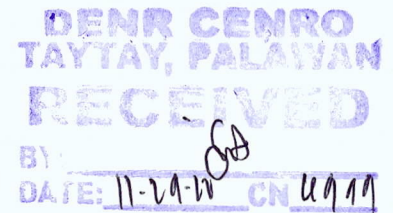

The team observed that planted coffee seedlings are still surviving but stunted seedlings were affected by heavy rainfall which is not favorable on the said commodities. The team recommends cultivating the plants to that excessive water can be easily drained.

The contractor with the assistance of assigned Forest Extension Officer (FEO) continuously conducting replacement of dead seedlings, fertilizer application and conduct of deterrent activities to prevent other forms of destruction through foot patrol.

Therefore, the team also recommends the issuance of billing for the fifth cycle maintenance and protection.

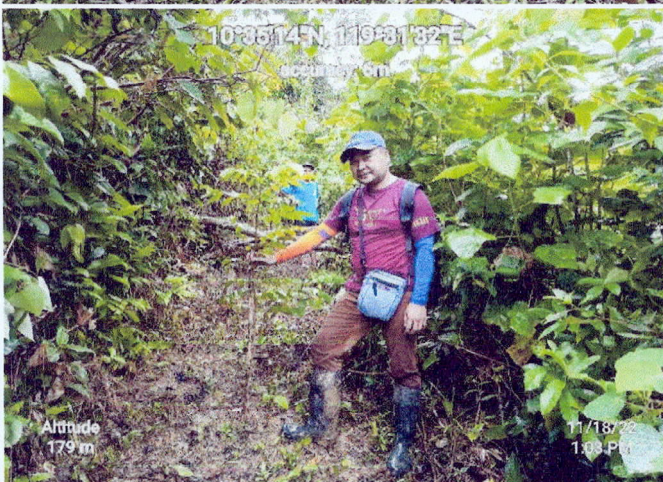
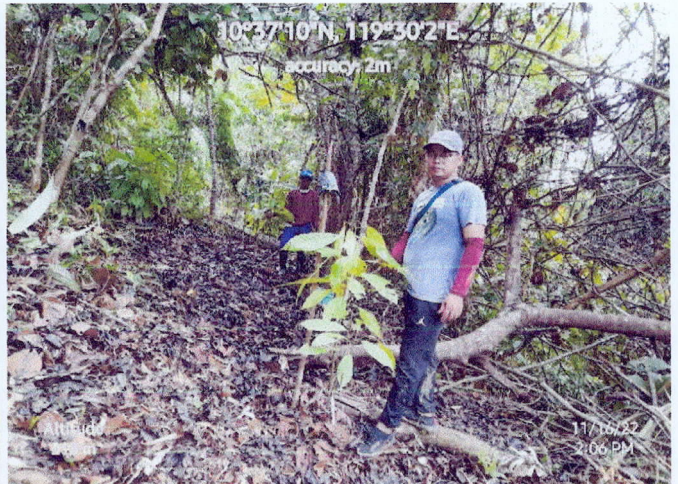
