Forwarded is the memorandum dated December 19, 2022 of PASu of Mounts Iglit-Baco Natural Park (MIBNP) regarding spot report on the burning incident happened in Fanlutukan Hill, Brgy. Poypoy, Calintaan and Brgy. Burgos, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro.

Based on the report submitted and upon investigation of the personnel of MIBNP-PAMO it was reported that the four (4) unidentified IPs who went to fantulukan hill were responsible for the burning of approximately 3.39 hectares of area due to wildlife hunting. Also, the investigation team was able to recover sixteen (16) spear traps around the area.

Attached are the spot report of the Park Rangers, geotagged pictures and location map of the burning site within MIBNP.

Respectfully forwarded herewith the spot report on the burning incident in Fantulukan Hill, Brgy. Poypoy, Calintaan and Brgy. Burgos, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro within Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park.

According to the spot report submitted by the Park Rangers dated December 2, 2022, four (4) unidentified indigenous peoples (IPs) were gone to Fantulukan Hill near Tamaraw Core Habitat with approximate distance of 1.3 kilometers from south of Magawang Station. Upon investigation by the MIBNP-PAMO team, it was clearly determined that these 4 IPs were deliberately responsible for the burning of Fantulukan Hill down to Mibluan Hill for hunting purposes and leaving an area of 3.39 hectares completely burned. The team also found sixteen (16) spear traps around the area.

The MIBNP-PAMO field officers conducted an investigation on the incident in order to identify the four IPs allegedly involved. In order to prevent such incidents from occurring, MIBNP-PAMO will intensify patrolling and monitoring activities to prevent the threat of a similar type, which threatens all wildlife within the protected area and leads to a significant biodiversity loss.

SPOT REPORT ON THE BURNING INCIDENT IN

FANLUTUKAN HILL INSIDE MIBNP

On November 27,2022 around 11:00 in the morning, during the monitoring at the Magawang Station III, the MIBNP team saw four (4) people going down at the area of Fanlutukan Hill inside the Tamaraw Core Habitat, South of Magawang Station III approximately 1.3 kilometers away from Magawang Station with the coordinates of 12°41'15.418" N, 122°4'1.371 E.

At 12:30 in the afternoon, at that same day, this minorities made a noise and started a fire causing burning on the abovementioned area. At 1:00 in the afternoon, the 4 minorities run unto the top of Fanlutukan Hill leaving the burned area down to Mibluan Hill. No one knows who's this four minorities are and where they live.

As per investigation, the area is burned for hunting purposes and they found around 16 spear traps in the area. The affected area has a total of 3.39 hectares. The team immediately reported to the MIBNP officials and make spot report submitted to PAMO office.









Figure 1-3. Photos showing the burned area in Fanlutukan Hill
