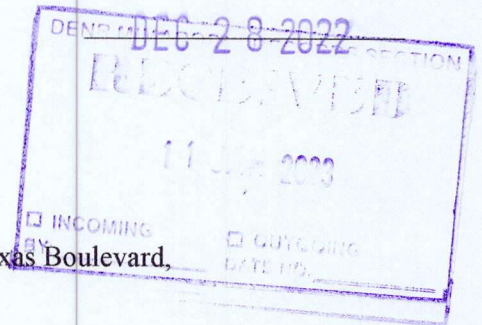

This has reference with your memorandum dated May 20, 2022 which was received last July 15, 2022 regarding creation of Provincial Cave Committee in accordance with DAO 2021-34 "Guidelines for the Establishment and Implementation of the CMPCP".

Please be informed that an initial orientation meeting and reconstitution of the Provincial Cave Committee members was conducted last August 12, 2022 at Mindoro Progressive Multipurpose Cooperative (MPMPC) that were attended by identified members of the PCC from PG-ENRO, PGO, Provincial Tourism, NCIP, OMSC (Academe), MBCFI (NGO), MPDC of the municipalities of Abra de Ilog, Rizal, San Jose, Magsaysay and Lubang (via zoom) with identified cave.

Our resource speakers during the orientation meeting were Forester Carla Mangundayao from Conservation and Development Division (CDD) MIMAROPA Region, ECOMS II Maria Teresita P. David, Jr., Forest Forester II Alvin E. Sanico and Technician II Herold Castro. Topics discussed during the meeting were Republic Act (RA) 9072 also known as "National Caves and Cave Resources Management and Protection Act", DAO 2021-34 Guidelines for the Establishment and Implementation of the Cave Management, Protection and Conservation Program (CMPCP) and Presentation of Assessed Caves for Classification within the Province of Occidental Mindoro.

At the end of the meeting, it was agreed that a confirmation letter shall be sent by respective offices identified as members of the committee as their official representative of the Provincial Cave Committee (PCC) of the Province of Occidental Mindoro. Attached with the report are the following documents:

1. Regional Special Order

The Chair shall seek the endorsement of the head of member-offices/ organizations for the name of their official representative and/or alternate representative(s) to the PCC. In the event that either the official and alternate representatives or several alternate representatives are present during the meeting, only one (1) shall be counted in the determination of quorum and voting on decision(s).

The PCC may invite resource person(s) during its meeting(s), as needed.

B. Functions

1. Assist the National Cave Committee (NCC) in the implementation of the Cave Management, Protection, and Conservation Program (CMPCP), and other cave-related plans, programs, and policies (DAO 2021-34)
2. Review cave assessment reports and endorse the classification recommended by the Cave Assessment Team, if in order (DAO 2022-10)
3. Review cave management plans and endorse/recommend its approval (DAO 2022-10)
4. Other cave-related functions as may be provided by higher offices and policies

The above functions of the PCC shall not apply to caves found within protected areas with active Protected Area Management Board (PAMB).

The decisions of the PCC in the form of Resolution(s) shall be affirmed by the Regional Executive Director, DENR MIMAROPA.

This Order takes effect immediately and remains in effect until revoked in writing.

May suggest to the barangay thru communication, education and public awareness campaign that the farmers may form association to apply a guano permit.

Guano extraction must be closely monitored by the Barangay/s where cave/s with guano is found.

To strengthen the enforcement in Barangay level.

- Ms. Karla Magundayao, Regional Office-CDD representative discussed the legal basis of the creation of Provincial Cave Committee (PCC) is DAO No. 2021-34 specifically Section 8.c that allows this creation which not mention in the amended Section 11 of DAO No. 2003-29 after that, she discussed the composition of the PCC members in Occidental Mindoro that shall be chaired by DENR PENRO with members coming from different local agencies, academe, and non-government organizations while the different local agencies was not specific since the body can suggest and recommend who will become a member. She also explained that within Protected Area (PA) that has active PAMB, the functions of PCC will be absorbed by the PAMB. The PAMB has option to create a special committee among themselves to deliberate the cave assessment reports to be the one who recommends their approval to the RED. In case to the PA with no active PAMB like FB Harison, the reconstituted PCC will apply. Then, she mentioned that there was a created PCC-Occidental Mindoro (RSO No. 831 series of 2019) however it was separated by two (2) to CENRO Sablayan and San Jose and the basis was the Section 11 of DAO No. 2003-29 but since it was already amended, it reminds to amend today the Regional Special Order with the recommended members by the body. By this time, only one PCC for entire Occidental Mindoro will be created. She added that since there is no reconstitution yet for the created PCC, the Regional Office creates Regional Cave Committee (RCC) as immediate measure for in case that there is a cave assessment reports received and in the event of no created PCC and then functions will perform by RCC. After that, she discussed regarding functions of Provincial Cave Committee.

Note:

- The Cave Assessment Report prepared by Cave Assessment Team must be reviewed by PCC and if they found that the recommended classification is in order and match in real characteristic of the cave they should recommend that classification in the form of PCC resolution and RED will approve. Also, the Cave management plan will be approved by the RED. The decisions of PCC in the form of resolution shall affirmed by RED.

- The Municipal Cave Assessment Team will not be a member of the PCC because of conflict of interest. In Protected Area there will be no creation of assessment team, they will utilized the existing team by the CENRO depending on the location of cave found.
- In the reconstitution of the members of PCC, only the Office not the name of official will put in the Regional Special Order, so that, there is no need to amend the RSO every time the person transfer to another office but we will request a recommendation from head of the Local Government Unit.

For. II Sanico presented the three (3) caves that assessed within the CENRO Sablayan jurisdiction which are Karungkaban, Matingkay and Libagon Caves.

FT II Castro presented the Tadlok cave and Cansubong cave assessment result.

ECOMS II del Mundo discussed the two (2) caves assessed within the Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park which are Pilpilan Cave located in Poypoy, Calintaan and Magbangkaw Cave- located in Brgy. Manoot, Rizal.

The next meeting for the members of Provincial Cave Committee scheduled on September 20, 2022. The agenda are Presentation of the Approved Special Order of the PCC, Submission of the endorsements from Head of Offices/organizations and Presentation on Three Caves :Tadlok. Cansubong, Luyang Baga

After the presentation and some questions being entertained the meeting ended.

ACTIVITY REPORT ON THE ORIENTATION AND RECONSTITUTION OF PROVINCIAL CAVE COMMITTEE

1. BACKGROUND

The caves in the Philippines are important biodiversity and cultural heritage assets. They provide habitat to diverse and unique life forms many of which are yet to be named and discovered.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) –Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) defined caves in the IRR as “Any naturally occurring void, cavity, recess or system of interconnected passages beneath the surface of the earth or within a cliff or ledge and which is large enough to permit an individual to enter, whether or not the entrance, located either in private or public land.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) as the lead national government organization, collaborates with the National Museum, National Historic Institute, Department of Tourism, and relevant Local Government Units to assist in the monitoring and evaluation efforts, especially in the monitoring of cultural, economic and historical importance of the caves.

Likewise, as per Executive Order No. 192 mandates that Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) to be the primary agency responsible for the conservation, management, protection, proper use and sustainable development of the country’s environment and natural resources. Wherein, DENR issued implementing Rules and Regulation No. 29, Series of 2003 and Department Memorandum Circular No. 04 Series of 2004 for the establishment and implementation of the Cave Management, Protection and Conservation Program (CMPC).

2. OBJECTIVES

The objective of this orientation is to present the guidelines and policies of the following topics:

- Republic Act 9072 also known as “National Caves and Cave Resources Management and Protection Act” ; and
- DAO 2021-34; Guidelines for the Establishment And Implementation of The Cave Management, Protection, And Conservation Program (CMPCP); and
- Presentation of Assessed Caves for Classification within the Province of Occidental Mindoro
- Reconstitution of Regional Special Order No. 831 Series of 2019 – Authorizing the Creation of Provincial Cave (PCC) for occidental Mindoro (Sablayan, MAPSA and Lubang)

FT II Castro discussed the legal basis of DAO 2021-34; Guidelines for the Establishment and Implementation of the Cave Management, Protection, and Conservation Program (CMPC) including the objectives, CMPCP approaches, program components such as Cave and Cave Resource Inventory and Assessment, Management Plan Development, Maintenance and Protection, Biodiversity-Friendly Enterprise Development (DAO No. 2021-13), Capacity Building, Research and Development, Knowledge System, Communication, Education and Public Awareness, monitoring and Evaluation.

Biodiversity-Friendly Enterprise Development

- Enterprise to be funded by the Biodiversity (BD) Corridor

Discussion:

For. Jan Lloyd I. Balon, (Regional Landscape Specialist of Biodiversity Corridor) asked "What are cave resource-based that can be developed into enterprise which is constructive or can be facilitate a model community in relation to cave that can be entered in BDFE, in which component of BD Corridor may incorporate then they will allocate fund?

FT Castro answered that based on their key informant interviews during management plan is ecotourism opportunity in which cave tour guide associations formed that may provide food services and transportation services and also, extraction of guano but they did not allow this kind of extraction.

For. Jan Lloyd I. Balon said that when it comes to BDFE, it should be enterprise instead of livelihood, for example, raw materials that can be processed then be marketed to ensure that conservation and sustainable use of resources turn into tangible and sustainable economic benefits for the communities. He suggested to the body that in management planning consider this objective of BDFE instead of focusing in livelihood development for sustainable in the long run.
